

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE  
April 14, 1983

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The Appropriations Committee met at 1:30 p.m. on April 14, 1983, in Room 104, with Chairman Francis Bardanouve presiding and all members were present except Representatives Donaldson, Menahan, Shontz, Stobie and Waldron, who were absent. Also present were Judy Rippingale, Legislative Fiscal Analyst, and Pam Joehler, Assistant Analyst. The Committee heard the subcommittee recommendations on HOUSE BILL 833. EXECUTIVE ACTION was taken on HOUSE BILL 833.

Chairman BARDANOUE turned the chair over to Representative MANUEL for his subcommittee report on the bill. The bill is (Exhibit 1).

Representative BARDANOUE said House Bill 833 is the cash portion of the building program; but the bill doesn't mean much as it is originally written and the Committee would have to take the amendments before them now because "that is the bill". (Exhibit 2). He said it also has the coal money from the Parks Division in the amendments and some other amendments which do not necessarily require cash, but authorizes the expenditure of other money. [Note: Certain projects were amended by the Committee; however, there were other amendments and for the total amendments, see the "Standing Committee Report" in these Minutes.]

HOUSE BILL 833: "A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: 'AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1985; TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.'" Representative MANUEL reviewed the bill. He said the subcommittee had a goal of \$10.8 million and they came within \$292 of that goal.

Canyon Ferry State Recreation Area: Representative MANUEL said the \$50,000 appropriation for the Custer Battlefield Cemetery from last session wasn't used, so Representative Marks had a use for this to improve the roads at the Canyon Ferry recreation area.

Land Acquisition & Grounds: Representative LORY asked if we are buying more land around the Capitol? Representative BARDANOUE said there is a potential for buying a dentist's office, if it's up for sale.

Miscellaneous Building Improvements: Chairman MANUEL said this was for moving the PSC over to the Highway Department and OPI is going to move into the old PSC building.

Storm Drainage Detention Basin, Capitol Complex: Chairman MANUEL said this is for improving the basin in cooperation with the City of Helena and is right beside the DNRC site. Representative BARDANOUE said the city will pay for the cost of landscaping and upkeep because we are giving them \$200,000 worth of land in addition to the basin.

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Spring Meadow Lake Improvements: Ron HOLLIDAY, Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, said, "Our original request was for \$155,000 from the Coal Tax funds and \$30,000 of Federal & Private revenue, with the idea we think we can raise that locally in contributions. The Committee cut the \$155,000 back to \$90,000 so it is \$90,000 in Coal Tax and \$30,000 in Federal & Private revenue authority only."

Roof Replacement & Major Maintenance: Representative MANUEL said the state owns 5,000 buildings so that means a lot of roofs must be repaired and maintained... about 250 roofs a year.

Industries Building, Prison: Representative THOFT asked Phil HAUCK if \$700,000 is enough money to construct the building they had in mind? Phil HAUCK replied, "It's smaller than they had in mind and we're going to have to cut the program down". Representative THOFT asked, "Could you build the original size and save the inside completion until later"? Mr. HAUCK replied, "It's very possible because a large amount of the money is for equipment and we'll look into building as large as we can".

Emergency Operations Center, Helena Armory: Representative MANUEL said the Highway Patrol communications system will be down in the bottom of this building permanently.

Engineering Laboratory/Classroom Building, Tech: Chairman MANUEL said at this time they have pledged over \$800,000 for this building from private donations.

Electrical Distribution System, UM: Chairman MANUEL said this is about 3 phases. There were 4 phases, but the Committee felt it would take a couple of years to get all this done, so they funded 3 phases at this time.

Museum of the Rockies, MSU: Chairman MANUEL said Dr. Dayton would like to see this at \$6 million rather than \$5 million.

Lake Elmo, Billings: Chairman MANUEL said, "There is an option available at \$600,000 to buy 47 more acres around the lake. There's a strip that runs around the lake plus 10 acres."

Parker Homestead, Three Forks: Chairman MANUEL said this is rent, not acquisitions.

Game Range Acquisition: Representative BARDANOUVE said for \$300,000 of Earmarked Revenue, there will be available \$900,000 in federal money.

\*\*\*EXECUTIVE ACTION:

Museum of the Rockies: Representative LORY made a motion that the funding authority for the Museum of the Rockies be increased from

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\$5 million to \$6 million. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Swan River Youth Camp: Phil HAUCK said this money is for a sewage study and he didn't want the Committee to think they wouldn't be back in another session to request funds for building the treatment plant or sewage lagoon.

Representative MANUEL made a motion that the words "drain field" be stricken from the amendments and the words "sewage study" inserted. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

University System: Representative ERNST asked if the figure for private funds are student fees or donations? Chairman BARDANOUVE said Dr. Dayton swore that student fees would not be used. Dr. Dayton said the Men's Gym and the PE building are identified as auxiliary plant funds. Judy RIPPINGALE suggested this amendment: "Page 2, line 6, the language read approximately as follows: Following 'general fund', insert 'University auxiliary funds, University plant funds generated from auxiliary fund operations or other lawful purpose funds from the bond indentures'. She said, "The other appropriated column would exclude these types of university funds as not being included in the appropriation; and then for those two ones which are, we would add some language to the bill that would say, 'appropriations for the PE building roof repair at Eastern Montana College and the Men's Gym roof repair at U of M may utilize University auxiliary or plant funds."


Representative LORY made a motion that the proposed amendment be adopted. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Game Range Acquisition: Representative HEMSTAD made a motion to increase the Game Range Acquisition from \$41,000 to \$300,000. Representative THOFT opposed the motion saying the local taxpayers are getting a little bit tired of land being removed from the tax base. A roll call vote was taken with 9 voting "Yes", Representatives Ernst, Roush and Thoft voting "No", 5 absent.

House Bill 833: Representative MANUEL made a motion to approve the amendments. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Representative MANUEL made a motion that House Bill 833 be approved as amended. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Chairman BARDANOUVE adjourned the meeting at 2:20 p.m.

Insert: "Section 7. Appropriation for Mansfield Center for Pacific Affairs.  
There is appropriated \$1,000,000 from the BPICA to the department of commerce to assist in the erection of a memorial in honor of one of Montana's great citizens, Mike Mansfield. The department shall enter into an agreement with the Maureen and Mike Mansfield Foundation

pursuant to which the department shall agree to pay the funds appropriated by this section to the foundation upon the receipt of at least \$6,000,000 by the foundation from other sources. The funds appropriated by this section shall be used exclusively for the construction of the Mansfield Center for Pacific Affairs at Polson, Montana. By this appropriation, the 48th Legislature indicates that it has determined that the state's support of the erection of a memorial through the establishment of the Mansfield Center for Pacific Affairs at Polson is a lawful public purpose of statewide importance in that it will serve to inspire sentiments of respect for a man of great stature and importance to the state, will generate important economic development of the state by direct employment, attraction of visitors, and establishment of expanded trade opportunities.

Section 8. Building Demolition. The Department of Administration is authorized to solicit bids for demolition or sale and removal of the following buildings:

The Director of the Department of Institutions must certify to the Department of Administration that the above buildings are surplus to the needs of the department and the state by reason of the building's age, deteriorated physical condition, life/safety and licensure deficiencies and no residual economic or useful life. If the cost of these deficiencies would preclude reasonable restoration and refurbishing efforts, the Director of the Department of Administration can grant an order to proceed on condition that (1) successful contractor or bidder agrees to demolish or remove building and reclaim building site based on the salvage value of the building itself; and (2) that the demolition or removal of any building does not violate the provisions of the

State Antiquities Act relative to established heritage properties under state ownership.

Section 9. Special Session Reauthorization. The appropriations for capital projects authorized in Section 6, House Bill 5 enacted by the 47th Legislature, Second Special Session, are reappropriated through the biennium ending June 30, 1985. The Department of Administration may exempt these projects from any provisions of Montana law relating to the employment of architects, public bidding, bonding, labor and wage requirements."

The Director of the Department of Institutions must certify to the Department of Administration that each of the above buildings is surplus to the needs of the department and the state by reason of the building's age, deteriorated physical condition, life/safety, or licensure deficiencies and has no residual economic or useful life. If the cost of the deficiencies would preclude reasonable restoration and refurbishing efforts, the Director of the Department of Administration may grant an order to proceed with demolition on condition that:

- (a) a successful contractor or bidder agrees to demolish or remove the building and reclaim the building site based on the salvage value of the building itself; and
- (b) the demolition or removal of the building does not violate the provisions of the State Antiquities Act relative to established heritage properties under state ownership.

Section 9. Special session reauthorization. The appropriations for capital projects authorized in Section 6, House Bill 5 enacted by the 47th Legislature, Second Special Session, are reappropriated through the biennium ending June 30, 1985. The Department of Administration may exempt these projects from any provisions of Montana law relating to the employment of architects, public bidding, bonding, or labor and wage requirements."
