MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE HOUSE AGRICULTURE, LIVESTOCK AND IRRIGATION COMMITTEE, FEBRUARY 16, 1983

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jacobsen on Wednesday, February 16, 1983 at 12:30pm in Room 129, State Capitol. All members of the Committee were present.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

CHAIRMAN JACOBSEN asked Rep. Holliday to report subcommittee findings. Rep. Holliday advised the subcommittee would meet immediately upon adjournment of the Agriculture Committee meeting this date.

REP. SCHULTZ told the Committee attendance of committee members at the Department of Revenue hearing on proposed rule changes for agricultural land classification and assessment was vital.

CHAIRMAN JACOBSEN advised committee members Rep. Manuel sponsored a bill pertaining to irrigated land which would be on the House floor this date and into which committee intent could be incorporated. He said, as an alternative the Senate could address all three irrigation bills and take necessary action.

HOUSE BILL 617. Legislative Council Attorney, John MacMaster read proposed amendments to the bill (exhibit).

REP. UNDERDAL moved the bill Do Pass and then moved the proposed amendments be approved. Rep. Hanson seconded the motion.

REP. SPAETH advised the Committee, crop dusting labor would be placed third as proposed in the amendments. He suggested the Committee go through priorities for liens to expedite the amending process, to which Rep. Koehnke added his concurrence.

CHAIRMAN JACOBSEN asked if seeds, labor, crop dusting and then spraying were the intended order. Rep. Underdal replied that it was.

REP. BACHINI moved the Committee delete Sections 2,3, and 4 of the bill in addition to line 7 of the title and that the title be changed accordingly. The motion was seconded by Rep. Holliday.

REP. SPAETH said priorities would be changed by deletion of lines 5, 6 or 7. Mr. MacMaster told the Committee the title would have to be changed if Rep. Bachini's motion were approved.

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REP. BACHINI changed his motion to strike the remainder of lines 4-7 in the title following "act to" and insert "increase coverage of crop dusting and spraying liens; amending Section 71-3-901, MCA." and following line 24, page 1, strike lines 25 through line 14 on page 3.

REP. SCHULTZ asked Rep. Spaeth if any other section of the code would establish lien priorities. Rep. Spaeth said the current priority is seed, hail insurance, with labor prior to hail insurance in most instances.

The motion made by Rep. Bachini was unanimously approved by the Committee.

REP. BACHINI moved the bill Do Pass as Amended. Rep. Lybeck seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by the Committee.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:20pm.
