MINUTES OF THE MEETING STATE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE MONTANA STATE SENATE

March 12, 1981

The Senate State Administration committee was called to order by Senator Pete Story, Chairman, on the above date in room 442 of the State Capitol Building at 10 a.m.

ROLL CALL: The absences were Senators Kolstad, Johnson, and Ryan.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL 792: Rep. Menahan notified the chairman that this was requested by the governor to be moved to Finance and Claims committee. The chairman announced that it will not be heard in this committee today.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL 637:

AN ACT TO PROVIDE VETERANS OF THE VIETNAM CONFLICT ERA SERVICE CREDITS FOR THE TEACHERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM COMPARABLE TO THOSE GRANTED VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II AND THE KOREAN CONFLICT AND TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THESE CREDITS THROUGH INCREASED EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS

Rep. Aaron Andreason explained the bill relating to the Viet Nam War and the fact that the veterans were not respected and given the same treatment as the other veterans. Viet Nam veterans were excluded from teachers retirement system whereby the other war veterans received service credit. It is limited that those who received years of service for the other wars could not receive also for the Viet Nam War.

<u>PROPONENTS</u>: Dave Sexton, Mt. Education Association; Eric Feaver, self; Bob Durkee, VFW; Tony Cumming, American Legion; all supported and said it restores inequity and is a fair bill.

OPPONENTS: None.

Questions: Sen. Towe asked Rep. Andreason about the insertion on page 1, line 17 about four years creditable service. He answered that the purpose is to give comparable credits, and it applies only to those months within the dates.

Sen. Hafferman asked if they had to have been teaching before they went into the service. The answer was no; it was given to anyone who was a member of the service and later became a member in the teachers retirement. State Administration Meeting Minutes March

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ACTION ON HOUSE BILL 637: Sen. Hammond moved DO PASS; motion carried by unanimous vote by those present.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL 725:

AN ACT TO REVISE THE LICENSING LAWS FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS AND LAND SURVEYORS; INCREASING REGISTRATION FEES; CLARIFYING REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION AS A LAND SURVEYOR

Rep. Melvin Underdal read the title and said this will change various fees; all are raised 50 per cent with the exception that the fee for both professional engineer and land surveyor will be doubled because they pay their own way.

<u>PROPONENTS</u>: H.S. Hanson, representing the surveyors and engineering organization, Montana Technical Council, supported the bill including the educational requirement.

OPPONENTS: None.

Questions: Sen. Towe asked Rep. Underdal about the discrepancy between the \$90 on page 5, line 24 and the same on page 3, lines 20-25. Mr. Hanson was asked to explain that page 3 applied to the application for examination and page 5 is for renewal.

Sen. Hammond announced that he had received letters from some engineering group saying this bill would put them out of business. Mr. Hanson pointed out that some belong to the organization and some do not. Sen. Hammond said they had written that they thought the rates were too high for them to pay.

Proponent M. McDonough pointed that the rates are the absolute maximum, and Sen. Towe asked her to explain the rates. She explained the two classes and verified that they anticipate no increase. He asked her if the rates were based on costs as the other professional licenses. The answer was yes. Sen. Towe asked if there are penalties for late renewal and pointed out that setting codification instruction could be added.

ACTION ON HOUSE BILL 725: Sen. Towe moved an amendment, which passed; he moved the bill DO PASS, AS AMENDED; motion carried unanimously with those present. See standing committee report for amendments. Sen. Hafferman will carry on the floor.
