# MINUTES OF THE MEETING LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE MONTANA STATE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

February 26, 1985

The meeting of the Local Government Committee was called to order by Chairman Paula Darko on February 26, 1985 at noon in the Gallery on the 4th floor of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present with the exception of Rep. Brown and Rep. Sales who were excused.

The purpose of this meeting was to reconsider action on HB 616, which had been tabled on February 14, 1985.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL NO. 616: Rep. Stella Jean Hansen moved to reconsider HB 616, and this was seconded by Rep. Sands. Rep. Hansen then moved to DO PASS HB 616, seconded by Rep. Kitselman.

Rep. Kitselman then moved both sets of amendments, and this was seconded by Rep. Fritz. Lee Heiman, Committee Counsel, explained that the new set of amendments which he passed out included both sets of amendments.

Rep. Sands explained what the amendments were supposed to The language on page 2, lines 2 to 7, apparently was taken from a previous statute and they are alleviated. are going to include counties. On page 2, line 15, "the board of county commissioners in the case of a county" is inserted, and on page 2, line 21, "county" is inserted. On page 3 and 4, the boundaries of a district must comply with applicable zoning regulations and the district may not include areas that are zoned primarily as residential areas. On page 5, lines 7 and 8 make it clear that what they can't do is move all their business functions to the business improvement districts and escape business responsibilities. This is to provide services to the public who uses the businesses. Page 7, lines 19 through line 3 on page 8, the purpose is to eliminate Section 13. It prohibits government body from doing its ordinary government services. Page 8, following line 3, a new section has been inserted. If a business improvement district is created, the local governing body must make sure it has adequate liability insurance to cover it. This amendment will be to provide that the method to be used is only on the value of the improvements.

Rep. Wallin asked if there was time to have the yellow bill printed, and Lee Heiman said he thought so.

Rep. Wallin then said he is most concerned about Section 13 which is deleted, and Rep. Sands asked if he wanted to put

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that section back. Rep. Wallin replied that he thought he did want to put it back. Without this, you would have to take care of your own police. According to this, if we lose what little we have, this could be done.

Rep. Wallin then moved to reinsert Section 13, and this was seconded by Rep. Gilbert. Rep. Kitselman asked who proposed to strike it in the first place, and Rep. Sands replied that he did. However, he could see the reason for Rep. Wallin's concern, as some protection is needed. Question being called for, motion PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Rep. Wallin then made the motion to <u>DO PASS AS AMENDED</u> HB 616 and this was seconded by Rep. Fritz. Question was called for, and motion CARRIED, with Rep. Kitselman and Rep. Pistoria voting "no".

There being no further business before the committee the meeting was adjourned at 12:10 p.m.
