MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE HOUSE HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE, FEBRUARY 5, 1983

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Abrams on Saturday, February 5, 1983, at 2pm, in Room 129, State Capitol. All members of the Committee were present.

#### EXECUTIVE SESSION

HOUSE BILL 488. The bill was referred back to the Committee by the House for a Statement of Intent, which was read to the Committee by Mr. Greg Petesch, Legislative Council Attorney.

REP. STOBIE moved the Statement of Intent be approved. The motion was seconded by Rep. Brown and unanimously approved by the Committee.

HOUSE BILL 320. MR. PETESCH explained proposed amendments to the bill and said the sale of property to a local government unit at appraised value had been stricken, allowing for sale of such property by bid.

REP. HAMMOND moved the bill Do Pass.

REP. KEYSER moved the amendments to the bill be approved. The motion was seconded by Rep. Stobie and uananimously approved by the Committee.

REP. KEYSER moved the bill Do Pass as Amended. Rep. O'Connell seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

HOUSE BILL 16. REP. SHONTZ moved the bill Do Pass. Mr. Petesch distributed copies of proposed amendments which would phase in increases and strike coordination instructions since "14 cents" was stricken from the bill and "10 cents" inserted.

REP. SHONTZ moved the amendments be approved. Rep. Harp seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Committee.

REP. SHONTZ moved the bill Do Pass as Amended. Rep. Solberg seconded the motion.

REP. BROWN told committee members Rep. Nordtvedt raised the question of applying House Bill 85 applications to passage of the referendum to allow funds to be taken from the cost trust. He said an amendment to this effect would be offered on the House floor or in Taxation Committee.

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The motion made by Rep. Shontz was approved with ten members voting age and seven voting no, (roll call vote).

HOUSE BILL 437. REP. HARP moved the bill Do Pass.

MR. PETESCH distributed amendments from the Department of Highways pertaining to routing and conditions of operation (exhibit).

REP. BROWN moved the amendments to the bill be approved.

REP. STOBIE asked if there were specific driver qualifications. Rep. Brown said drivers are already well-qualified but the bill should establish a rule for driver qualifications.

REP. HARP said the industry would more than likely carefully control who drives its trucks.

REP. KEYSER told the Committee he would not support the bill without the proposed amendments.

REP. SHONTZ moved "driver qualifications" be stricken from the amendments. The motion was seconded by Rep. Stobie and unanimously approved by the Committee.

REP. SHONTZ moved the bill Do Pass as Amended. The motion was seconded by Rep. Lybeck and unanimously approved by committee members.

HOUSE BILL 539. MR. PETESCH, said the amendment would add another section to the bill, wherein the 7% overweight allowance would be reduced to 5% and that the section would apply 5% to axle weight as well as overall weight.

REP. STOBIE asked if the statute would apply to anyone hauling hay. Mr. Petesch replied it would apply to any vehicle.

REP. STOBIE moved the bill Do Pass and then moved the amendments be approved. Rep. Brown seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Committee.

REP. KEYSER moved the bill Do Pass as Amended. The motion was seconded by Rep. Hemstad and unanimously approved.

SENATE BILL 10. REP. SOLBERG moved the bill Be Concurred In. Rep. Hammond seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

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SENATE BILL 82. MR. PETESCH provided committee members with an amendment to the bill, allowing conformity with the Human Services Committee bill (exhibit). He said there would be no changes in the Prisoner of War plate as the issue was not addressed by the bill sponsor, adding the bill would only authorize individuals to apply for these special plates.

REP. HEMSTAD moved the amendments be approved. Rep. Harp seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Committee.

REP. BROWN moved the bill Be Conncurred In as Amended. The motion was seconded by Rep. Koehnke and unanimously approved by the Committee.

HOUSE BILL 9. CHAIRMAN ABRAMS told the Committee the sponsor of the bill was in the process of preparing amendments and asked that executive action be delayed until February 8, 1983.

The meeting was adjourned at 3pm.

\*STATEMENT OF INTENT HOUSE BILL NO. 488\*

A statement of intent is required for this bill because it gives the highway patrol authority to allow by rule a safety device on a vehicle to protunde beyond the 192-inch width limit set in 61-10-192. This authorization is necessary to conform with federal haw that excludes from the 192-inch width limit safety-related appendages such as rear view mirrors, twin signal lamps, marker lamps, steps and handholds for entry and egress, flexible fender extensions, mudflaps, splash and spary suppressant devices or designs, refrigeration units, or air compressors which the highway patrol may interpret as necessary for safe and efficient operation of commercial motor vehicles.

Insert: "Section 2. Section 61-10-144, MCA, is amended to read: "61-10-144. Violation of standards -- seven five percent allowance. (1) It is a misdemeanor for a person, firm, or corporation to violate any provision of 61-10-101 through 61-10-110.

- However, the operator of a vehicle or combination of vehicles may move over the highways to the first open state scale, permanent or portable, without incurring the excess weight penalties set forth in 61-10-145 if the total gross weight of the vehicle or combination of vehicles does not exceed allowable total gross weight limitations by more than 7% 5% and if the weight carried by any axle or combination of axles does not exceed the allowable axle weight limitations by more than 5%. In the event the vehicle or combination of vehicles is not in excess of the allowable total gross or axle weight limitations by more than 7% 5%, the department may issue a single trip permit for the fee of \$10 for allowing said vehicle or combination of vehicles to move over the highways to the first facility where its load can be safely adjusted or to its destination. Violations of total gross or axle weight limitations in excess of 7% 5% are subject to the fines provided in 61-10-145, and all loads in excess of 7% 5% of total gross or axle weight limitations must be adjusted or reduced to conform to the size and weight limitations before the vehicle or combination of vehicles is moved from the point of weighing.
- (3) An operator of a vehicle or combination of vehicles subject to the provisions of 61-10-107(2) may move over a highway, except any highway which is part of the federal-aid interstate system, within a 50-mile radius of the harvested field to the point of first unloading, without incurring the excess weight penalties set forth in 61-10-145 if the total gross weight of the vehicle or combination of vehicles does not exceed allowable weight limitations by more than 20% per axle but the maximum load per inch of tire width may not exceed 670 pounds. The vehicle or combination of vehicles may not exceed 40 miles per hour. No single trip permit as required in subsection (2) shall be applicable to such vehicle or combination of vehicles. When such vehicle or combination of vehicles any of the provisions of this subsection, the fine or penalty imposed shall apply to that portion of the load above the legal limit."
