

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
FISH AND GAME COMMITTEE
MONTANA STATE
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

January 15, 1985

An informational meeting of the Fish and Game Committee was called to order by Chairman Bob Ream on January 15, 1985, at 3:05 p.m. in Room 317 of the State Capitol Building.

ROLL CALL: All members of the committee were present.

Chairman Ream announced that the committee would take executive action on House Bills number 91 and 93 on Thursday, January 17, 1985, and written testimony on those two bills would be accepted until that time. Also, House Bills number 2 and 39 will be heard on that date.

House Bills 136 and 159 have been tentatively scheduled for hearing on January 22, 1985, at 3:00 p.m.

SPEAKER: Mr. Jim Flynn, Director of the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks for the past four years, was present to visit with the committee and tell them what the department is and what it does.

Mr. Flynn distributed several papers and booklets to each committee member. These materials give an overview about the department and what the department is working on at the present time. (See Exhibits No. 1, 2, 3, and 4)

The first booklet that Mr. Flynn discussed in considerable detail with the committee, outlined the various functions of each division within the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks. Some of the sections that were reviewed and discussed were: department responsibilities, commission functions, budgets, funding sources, centralized services, fees, summary of license sales, drawing applications, drawing revenues, conservation education, enforcement potpourri, fisheries potpourri, parks potpourri, land potpourri, department acreage, payment in lieu of taxes, harvest survey, and predator control. (See Exhibit No. 1)

During the review of the booklet, many questions were asked of Mr. Flynn by the committee members.

Mr. Flynn also read from the department's proposed legislation sheet, the bills that his department would like to see changed. (See Exhibit No. 3)

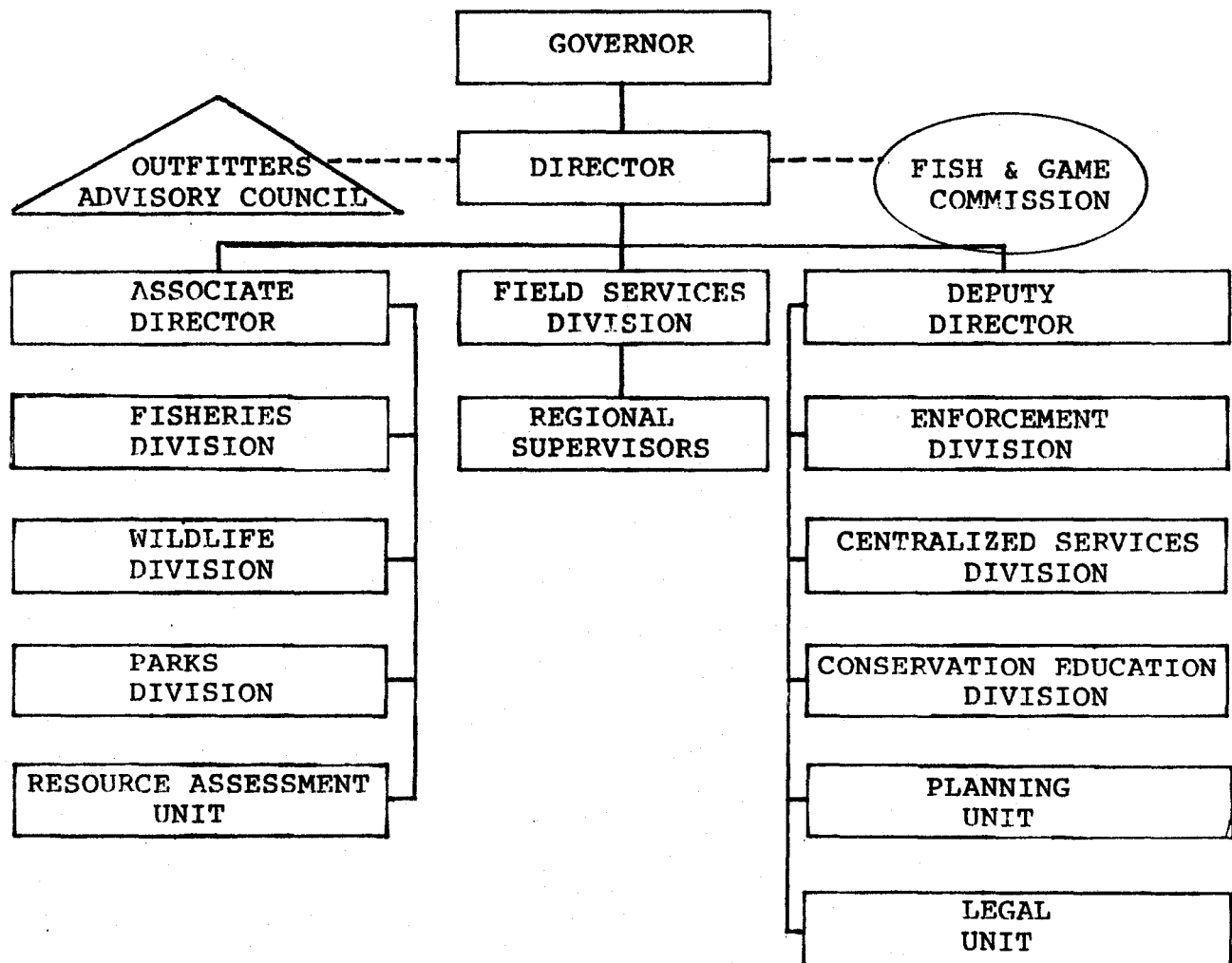

DEPARTMENT RESPONSIBILITIES

The Department by law supervises management of all the fish, wildlife, game and nongame birds, waterfowl and the game and fur-bearing animals of the state. Further, the Department is responsible for all scenic, historic, archaeological scientific and recreational resources of the state.

Our charge is providing optimum outdoor recreation opportunities, including the preservation of habitats for fish and wildlife for Montanans and their guests.

COMMISSION

The Fish and Game Commission sets department policy; establishes fishing, hunting, and trapping rules; establishes rules governing the use of lands owned or controlled by the Department and waters under jurisdiction of the Department; approves all acquisitions or transfer of interests in land or water and approves the Department budget.

ORGANIZATION

See Annual Report.

BUDGETS

The Department's operating budget for Fiscal Year 1985 totals \$20,975,162.

● ADMINISTRATION

(includes Legal Unit, Planning Unit and Resource Assessment Units)

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$803,498 with 13.01 FTE's. Primary source of funding is general license sales.

● CENTRALIZED SERVICES

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$1,835,634 with 37.85 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are general license sales and revolving account reimbursements.

● CONSERVATION EDUCATION

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$1,012,487 with 20.25 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are license issuances and Pittman-Robertson fund.

● ENFORCEMENT

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$3,615,857 with 87.33 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are license sales and fuel tax.

● FIELD SERVICES

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$1,090,056 with 29.00 FTE's. Primary source of funding is general license sales.

● FISHERIES

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$3,223,940 with 90.79 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are license sales and Dingell-Johnson monies.

● PARKS

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$3,571,363 with 85.43 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are the state's General Fund, Parks earned revenue, fuel taxes, coal severance tax, federal pass-through funds and license revenue. License revenue is only spent on sites where the sportsmen directly benefit, i.e. fishing access sites. License dollars are not spent on components of the state park system where the sportsmen does not benefit directly.

● WILDLIFE

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$4,026,108 with 89.14 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are license sales and Pittman-Robertson monies.

● REVOLVING ACCOUNT

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$1,796,219 with 7.67 FTE's. Includes: Print Shop/office supply, Equipment Enterprise, Warehouse Inventory, Grounds Maintenance.

CENTRALIZED SERVICES (LICENSING) POTPOURRI

- Centralized Services Division is responsible for recording all the financial transactions of the Department, administering the license drawings and distributing licenses to our license agents.
- Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$1,835,634 with 37.85 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are general license sales and revolving account reimbursements.
- You do not need a federal waterfowl stamp to hunt mourning doves or sandhill cranes (a crane permit is required, see current waterfowl regulations) in Montana.
- A federal waterfowl stamp is required at age 16.
- License Agents get 30¢ for each individual license sold.
- Our license year begins March 1 and runs through February of the following year.
- Resident youth ages 12, 13 and 14 need only a conservation license to fish, hunt upland game birds and migratory waterfowl.
- Resident youth need a fishing license at age 15.
- Youth cannot hunt game animals or game birds until the age of 12. Hunters 12 thru 17 years old must have successfully completed the Montana Hunter Education Course and received a Certificate of Competence prior to purchasing a hunting license.
- Youth must be 12 years old by September 15 to apply for special drawings.
- Children under 14 who are in public with a firearm, by law, must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

CONSERVATION EDUCATION POTPOURRI

The Conservation Education Division fulfills the public relations function for the Department, publishes the Department magazine MONTANA OUTDOORS, maintains the film lending library, and publishes the Department hunting, fishing and trapping regulations and maps.

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$1,012,487 with 20.25 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are license issuances and Pittman-Robertson fund.

● Through the Hunter Education Program, which was initiated in 1958, over 184,000 individuals have been certified as safe hunters. We have approximately 650 certified Hunter Education instructors, and we certify about 6,000 individuals as safe hunters annually.

ENFORCEMENT POTPOURRI

The Enforcement Division is responsible for enforcing the laws of this State and Department rules with reference to protection and preservation of game, furbearing animals, fish and game birds plus enforcing boat, snowmobile and hunter safety laws and regulations.

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$3,615,857 with 87.33 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are license sales and fuel tax.

- We have 81 field wardens, including sergeants and captains.
- Our (toll free) Hot-line # is 1-800-332-6117 -- Staffed 24-hours per day to receive reports of vandalism and hunting and fishing violations.
- An individual becomes eligible for resident fishing, hunting and trapping licenses after 6 months legal residence in Montana. Individuals may claim only one state of residence.
- * 1. Military Personnel who are assigned to duty in Montana and their dependents may apply for resident license after a period of 30 days within Montana, upon presentation of assignment orders from the proper unit commander.
- * 2. Residents of V. A. Hospitals and Montana State Institutions, with the exception of inmates at the state penitentiary, are authorized to fish when in possession of a free permit signed by the heads of respective institutions.
- * 3. Aliens may purchase resident licenses if they have met state residency requirements.

● SPORTSMAN'S RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. Must have landowner permission (verbal or written) to hunt big game on private property in Montana. Bird hunters need permission if property is so posted or other reasonable notice is given.
- 2. Hunters must wear a minimum 400 square inches of hunter orange above the waist visible at all times when hunting big game during the rifle season. Archers must wear hunter orange if a rifle season is open.

- In 1983, 4575 Notice to Appear (NTA's) and complaint forms were written.
- In 1983, 2332 deer killed by vehicles were recorded by our Enforcement Division.
- In 1983, the two most common violations of Fish and Game law were:
 1. Fishing without a license.
 2. Hunting big game without landowner permission.
- All watercraft must be equipped with a personal flotation device for all riders; children under 12 must wear pfd's at all times when boat is in the water.
- Revenue generated from sale of confiscated game goes into the Department's general fund (Earned Revenue Account).

FISHERIES POTPOURRI

Fisheries Division is responsible for management of Montana's aquatic resources; specifically to maintain optimum fish populations in Montana waters.

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$3,223,940 with 90.79 FTE's. Primary sources of funding are license sales and Dingell-Johnson monies.

- The DINGELL-JOHNSON ACT (DJ) placed an excise tax on selected fishing equipment (ie. tackle, lines). Dollars collected are apportioned back to the states based on land area and fishing licenses sold. DJ dollars in 1983 totalled about \$700,000 and can be used for research, management, habitat improvement and acquisition.
- The general fishing season in Montana runs from the third Saturday in May, through November 30. Most lakes and reservoirs are open year-around.
- The Department has seven fish hatcheries located near Anaconda, Arlee, Big Timber, Bridger, Great Falls, Lewistown and Somers. In addition, we operate one federal hatchery near Eureka, under contract with the Corps of Engineers and one federal hatchery at Miles City under agreement with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service.
- Montana waters are stocked with between seven and eight million fish annually. Less than five percent of these fish are planted in streams, with the remainder going into lakes and reservoirs.
- Our last postal census estimated that 3.1 million fishermen days occurred in Montana per year. This was distributed approximately 50-50 between lakes and streams. Residents account for over 60% of this pressure.
- Over 11,000 individual waters in Montana support 84 species of fish. We consider 54 of these species, native, and the others introduced.
- The rainbow trout is the most common game fish found in a Montana fisherman's creel.

PARKS POTPOURRI

The Parks Division is charged with the management responsibility for outdoor recreation, plus operation and maintenance of snowmobile and motorboat facilities.

Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$3,571,363 with 85.43 FTE's. Primary sources of revenue are the states' general fund, Parks earned revenue, fuel taxes, coal severance tax, and license revenue. License revenue is only spent on sites where the sportsmen directly benefit, i.e. fishing access sites. License dollars are not spent on components of the state park system where the sportsman does not benefit directly.

- The Montana Parks System is made up of:

- 319 sites
 - 12 state parks
 - 72 recreation areas
 - 18 monuments
- 210 fishing access sites
 - 1 recreation road
 - 5 recreation rivers
 - 1 recreation trail

- In 1983, the state's park system had nearly 4½ million visitors.

- The Parks Division receives 5/10th of 1% of the state's distributor's gasoline tax for the development, operation and maintenance of snowmobile related recreation facilities. This percentage is based on the amount of gasoline snowmobilers expend annually.

- Parks and enforcement receive \$1 each from snowmobile registration fee for provision of snowmobile facilities.

- The Division receives 9/10th of 1% of the distributor's gasoline tax for use on areas where motor boating is possible and allowed.

- The Parks Division receives interest on 1-2/3% of the Coal Severance Tax. The interest can be used to acquire sites that are compatible with the state's park system's intent. Dollars can also be used to develop and maintain sites purchased with coal tax dollars.

- The Parks Division administers the federal Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) program. The Land and Water Conservation Fund provides 50% reimburseable grants to the state and political subdivisions of the state for the purpose of providing public outdoor recreation areas and facilities through acquisition and development. Since 1965, the Department has received nearly \$28,000,000 in matching grants.

- Overnight camping fees - A \$3 or \$5 fee is charged at some sites depending on the amount of development.

- A seasonal camping permit is available to Montana residents for \$35 per season for unlimited overnight camping privilege at state park system sites.

- A Golden Year's Pass is available to Montana residents 65 years of age or older at a cost of \$1. The pass is good for a lifetime and allows unlimited overnight camping privileges at state park system sites.

- Campers in the state park system are limited to a 14-day stay per camp site or a shorter period if posted.

LANDS POTPOURRI

- All Department acquisitions or disposal must be approved by the Fish and Game Commission.

- Land acquisition exceeding 100 acres or \$100,000, must also go to the Board of Land Commissioners for approval.

- Fishing access site acquisition is made possible by dollars earmarked from fishing license sales. \$1 from resident season licenses, \$1 from nonresident two-day licenses and \$5 from nonresident season licenses goes into a fund earmarked for fishing access acquisition. This will generate approximately \$435,000 in Fiscal Year 1983.

● The Coal Severance Tax in Montana provides revenue for site acquisitions and management. 1-2/3% of the Coal Severance Tax is set aside in a trust of which only the interest accrued may be expended for acquisition and management. Anticipated revenue from this source for the 1984-85 biennium is \$2.5 million. These dollars can be used for acquisition of any site which would compliment the state's park system. The Legislature selects sites from those nominated by the Department and the public.

● Acreage Facts. As of January 1984, the Department controlled, by lease and fee ownership, 325,700 acres plus 62 lots. A total of 104,225 acres, (or roughly 32%) are leased. Attached is a breakdown of department lands by administrative type. Also included in that attachment are department acres by region and percent of total ownership by region.

● The Department permits grazing on an estimated 21,995 acres at 17 sites throughout the state. Agricultural harvesting is permitted on 4,336 acres at 21 sites. Timber harvest totals 56.5 thousand board feet at 2 sites.

● In Lieu of Taxes. The Department pays a fee on land which is essentially a property tax to counties. In 1983, the Department paid \$119,077.63 in lieu of taxes. The Department pays at the same rate a private landowner would pay real property taxes. The Department pays in lieu of taxes for land administered in a county when total holdings in that county of game range and fishing access sites exceed 100 acres. We do not pay taxes on parks, recreation areas, state monuments, headquarters or fish hatcheries.

● The four counties receiving the largest payments in 1983 were:

1. Deer Lodge - \$17,038.27
2. Lake - \$16,801.09
3. Lewis & Clark - \$16,246.20
4. Teton - \$13,426.84

Wildlife Division's goal is to protect, enhance and regulate the wise use of Wildlife resources for public benefit now and in the future.

- Fiscal Year 1985 budget of \$4,026,108 with 89.14 RTE's. Primary source of budget are license sales and Pittman-Robertson monies.

This division is responsible for collecting the scientific information necessary for managing all of the big game (10 species), upland game birds (9 species), waterfowl (about 25 species), furbearers (10 species), nongame (over 500 species), and endangered wildlife (4 species).

- The PITTMAN-ROBERTSON ACT placed an 11 percent excise tax on sporting arms and ammunition that was collected by the federal government and apportioned back to the states on the basis of the land area of the state and the number of licenses sold. In later years, this act was expanded to include excise taxes on handguns and bows and arrows. In recent years, Montana has received approximately \$3,000,000 annually which can be used for habitat development, research, land acquisition, coordination project segments and hunter education projects.
- "Fur-bearing animals" include marten or sable, otter, muskrat, fisher, mink, bobcat, lynx, wolverine, northern swift fox and beaver. A general trappers license is required to take a fur-bearing animal. Other "fur-bearers" such as the coyote, weasel, skunk and civet cat are officially classified as predators --- License required for nonresident trappers.
- Endangered Species listed by Montana include the peregrine falcon, whooping crane, black-footed ferret, and Northern Rocky Mountain Wolf. The federal government also lists the bald eagle as endangered in Montana.
- Nongame wildlife means any wild animal not otherwise legally classified by statute or regulation in Montana. Examples of nongame wildlife with commercial value are badger, raccoon and red fox --- LICENSE REQUIRED FOR NONRESIDENT TRAPPERS.
- "Game animals" include deer, elk, moose, antelope, caribou, mountain sheep, mountain goat and bear.
- Over 2.5 million days of hunting-oriented recreation were spent in Montana by resident and nonresident sportsmen. Recreation figure is conservative because of the additional recreation provided by nonhunting wildlife recreationists.
- Wildlife management areas total 289,756 acres. Of these 183,777 acres are deeded, 105,979 acres are leased and the remaining acreage is managed by a Memorandum of Understanding.

MISCELLANEOUS

- The Department expends \$80,000 annually on predator control.
- The Department spends \$100,000 annually on game damage...used for stock panels, blood meal, herder, etc.
- On Montana's State income tax return, anyone receiving a refund can contribute to the Nongame Wildlife Program. A box on line 61 allows contributions of \$2, \$5, or \$10* Contributions are tax-deductible on the following year's return. Funds will be used for education and research efforts on behalf of Montana's nongame species.

- Montana had 574 licensed outfitters in 1983 and 1,077 guides.
- In 1983 we had 4,600 trappers.
- In 1983 we issued a total of 60 resident and nonresident falconer's permits. Permits are renewed annually no later than April 30th.

DEPARTMENT'S PROPOSED LEGISLATION

I.

The following proposed bills were submitted at the request of the Department to the Legislative Council as bill drafting requests on December 21, 1984.

Bill No. 1:

- (a) Amend 87-2-805(1), MCA, and related statutes to clarify the differences between resident and nonresident youth and to clarify any confusion with regard to the purchase of turkey licenses by disabled people, youth and senior citizens.
- (b) Amend 87-2-506(2) to make the 10% nonresident rule applicable only for big game drawings.
- (c) Amend the trappers license to clear up the discrepancy between the current license expiration date and the trapping season which extends beyond the license expiration date.
- (d) Amend the two statutes dealing with disabled persons to make them consistent with each other.

Bill No. 2:

Amend Section 87-1-226 to allow the sale of animals taken under game damage permits if a state agency or institution will not accept the meat.

Bill No. 3:

- (a) Allow the sale of surplus department lands by private listings when the bid process fails to secure a reasonable price.
- (b) Repeal Section 87-1-106 which requires the payment of a \$4 per square foot rental fee.

- (c) Repeal Section 87-1-211 requiring commission approval on construction projects of \$1,000 - \$5,000.

Bill No. 4:

Allow coal tax money to be used in the funding of operation and maintenance of park sites as the legislature may specify.

Bill No. 5:

Institute a crimestopper program that would allow rewards for tips leading to the arrest of fish and game violators.

Bill No. 6:

- (a) Amend Section 23-2-511 to allow a 10-day grace period upon the use of vessels after they have been bought before a license is required.
- (b) Increase the fine for boats being used without decals in order to encourage the proper purchase of decals.

Bill No. 7:

Provide explicit statutory authority to maintain capitol grounds.

II.

Bill No. 8:

A bill is presently being drafted for Department approval and then submittal to the Legislative Council that would:

- (a) Increase the fees for resident and nonresident fishing licenses;
- (b) Increase the paddlefish license fee for nonresidents; and
- (c) Increase the nonresident big game combination license fee.

III.

The Department will make a letter recommendation to the Legislature, accompanied by supporting documentation and a draft of the proposed bill for their convenience, to amend the state list of endangered species to include the white sturgeon.

COOPERATIVE LANDOWNER/SPORTSMAN PROGRAM

Public ownership of America's fish and wildlife resources is firmly embedded in law, as well as America's lifestyle. Unfortunately, solutions to the problems created when this public resource occurs on privately owned land are not easily arrived at. Private landowners' viewpoints of this public resource range from a valuable asset to an economic threat. Increased economic pressures on agriculture and big game numbers in Montana have recently sharpened the interest in this relationship.

This is not a new situation. In fact, Aldo Leopold, a pioneer in the area of game management, wrote as early as 1931, "...it is the crux of the problem in the region." He went on to state that, "Not one of the eight states (within the region) has as yet extended any positive recognition to the farmer." Leopold also offered solutions. His recommendations in the above-mentioned report seem as pertinent today as they did in 1931 for the northcentral states. In general, he suggested that the land holder be recognized as the custodian of public game on private lands and he should be protected from the irresponsible shooter. He further suggested that game management should be a partnership enterprise to which the land holder, the sportsman and the public each contribute appropriate services and from which each derives appropriate rewards. Achieving this partnership is one of the greatest challenges facing wildlife managers today.

The Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks is interested in increasing its efforts addressing the concerns of landowners regarding wild game on their property and the impact of sportsmen's activities. The goal of this effort would be to maintain the productive capability of private land to provide food, water, cover and space for wildlife and encourage landowners to continue to provide the associated recreational opportunities to the public.

In developing a program, it is recognized that historically the hosting of fish, wildlife and sportsmen has been a courtesy extended by the landowner. Considerable past effort has focused on addressing the special management concerns expressed by landowners. Several positive programs have been initiated after discussion with landowners, sportsmen and the legislature.

This program will consider both the historic practice and the present circumstances connected with the private landowner/fish, wildlife and sportsman relationship.

To be successful, and to exist over the long-term, this program must be achievable and implemented in such a manner as to assure success. Realistically, this calls for a conservative and workable approach, providing a continuing positive base to build upon as time goes by.

To that end, Fish, Wildlife & Parks considers the following as potential beginning program elements:

1. Insurance - A reimbursement program for landowners who have livestock accidentally shot during the hunting season.
2. Trespass/Liability Laws - Tighten up these laws to give the landowners greater protection.
3. Landowner Recognition - Develop a program which more adequately recognizes the important role played by private land in the production of wildlife and the private landowner in allowing access for public hunting.
4. Education/Awareness Program - Do a better job of familiarizing the public and department employees regarding landowner problems and improve the hunter responsibility aspect of our hunter education program.
5. Block Management - A pilot program testing the concept of the department relieving the landowner of some administrative burden during hunting seasons.
6. Game Damage - Develop a statewide policy and request an increase in funding by the legislature to be used for additional materials, developing a techniques manual and implementing a research program.

Fish, Wildlife & Parks realizes these are not the only problem areas, but believes they are areas of concern which can be addressed with some degree of success. Once implemented, they can be used as a base to address other issues.
