

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE
MONTANA STATE SENATE

April 12, 1983

The thirteenth meeting of the Legislative Administration Committee was called to order by Senator Kolstad, Chairman, in Room 415 of the Capitol building at 1:30 p.m. on the above date.

ROLL CALL: All committee members were present.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL NO. 103: Representative Winslow, District 65, one of the sponsors, explained the bill to the committee members. This bill would make the coal tax oversight subcommittee a permanent subcommittee of the oversight committee and appropriating \$10,000 from the local impact and education trust fund coal tax account. This committee consists of four legislators. Two members are from the Senate and two members from the House. No more than two members may be of the same political party. This subcommittee reviews programs financed by coal severance tax funds. This subcommittee makes recommendations to the Revenue Oversight Committee. Representative Winslow said the committee met eight times during the last interim.

Representative Roush, District 13, presented a chart which shows the 30% coal tax distributions (Please see Exhibit 1). He also said that down the road, we may need more members on the committee. We may have to look at this during the interim.

There were no further proponents and no opponents.

There being no further discussion, the hearing on House Bill 103 was closed.

ACTION ON HOUSE BILL NO. 103: Senator McCallum made a motion that House Bill 103 BE CONCURRED IN. Motion was carried unanimously.

ADJOURN: There being no further business before the Committee at this time, the meeting adjourned.



* Unless specified otherwise, the interest earnings of the coal tax accounts revert to the state general fund.

** SB 409, passed during the 47th Legislature, decreases the coal tax distribution to the Renewable Resource Development Account by one-half. Effective July 1, 1983, the Renewable Resource Development Account will receive .625% of coal tax collections. The remaining .625% is allocated to the Water Development Sinking Account.
