

MINUTES OF THE MEETING  
BUSINESS AND LABOR COMMITTEE  
MONTANA STATE  
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

February 15, 1985

The meeting of the Business and Labor Committee was called to order by Chairman Bob Pavlovich, on February 15, 1985 at 8:00 a.m., in Room 312-2 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present.

HOUSE BILL 561: Hearing commenced on House Bill 561. Representative Ron Miller, District #34, sponsor of the bill at the request of the Board of Cosmetologists, stated this is a general revision of the laws regulating the practice of cosmetology and is effective immediately.

Proponent Dorothy Turner, Legislative Chairman, Montana State Cosmetologists's Association, supplied written testimony which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

Proponents Kathryn Tucker, Executive Secretary, Board of Cosmetologists and Dudley Williams, Project Director, offered their support of the bill.

Opponent Farrell Griffin of Billings, voiced his opposition to the inspection and reciprocity requirements. Mr. Griffin believes that a licensee should make said inspection and that the present reciprocity is a just and fair one. Some states require only 1,000 hours before being licensed and Montana requires 2,000 hours. Those practicing in Montana should meet up to the Montana requirements, added Mr. Griffin.

Opponent McRay Evans, owner of two beauty colleges and a salon in Bozeman, extended his opposition to the inspection and reciprocity requirements, also. Mr. Evans added that with the stiff requirements in Montana, the public is better protected.

Opponent Doug McKeever, of Helena, stated that the 1 year experience requirement for teaching should be removed from the bill.

In closing, Representative Miller explained that the inspections are for public health purposes only and have the support of the department and board.

Representative Simon asked Representative Miller to comment on the reciprocity issue. Representative

Miller explained that states who require lesser hours still have the 300 hours basic training requirement.

There being no further discussion by proponents or opponents, all were excused by the chairman and the hearing on House Bill 561 was closed.

HOUSE BILL 562: Representative Ron Miller, District #34, sponsor of the bill at the request of the Board of Cosmetologists, explained that this bill requires a high school diploma or its equivalent or a certificate from a post-secondary vocational-technical center to qualify to take the examination to practice cosmetology, and is effective immediately.

Proponent Dorothy Turner, Legislative Chairman, Montana State Cosmetologist's Association, supplied written testimony which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

Proponent Bev Ball, a salon and school owner in Great Falls, explained that currently an 8th grade education is required. The high school education requirement will help in the text reading and understanding, added Ms. Ball.

Opponent McRay Evans, owner of two beauty colleges and a salon in Bozeman, explained that out of his 30 students, 5 would be eliminated.

Opponent Farrell Griffin of Billings, stated this would prevent interested persons from getting into the business. The text studied from is written at a 6th grade level and the chemicals used can also be purchased in local drug stores. Mr. Griffin suggested that there are better ways of achieving higher education standards.

In closing, Representative Miller explained that there are 15 schools in the state. The industry needs to update and reach the highest, professional standards as possible.

Representative Brown asked Representative Miller why this bill was not combined with House Bill 561. Representative Miller explained that they wanted to keep each bill independent and of their own merit.

Representative Simon asked those present, how many did not have a high school diploma or GED. Of approximately 40 people present, 3 did not have the qualification.

There being no further discussion by proponents or opponents, all were excused by the chairman and the hearing on House Bill 562 was closed.

HOUSE BILL 563: Hearing commenced on House Bill 563. Representative Ron Miller, District 334, sponsor of the bill at the request of the Board of Cosmetology, stated this would require licensure and regulation of manicurists, manicuring shops and schools of manicuring and is effective on January 1, 1986.

Proponent Dorothy Turner, Legislative Chairman, Montana State Cosmetologist's Association, supplied written testimony which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

In closing, Representative Miller stated that this bill would apply to those persons who want to do manicures only.

Representative Driscoll asked Ms. Turner if there are any manicurists in the state that are not cosmetologists. Ms. Turner explained that a cosmetologist is also a manicurist and if someone is practicing as a manicurist without being a licensed cosmetologist they are breaking the law.

Representative Glaser questioned those in attendance, as to how many had read the three bills discussed. Of approximately 40 present, approximately 20 had read the bills.

There being no further discussion by proponents or opponents, all were excused by the chairman and the hearing on House Bill 563 was closed.

HOUSE BILL 668: Hearing commenced on House Bill 668. Representative Gary Spaeth, District #84, sponsor of the bill, stated this amends the group disability insurance law to require that a person whose insurance ceases because of termination of his employment or because of termination of the group policy by the insurer for any reason other than non-payment of premium is entitled to an individual policy.

Proponent George Bousliman, representing the State Bar of Montana, explained that the uninsurable should be afforded coverage. Mr. Bousliman distributed to committee members Exhibit 2, which is attached hereto.

Proponent Robert Mento, an attorney from Missoula, stated that it is getting more difficult to obtain health insurance, House Bill 668 would do the citizens of Montana good and provide stability to our people.

Opponent John Alke, representing Blue Shield, explained that they don't insure the state bar. This will destroy the concept of group health insurance and raise the premiums. The healthy will be taken care of and the sick will be left out, added Mr. Alke.

Opponent Steve Brown, representing Blue Cross, explained they do insure the state bar and he was in agreement with the comments made by Mr. Alke.

In closing, Representative Spaeth stated that the problem is arising due to different health care groups. Representative Spaeth asked the committee to give the bill more time and to wait until House Bill 817 is heard. This is for the protection of those that have health care problems, added Representative Spaeth.

Representative Ellerd asked Mr. Bousliman who will set the premiums. He explained that the conversation statute will accelerate up to 150% of the old premium. Representative Ellerd then asked if the legislature has the power to direct these out of state companies, to which the answer was yes.

Representative Driscoll asked Mr. Alke if the healthy will be in and the not healthy out. He explained that if you can't pass the medical statement, you must convert to an individual policy.

Representative Ellerd asked Mr. Alke if an increase in premium for all would occur if the unhealthy are considered. He explained that no, they are all separate contracts.

Representative Driscoll asked Mr. Mento if this would keep the healthy in and the unhealthy out. Mr. Mento stated that you can't force an employee to accept a benefit and that once they are accepted, you have to cover all.

There being no further discussion by proponents or opponents, all were excused by the chairman and the hearing on House Bill 668 was closed.

HOUSE BILL 691: Hearing commenced on House Bill 691. Representative Red Menahan, District #67, sponsor of the bill, explained this would provide for automobile liability insurance coverage of the owner rather than the automobile. Montana should be a pilot program to see what can be done for consumers. When insured, a company can not tell if a car is safe to be on the road and a new vehicle should be rated before being allowed on the road, added Representative Menahan.

Proponent Bob Pavlovich, District #70, offered his support of the bill.

Proponent Del Snyder, explained that this creates a hardship on people. A person with multiple vehicles and one user is paying for something and receiving nothing, both vehicles can't be used at the same time, added Mr. Snyder.

Opponent Roger McGlenn, Executive Director, Independent Insurance Agents Association of Montana, explained that this bill has been studied, and dismissed as unworkable. The cost involved will be passed on to the consumer. Rates will increase if there is more than one operator per vehicle. The medical insurance currently covers the operator and those persons in the vehicle, gaps in coverage will exist. Insurance companies would spend time, effort and money for the benefit of a small number of people. If this bill would provide better coverage for Montana insureds, then it has merit, added Mr. McGlenn.

Opponent Glen Drake, representing the American Insurance Association, explained that a fleet problem would be created by House Bill 691. An individual covered for a business vehicle would also be covered while driving any car whether for personal or business purposes, stated Mr. Drake.

Opponent Jim Diggins, representing Farmers Insurance Group, extended his opposition to the bill.

Representative Driscoll asked Mr. McGlenn what percentage of collected premium is paid out in claims. Mr. McGlenn explained that 80 million was collected and 62 million paid out in 1982. An average of 77% of all collected premiums are paid out.

Representative Thomas asked Representative Menahan if he had any statistics on the changes that would be involved. Representative Menahan explained that he didn't, as no other state has this type of insurance.

In closing, Representative Menahan, explained that in several New England states the rate and type of policies are set by the state. People drive cars and those who have never been in an accident for those who have. People who like a sports car and have a clean record, pay a higher premium due to their choice in automobile, added Representative Menahan.

There being no further discussion by proponents or opponents, all were excused by the vice-chairman and the hearing on House Bill 691 was closed.

HOUSE BILL 773: Hearing commenced on House Bill 773. Representative Ted Schye, District #18, sponsor of the bill, stated this would require an oil producer to measure and record the amount of oil produced and to provide the oil and gas conservation board with a schematic design of the measurement facilities. House Bill 773 will make oil more accountable when measuring. Representative Schye distributed to committee members Exhibit 3 which is attached hereto.

Proponent John Shontz, Richland County Commissioner, explained that this will provide all, including the state with an accurate measure of what is coming out of the ground and account for the revenue. State and local governments could lose approximately 30 million due to inaccuracy of measurement.

Proponent John Rabenberg, President, High Plains land and Minerals Association, supplied written testimony, which is attached hereto as Exhibit 4.

Proponent Senator Larry Tveit, District #11, stated concerns are present due to cost effectiveness and cold weather and that this measure could cost some wells out of existence.

Proponent Sherell Genderson, Director, Northeast Montana Land and Mineral Association, read testimony from Senator Ed Smith in support of the bill. The measuring of all other products is different in every aspect, explained Mr. Genderson. Prices of meters were quoted by Mr. Genderson.

Proponent Gloria Paldrchuk of Sidney stated this would create higher standards in the oil business.

Opponent Senator Del Gage, District #5, stated this would present costs to cities and states. An additional burden will be placed on those marginal wells. House Bill 773 could drive oil and gas out of Montana, added Senator Gage.

Opponent Carl Jansky, explained that oil taxes are based on the amount of oil that is sold. Anyone who violates subsection (1), (2) or (3) is guilty of a misdemeanor. A misdemeanor penalty is a fine of not less than \$10,000 or prison of not less than 6 months or both, stressed Mr. Jansky.

Opponent John Warren, Production Manager, Cenex Oil in Billings, supplied written testimony, which is attached hereto as Exhibit 5.

Opponent Senator Tom Keating, District #44, explained that an oil and gas lease is a legal agreement between the mineral owner and the operator. A specific share of a royalty is paid to the mineral owner and should the operator attempt to defraud the mineral owner, he would lose 7/8 to gain 1/8. All operators are requested to report to the oil and gas commission the amount of oil which is public record. It is ludicrous to suggest that these "under the table" dealings are going on. Those who would attempt to skim a tank, would be caught easily. The exact measurement is impossible to obtain even with the best equipment, added Senator Keating.

Opponents Darwin VanDeGruff, Ken Wonstolen, representing Independent Petroleum Association of Mountain States, Ward Shennhan, representing Chevron, Leland Tea, a consulting petroleum geologist in Shelby, Bill Froll, an independent oil producer from Cutbank, Lewis Pepples, representing Branch Oil and Gas in Shelby, Curt Dahlguard, an independent oil producer, Nancy Zear, President, Montana Association of Landmen, and John Augustine, representing Conoco all extended their opposition to the bill.

Opponent Danny Murphy, of Croft Petroleum Company, supplied written testimony which is attached hereto as Exhibit 6.

Representative Hansen asked Mr. Genderson what the lifetime of a meter is. He explained that 18 years is an average.

Representative Schultz asked Senator Keating if this process is used in any other state. Senator Keating stated that no other state requires positive, displacement metering.

Representative Bachini directed the same question to Representative Schye, who explained that 13 states are currently using this metering system or a variation of this system.

Representative Bachini then asked Representative Schye if he would consider removing stripper wells from the bill, to which the answer was yes.

Representative asked Mr. VanDeGruff how many wells exist in the state. Mr. VanDeGruff explained that there are approximately 4,000 wells.

Representative Kitselman asked Mr. VanDeGruff if the owner of a well may purchase and install the meter. He explained that the owner has the right to install and maintain the meter.

In closing, Representative Schye, explained that the bill has been written from the rules and regulation book. These meters will not require an inspection. Royalty owners are questioning whether these operators are anti-business or pro-people. House Bill 773 is an act of accountability, added Representative Schye.

There being no further discussion by proponents or opponents, all were excused by the vice-chairman and the hearing on House Bill 773 was closed.

HOUSE BILL 354: Hearing commenced on House Bill 354. Representative Brandewie, District #49, sponsor of the bill, explained that this abolished state licensing of airports and air navigation facilities. This repealer of the licensing act was passed over 40 years ago and is not being used. The FAA inspects those airports that are served by commercial airlines. Representative Brandewie distributed to committee members Exhibit 7, which is attached hereto.

Proponent Mike Ferguson offered his support of the bill.

Proponent Brent Markle, Administrator, Legal Division, Department of Commerce, explained that the department's position is a neutral one. The department is under mandate to follow the present law and license airports. This mandate resulted from a lawsuit due to sea planes landing in Seeley Lake. If airports are to be licensed, the laws needed to be cleared up, added Mr. Markle.

Proponent Ted Schye, District #18, reminded the committee, that this bill takes in the entire state of Montana and not just Seeley Lake.

Proponent Russ Pankey, Director of Airports, Missoula County, stated that the current law is not needed and creates an unnecessary cost to the state.

Proponent Nils Pearson, President, Montana Pilots Association, stated that the cost to the community, duplication of the federal requirement and safety are



the reasons of his support. There are 119 public use airports in Montana, several who have a budget of less than \$500 annually. The licensing of airports will create fewer airports and not add safety. The federal administration and experts should be allowed to make the requirements, added Mr. Pearson.

Proponent Lewis Lindemer, Seeley Lake Airport Manager and Principle of Lindsey's Landing West, supplied written testimony which is attached hereto as Exhibit 8.

Proponent Joe Atwood, President, of the Montana FAA Council and Montana Air Navigation Association, offered his support of the bill.

Proponent Don Larson, a retail business owner in Seeley Lake, presented comments as outlined on his witness statement which is attached.

Proponents Bert Poloson and Grace Poloson, pilots, supplied written testimony which is attached hereto as Exhibit 9.

Opponent Mike Anderson, counsel for the Seeley Lake Homeowners Association, explained that only through the court system was this matter considered. The judge who tried the case was a member of the aeronautics division, thus very able. The statute does not mandate licensing. The FAA encourages regulations, but does not select or approve airport sites. Under aviation insurance coverage, an exclusion exists if an airplane is damaged on an unlicensed airport. Mr. Anderson entered into the record petitions from campers and boaters of the Seeley Lake area which are attached hereto.

Opponent Erv Gysler, a resident of Seeley Lake, explained that water rights are for the protection of the residents of this state. Seeley Lake is a congested one, and people should not have to quit vacationing to allow for a sea plane landing. Approximately \$30,000 in attorney fees has been spent by the Seeley Lake Homeowners Association and if House Bill 354 is passed, the money spend will mean nothing.

Opponent Ken Dyrđ, an attorney from Great Falls, stated that over 50 property owners of Seeley Lake appeared before county, state and federal agencies seeking results. House Bill 354 will take away laws that have been enforced, due to hard work and persistence of these property owners, added Mr. Dyrđ.

Opponent R. H. Scott, a resident of Seelty Lake, stated that the FAA does not license airports and no satisfaction has been received from the FAA. Mr. Scott traveled to Seattle and Washington D.C. trying to get results. The law should have been enforced over 40 years ago, but the department has not done their job. Citizens and taxpayers can be overrun by aviation, added Mr. Scott.

Opponents Duane Wright, Bev Ball, Mr. and Mrs. Bill Steele, Margaret D. Farrell, Dianna Bliss, Joan Baker, Verna Welch, Lee Farrell, Cy Baker, Lucille Neumann, Clara Maetcke, Marie Mora and Bruno Mora, voiced their opposition to the bill.

Representative Hansen asked those in attendance how many live at Seeley Lake year round. A show of hands resulted in approximately 10 individuals.

Representative Simon asked Mr. Ferguson if a plane could land in a public body of water anywhere and what constitutes an airport. Mr. Ferguson explained that yes, a public body of water is open to the public and an airport is a body of land or water used for the takeoff of aircraft.

Representative Kadas asked Mr. Ferguson if the FAA does in fact license airports. Mr. Ferguson called on Jim Howton, of the FAA in Seattle. Mr. Howton explained that the administration is notified if an airport is being contemplated, they then issue an approval or disapproval, but do not license airports.

In closing, Representative Brandewie explained that Judge Lobel was not a member of the aeronautics division as testified previously, but did serve as the counsel. Only one Seeley Lake resident currently has a lake shore dock permit. Representative Brandewie submitted Exhibit 10, which is attached hereto.

There being no further discussion by proponents or opponents, all were excused by the chairman and the hearing on House Bill 354 was closed.

Commissioner Dave Wanzenried was present to further explain House Bill 387. Mr. Wanzenried stated that the intent of House Bill 387 is to clarify the procedure to be used by the commissioner and is not to

EXPLANATION AND JUSTIFICATION FOR THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE LAWS  
RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF COSMETOLOGY:

HOUSE BILL 561

The following changes are intended to clean up and broaden the present laws relating to the practice of Cosmetology.

1. Page 2. Section 37-31-101, (1) (b) would be repealed to broaden the definition of Lines 3-6 Cosmetology and clearly define who shall be required to be licensed.
2. Page 3. *this removes the exemption for state Bar, Artists, Enthusiasts to have Esthetic License*  
Section 37-31-304 (3) would be amended to abolish this costly and Lines 10-11 cumbersome requirement of providing a health statement to enter Cosmetology Training. The Board has authority, granted in Section 37-31-332, to cancel or suspend a license if a licensee contracts a communicable disease endangering the public health.
3. Page 3. Section 37-31-305 (2) would be amended to delete the requirement of Lines 23-25 one year of experience prior to taking the Teacher Training course with the number of hours of training increased and prior to taking the Instructor examination. Deleting the requirement for one year of work experience and increasing the course of training is proposed because a newly licensed person is more prepared with school procedure and the school Basic curriculum for teaching basic cosmetology to students in a school than individuals licensed in the profession for a longer period of time. Licensees with three or more years of work experience may apply and take the written and practical examinations for an Instructor License, and be licensed upon passing the examination.
4. Page 4. 37-31-308 (1) (2) (3) would be amended to allow the board more flexibility Lines 10-13 to hold examinations and to further clarify the conditions for re-examination.  
17-18 Allowing more flexibility to hold examinations as needed will allow students  
Line 25 upon graduation a quicker entry into the work force with a Manager-Operator License. The number of persons graduating from cosmetology schools have  
Page 5 increased to the extent that examinations have become so large that facilities  
Lines 1-5 used for examinations are overcrowded to the point that double examinations are necessary. Overcrowding and double examinations, in the opinion of the Board, are not conducive to proper examinations either for the Students or the examiners.
5. Page 5. 37-31-312 (1) would be amended to delete the unnecessary requirement that Lines 19-20 an Inspector of cosmetology salons and schools must be a licensed cosmetologist. An Inspector is inspecting only for sanitary conditions of an establishment and that the persons working in the premises, performing cosmetological services on the Public are currently licensed in the state of Montana.  
*This does not prevent a license from being the Inspector*
6. Page 8. 37-31-322 (3) would be amended to abolish the requirement that the Department Lines 7-12 notify the licensees of the expiration dates of their license and the penalty for failure to renew by that date. Licensees are provided with their renewal notice and 'form' at the time of issuance of their license including the expiration date and penalty fees for failure to renew.
7. Page 8. NEW SECTION, Section 7 is proposed to allow the department to issue a license to all out-of-state applicants who hold a current Cosmetology license, eliminating all other requirements for licensure, such as working experience in lieu of training. This section is recommended by the National Hairdressers and Cosmetologists Association, Inc., (70,000 licensed members) and the National Interstate Council of State Boards of Cosmetology (50 States Regulatory Boards).

EXPLANATION AND JUSTIFICATION FOR THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE LAWS  
RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF COSMETOLOGY:

HOUSE BILL 562

The following changes are intended to clean up, clarify and broaden the present laws relating to the educational requirement for eligibility to take the examination.

1. Page 1      Section 37-31-304 (2) would be amended to provide for a High School  
Lines 23-25      diploma or equivalency and/or a vo-technical certificate. Higher education  
Page 2      is needed in consideration of Public Health and Welfare due to the  
Lines 1-2      sophistication and high technology regarding chemical formulas relating  
to hair dyes, tints, bleaches, permanent waves, etc. now being used by the

A statement of intent is necessary for this bill because in section 3 the board of oil and gas conservation is delegated additional rulemaking authority to implement the provisions of the bill.

Specifically, the board is directed to adopt rules governing acceptable methods of measurement and their approval, rules governing acceptable methods of determination in the event of spillage or leakage, and rules prescribing the requirements of production records.

In the rules governing acceptable methods of measurement, it is contemplated that the board compile a list of positive displacement metering systems that may be used to measure oil.

HOUSE BILL 773

February 15, 1985

I am John Rabenberg, president of the High Plains Land and Minerals Association, and I am here to speak in favor of House Bill 773.

House Bill 773 will accomplish a number of positive things for those involved in the oil industry, by providing for more accurate measuring of crude oil as it is sold from the tank in the field.

Presently, when oil is sold from the tank in the field, measuring the volume sold is a hit-and-miss situation. A stick is inserted in the tank and the depth of the oil on the stick is measured. This is then multiplied by the diameter of the tank to get a volume measurement. This, as you might expect, is a fairly inaccurate way to determine the volume of oil sold.

Inequities exist for all concerned with such an inaccurate measurement. The state loses or gains tax money, the owner of the well gains or loses royalty, and the purchaser of the oil either pays too little or too much with inaccurate measurements.

This legislation would require that an accurate metering device be placed on the tank in order to get an accurate record of just how much oil is being pumped out.

I might also point out that this type of metering system is common in many other states that produce oil and is the law in a number of them. The meters work well in cold weather, too, as Alaska requires them on the tanks. The meters also have the capability to differentiate between crude oil and water that might be present in the tank.

We believe that this is a good piece of legislation, and one that just makes good common sense. We purchase virtually everything we buy based on accurate measurements, either volume or weight. The oil business should be no exception and this bill provides for that.

I encourage your favorable consideration of this bill.

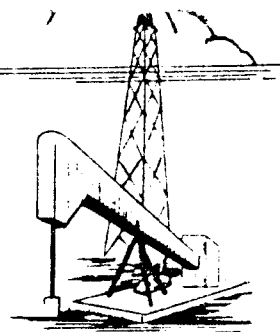

My name is Danny Murphy and I work for Croft Petroleum Co. in Cut Bank, Montana.

I am here to protest the proposed mandatory use of positive displacement meter for measurement of oil in Montana.

A meter anywhere between the well head and tank battery would be subject to oil, gas and water causing a sometimes extremely distorted reading. Damage to the meter would be common because water and/or heavy oil would freeze causing breakage.

If the meter were placed on the tank delivery valves, it would be more successful but still subject to damage if water got mixed with oil in the meter when not in use.


Personally I question the intent of this bill. Historically oil has always been gauged manually and with a great degree of accuracy. Through the use of measuring tapes, strapped tanks, and very precise charts, the oil produced and sold probably varies very slightly from what a meter would measure, if at all. Any small difference would I'm sure average out over time.

A meter is expensive to start with and the cost of hiring a third party to calibrate the meter on a regular basis would put an added burden on an already suffering industry. Many small producing wells are on the brink of a negative cash flow, the price of oil is down 40% over the past

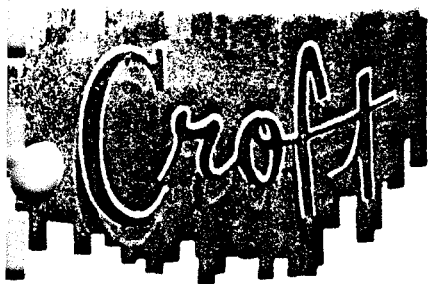

( five years, taxes are very high, the cost of hiring service companies or any type of contract labor is not going down with the price of oil and equipment costs are out of sight. Added costs such as this meter push the time to P&A wells even closer to the present.

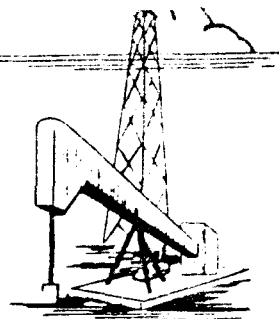

### In Opposition To HB #733 Positive Displacement Meters on Oil Wells

It saddens me greatly that the sponsors of this bill would think that everyone that produces oil in this state is stealing it. This attitude grows from a lack of understanding of how oil is produced and sold.

Oil wells produce fluid that is a mixture of oil, water, and gas. Placing any positive displacement meter upstream of the separation facility that segregates these fluids would be impractical. There is no such meter that would work on a three phase flow. The only place any meter would do any good at all is on the sales side of the storage tanks.

For years the oil industry has been using positive displacement meters for the sale of oil from large storage facilities. These are commonly called LACT units (liquid automatic custody transfer units). The reason these are used is twofold. First it takes the guess work out of reading a gauge tape. The output from a lact is either printed or digitized therefore there is no interpretive error trying to decide if the tape read 14' 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " or 14' 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Secondly it spares the pumper and gauger from a lot of repetitive tasks at a production facility where there are a lot of sales. The only advantage a Lact unit has over a gauger and pumper is on a storage tank with a large diameter. Since the gauger and pumper measure the height of oil in a tank the larger the diameter of the tank the more barrels per inch of height.

About the most oil a truck can haul is 200 barrels so there is not much sense having storage tanks much larger than this on small producing leases. A 250 barrel tank holds 2.75 barrel per inch of depth so a truck would haul 200 divided by 2.75 or 72" of oil out of the tank. Since almost anyone can measure the depth within a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " the most you could be off in any one sale is  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". This amounts to an accuracy of 0.7%. This is great when you consider the correction factor for temperature in going from 0 degrees to 60 degrees F is 2-3%.

Aside from all this the initial cost of a LACT is high and they must be maintained and calibrated periodically. I really do not feel they are much more accurate than a careful gauger and pumper and transporter all of whom work for a different company and whose figures must agree.

"ABOLISH AIRPORT LICENSING"

MR. CHAIRMAN, COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

FOR THE RECORD MY NAME IS LEWIS W. LINDEMER. I AM RECOGNIZED AS THE SEELEY LAKE AIRPORT MANAGER BY THE MISSOULA COUNTY AIRPORT AUTHORITY, AND I AM ALSO THE PRINCIPLE OF LINDEY'S LANDING WEST SEAPLANE BASE LOCATED AT SEELEY LAKE. LINDEY'S LANDING WEST IS THE ONLY SEAPLANE BASE RECOGNIZED AND CHARTED BY THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION IN THE STATE OF MONTANA.

OVER THE PAST TWENTY YEARS I HAVE PERSONALLY LOGGED OVER 1000 HOURS OF SEAPLANE TIME AS PILOT-IN-COMMAND. MOST OF THAT TIME WAS ACCUMULATED WHILE DEMONSTRATING SEAPLANE FLOAT FLYING ACROSS THE NORTH-CENTRAL PART OF THE UNITED STATES, CANADA AND ALASKA.

IN ADDRESSING THIS COMMITTEE I WILL DISCIPLINE MY PRESENTATION TO THE SUBJECT MATTER OF HB #354, "AN ACT ABOLISHING STATE LICENSING OF AIRPORTS AND OTHER AIR NAVIGATION FACILITIES" ALLOWING ONLY THE FOLLOWING OBSERVATION OUTSIDE THAT DISCIPLINE.

"ALL COMPLAINTS RELATED TO THE OPERATION OF AIRCRAFT IN THE AIR, ON THE GROUND, AND ON THE WATER SHOULD BE PROPERLY DIRECTED TO THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION WHERE A PROPER FORUM TO HEAR SUCH COMPLAINTS HAS BEEN LONG ESTABLISHED".

IN ADDRESSING HB #354, I ASSUME EACH MEMBER OF THIS COMMITTEE IS AWARE THAT THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAS DEVELOPED A DYNAMIC SYSTEM CONCERNING AVIATION MATTERS. VOLUMES OF DATA COVERING EVERY PHASE OF AIRCRAFT GROUND SUPPORT FACILITIES WE CALL AIRPORTS AND AIR NAVIGATION FACILITIES ARE CONSTANTLY BEING REVISED AND UPDATED AS NEW NEEDS DICTATE.

THESE VOLUMES OF INFORMATION EMBODY THE STANDARDS WHICH THE FEDERAL AGENCIES INVOLVED IN SCRUTINIZING THE AVIATION INDUSTRY, RELY UPON WHEN EVALUATING ALL AVIATION RELATED ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING THE LICENSING OF AIRPORTS.

THE STATE OF MONTANA ON THE OTHER HAND, HAS NEVER LICENSED AIRPORTS, NOR HAS IT EVER DEVELOPED CRITERIA FOR DOING SO. IN ITS OWN EFFORTS TO CONSTRUCT AND ESTABLISH OR MODIFY AIRPORT FACILITIES, IT TOO MUST COMPLY WITH THE REGULATIONS AS SET FORTH BY THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION AND THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF <sup>TRANSPORTATION</sup> ~~COMMERCE~~. IN THIS CONTEXT, IT WOULD SEEM

THE STATE WOULD BE HARD PRESSED TO ISSUE AIRPORT LICENSES WITH ANY CREDIBILITY, OR EVEN AS A PRACTICAL MATTER.

THIS COMMITTEE CAN WELL SUPPORT THIS BILL TO ABOLISH AIRPORT LICENSING BY THE STATE IN RECOGNIZING THAT:

1. THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION HAS A SPECIAL AND UNIQUE COMPETENCE, PECULIAR ONLY UNTO ITSELF, BY WHICH IT EVALUATES AIRPORTS AND AIR NAVIGATION FACILITIES, AND

2. BECAUSE OF THE SPECIAL SERVICE NEEDS OF AIRCRAFT AND ITS ABILITY TO SPAN LONG DISTANCES, THERE IS A SPECIAL AND UNIQUE NEED FOR NATIONAL UNIFORMITY OF THESE SPECIAL SERVICE NEEDS, AIRPORTS AND AIR NAVIGATION FACILITIES. THESE MUST BE ADDRESSED WITH CONSISTENCY AND WITHOUT CONFUSION. THESE SPECIAL AND UNIQUE NEEDS LEND THEMSELVES TO REGULATION BY AN AGENCY OF FEDERAL NATURE AS OPPOSED TO AN AGENCY OF STATE OR LOCAL NATURE.

THE EXHUMED 40 YEAR OLD STATE LAW PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF AIRPORTS HAS RECENTLY BEEN INVOKED AS THE RESULT OF A LEGAL ACTION TAKEN AGAINST THE MONTANA DEPARTMENT OF

COMMERCE. THE COURT HAS ORDERED THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE TO LICENSE AIRPORTS IN AGREEMENT WITH THIS NEVER-IMPLEMENTED LAW. CONFUSION AND EXPENSE HAVE BEEN THE PRODUCT OF THEIR EFFORTS THUS FAR.

I ENCOURAGE THIS COMMITTEE TO RELIEVE THE MONTANA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE CONFUSING AND FRUITLESS TASK OF LICENSING AIRPORTS AND OTHER AIR NAVIGATION FACILITIES BY REPORTING FAVORABLY ON HB #354.

PLEASE MAKE THIS TESTIMONY A PART OF THE RECORD.






