MINUTES OF THE MEETING LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE MONTANA STATE SENATE

April 22, 1981

The ninth meeting of the Legislative Administration Committee was called to order by Vice-Chairman McCallum in Room 415 of the Capitol building on the above date.

ROLL CALL: All members were present except Senator Kolstad who was excused.

CONSIDERATION OF SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 4: AUTHORIZING THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE TO APPROVE EMPLOYMENT OF SENATE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE BUSINESS OF THE REGULAR SESSION AND TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR EMPLOYEES TO PREPARE ANY BUSINESS OF ANY SPECIAL SESSION OF THE 47TH LEGISLATURE. Senator Graham explained that this resolution is necessary to complete the business and inventory of the Senate. It is for the employment of the people that are kept on after session.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 4: Senator Graham recommended that SR 4 BE ADOPTED. The motion carried unanimously.

CONSIDERATION OF SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 6: A RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUIRING ALL SENATE SUPPLIES TO BE STORED UNDER LOCK AND KEY AND ALL FURNITURE BELONGING TO THE SENATE TO BE LABELED AND NOT MOVED DURING THE INTERIM. Senator Graham explained that the Senate had lost typewriters, chairs, etc., between sessions. He recommended that the Chairman contact Morris Brusett, Director of the Department of Administration, about keeping the furniture in the correct rooms. He also suggested that the committee should find out who has the keys to the various rooms.

Senator Mazurek offered the following amendments to SR 6: 1. Amend page 1, line 23, following "RESOLVED," by inserting "that the Sergeant-at-Arms of the Senate shall inventory all of the items of furniture in each individual office and committee room of the Senate and"; and 2. Amend page 2, line 3, following line 2, by inserting "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution shall be delivered to the Director of the Department of Administration, as a formal request of the Senate, that the Senate furniture remain locked in the rooms during the interim."

DISPOSITION OF SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 6: Senator Hazelbaker recommended that SR 6, as amended, BE ADOPTED. The motion carried.

There being no further business, the committee adjourned.



A good "rule of thumb" is to process your legislation as expeditiously as possible to avoid running into a bottleneck in February.
