MINUTES OF THE MEETING SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION AND CULTURAL RESOURCES APRIL 13, 1981

The Senate Committee on Education and Cultural Resources met Monday, April 13, 1981, in Room 402 of the Capitol Building. The meeting was called to order at 12:57 p.m. by Senator Bob Brown, Chairman.

ROLL CALL

Committee members present were Senators Brown, Mazurek, Thomas, McCallum, Severson, Haffey, Hammond, and Blaylock. Senator Smith was absent.

Bills to be considered by the committee were: HJR 46 HJR 34

HJR 49.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 46

"A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING THAT AN-APPROPRIATE-INTERIM THE LEGISLATIVE FINANCE COMMITTEE BE ASSIGNED TO STUDY THE LAWS RELATING TO POSTSECONDARY VOCATIONALTECHNICAL CENTERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF GENERALLY CLARIFYING, UPDATING, SUPPLEMENTING, AND REVISING SUCH LAWS."

Representative Williams, District 70, sponsor of the bill, gave a brief history of the vocational-technical legislation. In 1977, HJR 100 mandated a study limited to governance issues only. The three bills resulting from the study were all killed. In the 1979 session a bill passed making OPI the sole agency for vocational-technical centers. Reprsentative Williams felt that was the proper placement and has worked very satisfactorily. However, he noted, vo-tech centers need to devise a better system for funding as they now receive federal funds, local district funds, and general fund monies. He said more and better guidelines are needed to address the fragmented appropriations re elementary, secondary, and post-secondary programs. Representative Williams said the resolution specifically asks the Legislative Finance Committee to conduct the study.

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PROPONENTS

Maynard Olson, Special Assistant, Office of Public Instruction, presented his testimony in support of the resolution to the committee (written attachment #1).

William Ball, Executive Director, State Advisory Council for Vocational Education, presented his testimony in support of the resolution to the committee (written attachment #2).

Alex Capdeville, Director, Helena Vo-Tech Center, urged support of the resolution stating confusion exists in funding in the areas of maintenance of facilities and program. He cited a need to address the area of funding hi-low cost programs such as diesel mechanics versus secretarial which differ greatly in the cost factors. He said accountability has improved greatly in the last two years but further clarification is needed in the funding area.

There were no opponents to the resolution.

The committee-discussed the advisability of putting the study in the Legislative Finance Committee as opposed to specifying it be assigned to "the appropriate interim committee" as most interim study requests are. Senator Brown stressed the study should be considered in the priority process with all the rest of the study requests.

Representative Williams closed by stating the resolution's original language specified assignment to the appropriate interim committee but was amended on the floor of the House as members of the House Finance Committee felt it should be assigned to that specific committee. He further stated that inflation and current economic conditions have led to a utilization of vo-tech centers as never before and therefore he feels this study is as important to vo-tech as any for community colleges or the university system.

ACTION ON HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 46

Senator Brown moved to amend the bill in the title and on page 2, line 10 to return the resolution to the original language (attached standing committee report).

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The motion carried with Senators Thomas, McCallum, and Mazurek voting no. Senator Hammond abstained.

Senator Mazurek moved HJR 46 Be Concurred In As Amended. The motion carried with Senator Hammond voting no.

The committee was to hear HJR 34 and HJR 49 but the sponsor, Representative Vincent, failed to appear to present his bills. The committee did not reschedule.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 1:56 p.m.


