

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE
MONTANA STATE
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

March 31, 1985

The meeting of the Appropriations Committee was called to order by Chairman Bardanouve on March 31, 1985 at 1 p.m. in Room 104 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present except Representative Hand, who was absent.

(Tape 74:B:000)

SENATE BILL 77: "AN ACT CHANGING TO JULY 1 THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING A PROPOSAL FOR ACQUISITION OF PARK PROPERTY PURCHASED WITH INCOME FROM THE COAL TAX PARKS AND CULTURAL TRUST FUND; AMENDING SECTION 23-1-108, MCA."

Representative Waldron is carrying the bill for Senator Jacobson, sponsor of the bill. He gave the committee a handout of testimony by Jim Flynn, Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks (EXHIBIT 1). He said this bill came out of the performance audit of Fish, Wildlife & Parks, which says the present deadline does not allow the division adequate time to evaluate public proposals as recommended. The bill changes the date from December 1 to July 1 for park acquisition proposals.

Proponents: Representative Moore.

Opponents: None.

Discussion:

Representative Thoft (069) said the Legislature does not necessarily adhere to the recommendations, so he thinks the bill is meaningless. Representative Bardanouve said they are just guidelines.

Representative Waldron closed on the bill by supporting the change in the date.

E X E C U T I V E A C T I O N :

Representative Donaldson made a motion that Senate Bill 77 BE CONCURRENT IN. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously. Representative Waldron will carry the bill on the Floor.

HOUSE BILL 165:

Representative Connelly (101) presented amendments to her bill on unannounced inspections of nursing homes (EXHIBIT 2).

Representative Connelly made a motion that the amendments be

accepted. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Connelly presented an additional amendment which was not on the printed amendments, Exhibit 2, as follows:

She made a motion this amendment be accepted. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Connelly made a motion that House Bill 165 As Amended Do Pass. Representative Moore made a substitute motion that House Bill 165 be TABLED. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Bardanouve, Bradley, Connelly, Lory, Manuel, Menahan, Peck, Spaeth and Waldron voting no.

HOUSE BILL 954: "AN ACT CHANGING THE COUNTY BOUNDARY BETWEEN RAVALLI AND MISSOULA COUNTIES IN ORDER TO INCLUDE THE AREA KNOWN AS THE LOLO AREA IN RAVALLI COUNTY; PROVIDING FOR THE APPROVAL OF THE ELECTORS OF BOTH COUNTIES AS REQUIRED BY THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION; PROVIDING FOR COUNTY RECORDS, INDEBTEDNESS, AND TAXATION; AMENDING SECTIONS 16-232 AND 16-243, R.C.M. 1947; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

HOUSE BILL 950: "AN ACT CHANGING THE COUNTY BOUNDARY BETWEEN GRANITE AND MISSOULA COUNTIES IN ORDER TO INCLUDE THE AREA KNOWN AS THE CLINTON AREA IN GRANITE COUNTY; PROVIDING FOR APPROVAL OF THE ELECTORS OF BOTH COUNTIES AS REQUIRED BY THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION; PROVIDING FOR COUNTY RECORDS, INDEBTEDNESS, AND TAXATION; AMENDING SECTIONS 16-220 AND 16-232, R.C.M. 1947; PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

Representative Thomas (229), sponsor of HB 954, asked that both of the above bills be heard at once. Representative Janet Moore is sponsor of HB 950 and she agreed to hear them together.

Representative Thomas presented his bill, as did Janet Moore.

Proponents:

Representative Swift, supports both bills so people can be heard.

Pete Penner, living north of Florence in Missoula County (EXHIBIT 3), supports both bills.

Gary Marbut, Missoula, supports both bills.

Doug Dugger, Missoula, supports both bills (EXHIBIT 4).

Gene Ball, Clinton, supports both bills (EXHIBIT 5).

Elizabeth Friesz, Clinton, supports both bills (EXHIBIT 6).

E. Benson (605), Missoula, supports both bills.

Robert Weyers, Clinton, supports HB 950. He presented a petition signed by approximately 400 residents out of 600 residents asking for the the issue to be put on the ballot (EXHIBIT 7).

Delores Ball, Clinton, supports both bills (EXHIBIT 8).

Robert Boucher, Bonner, supports both bills (EXHIBIT 9).

Julie Hacker (660), Bonner, supports HB 950 (EXHIBIT 10).

Opponents: None.

Discussion:

Representative Menahan (038) asked about the school districts charging for students if students didn't live in the district. Gary Marbut (060) said he talked with the Superintendent of Schools and he said both in terms of money and where children want to attend school there would be no change, but there would be a change in the way the money is handled - a reimbursement from Missoula County to Granite County.

Representative Moore (083) asked how many people want to secede. Gary Marbut said about 2,000.

Representative Bardanouve (094) asked if an area is bonded, would the people moving be obligated for the bonds. Gary Marbut said the bonded liability goes with the land it is bonded on.

Representative Lory (105) said he thinks Mr. Marbut is in error because if students move out of an area, they are no longer a member of the Missoula County High School and it would be up to the Missoula County High School to accept them or not. Representative Peck agreed. Gary Marbut said there are a number of overlapping school districts in Missoula County right now; and although as the Missoula County School District, it is a political jurisdiction under state law that is not necessarily applied to the county, therefore, it can have jurisdictional areas in other places where it is agreed upon.

Representatives Janet Moore and Thomas closed on their bills.

E X E C U T I V E A C T I O N :

Representative Moore (160) made a motion that House Bill 950 Do Pass. Representative Lory made a substitute motion that House Bill 950 be amended from \$1,000 to \$1 to save the General Fund. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Moore (174) made a motion that House Bill 950 As Amended Do Pass.

A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Moore (197) made a motion that House Bill 950 AS AMENDED DO PASS.

Representative Bardanouve (215) asked if all of a person's records are in Missoula County, how are the records for land, etc. transferred. Gary Marbut said he is not sure how this works, but the bill calls for local officials to cooperate in doing this and it has been worked out in the past. Representative Bardanouve was handed Section 72:101 regarding his question, which he read to the committee. He said "I guess you can demand from Missoula County" the transfer of records.

A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representative Spaeth voting no.

Representative Moore (323) made a motion that House Bill 954 carry the same amendments to accomplish the changes made in House Bill 950, as follows:

A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Moore (334) made a motion that House Bill 954 be amended from \$1,000 to \$1 to save the General Fund. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Moore (341) made a motion that House Bill 954 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 270: "AN ACT CREATING A SELECT COMMITTEE ON HEALTH INSURANCE FOR RETIRED PUBLIC EMPLOYEES; DEFINING THE DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE; APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE COMMITTEE'S USE; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

Representative Winslow (374) is carrying the bill for Representative Marks, the sponsor of the bill. He submitted some amendments (EXHIBIT 11).

E X E C U T I V E A C T I O N :

Representative Winslow made a motion that the amendments to House Bill 270 be accepted. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

In response to a committee question, Leo Berry (447) said the purpose of the bill is to evaluate whether or not the state should participate in sharing the costs of health insurance for retired public employees. He said retired employees are allowed to participate in the health insurance plan now, but they pay the full cost of the premium.

Representative Bardanouve (486) asked about Page 4, line 6 of the bill "subpoena witnesses, books, records, and other documents". Leo Berry said he assumes this is standard language for an interim study because the bill was drafted by the Legislative Council. Dr. Lory said he does not think they have authority to subpoena anyone.

Representative Lory (502) made a motion that the bill be amended as follows:

A roll call vote was taken and the motion failed, with Representatives Donaldson, Ernst, Manuel, Menahan, Miller, Moore, Peck, Rehberg, Swift, Thoft and Winslow voting no.

Representative Donaldson (595) made a motion that House Bill 270 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

SENATE BILL 370: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION FOR ELECTED STATE OFFICIALS, MEMBERS OF THE JUDICIARY, LEGISLATORS, THE COMMISSIONER OF POLITICAL PRACTICES, AND MEMBERS OF THE STATE TAX APPEAL BOARD; AMENDING SECTIONS 2-16-405, 3-5-211, 5-2-301, 13-37-106, AND 15-2-102, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE DATES."

Representative Waldron (625) is carrying the bill for Senator VanValkenburg, sponsor of the bill. He introduced the bill.

Judy Ripplingale said the price tag of the bill as it stands now has been calculated by her staff as \$206,000 or \$216,000 for the biennium. It gives Legislators the same raise as if they had been included in the Executive Pay Plan, she said.

Representative Menahan (198) made a motion that Legislators be allowed to return their raises, and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst to write the language to accomplish this. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Representative Moore (214) made a motion to amend the bill as follows:

Representative Waldron (227) made a motion that Senate Bill 370 BE CONCURRED IN. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Bardanouve, Connelly, Ernst, Manuel, Moore, Peck, Rehberg and Swift voting no.

HOUSE BILL 433: Representative Lory (267) made a motion that House Bill 433 be TABLED. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 473:

In response to a question from Representative Donaldson, Gary Curtis said veterans' money, under Veterans' Grants, can only be used for veterans.

E X E C U T I V E A C T I O N :

Representative Lory (389) made a motion that House Bill 473 Be Tabled.

Representative Moore made a substitute motion that House Bill 473 DO PASS. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Bardanouve, Donaldson, Bradley, Connelly, Lory, Manuel and Waldron voting no.

HOUSE BILL 211:

Representative Donaldson made a motion that House Bill 211 DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 212:

Representative Donaldson (696) made a motion that House Bill be amended as follows:

A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Donaldson made a motion that House Bill 212 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 375:

There were amendments proposed to House Bill 375 (EXHIBIT 12).

(Tape 76:A:025)

Mr. Schneider said the amendments reflect the agreements at the bargaining table.

HOUSE BILL 377: "AN ACT FREEZING STATE EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION AND BENEFIT LEVELS AT THE FISCAL YEAR 1985 LEVELS; AMENDING SECTIONS 2-18-301, 2-18-303 THROUGH 2-18-305, 2-18-312 THROUGH 2-18-315, AND 2-18-703, MCA; REPEALING SECTION 2-18-311, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

Representative Moore (084) presented his bill. He said he intends to amend the bill on the Floor to grant some concessions to state employees.

Proponents:

Representative Marks (097) addressed the committee (EXHIBIT 13). He said the result of the bill is a reduction of \$7 million from the Executive budget or a \$5 million reduction in the Governor's budget, depending upon which option is taken.

Opponents:

Tom Schneider said a settlement has been reached and it is now disappointing the settlement is not going to be discussed pertaining to this bill.

Dennis Taylor opposes the bill (EXHIBIT 14).

Representative Moore closed on his bill.

E X E C U T I V E A C T I O N :

Representative Moore (499) made a motion that House Bill 377 Do Pass.

Representative Waldron made a substitute motion that House Bill 377 be TABLED. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Ernst, Moore, Nathe, Swift and Thoft voting no. Representative Hand left a proxy vote of yes.

HOUSE BILL 376:

Representative Lory (645) made a motion that House Bill 376 be TABLED. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 375:

Representative Lory (666) made a motion to accept the amendments to House Bill 375 (in Exhibit 12).

Rod Sundsted explained the amendments.

(Tape 76:B:114)

A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Waldron (115) made a motion that House Bill 375 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Moore, Nathe and Swift voting no.

HOUSE BILL 942:

Representative Winslow made a motion to accept the amendments to House Bill 942. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Winslow made a motion that House Bill 942 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 812: Representative Bradley made a motion that the amendments to the bill be accepted. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried. (Amendments are EXHIBIT 15.)

Representative Bradley made a motion that House Bill 812 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A roll call vote was taken and the motion

carried, with Representatives Donaldson, Ernst, Miller, Nathe, Rehberg, Swift, Thoft, Waldron and Winslow voting no.

HOUSE BILL 943:

Representative Donaldson made a motion that House Bill 943 Do Pass.

Representative Moore made a substitute motion that House Bill 943 be amended as follows:

A motion was made that House Bill 943 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Connelly, Ernst, Lory, Menahan, Miller, Peck and Quilici voting no.

HOUSE BILL 919:

Representative Waldron made a motion that House Bill 919 Do Pass.

Representative Donaldson made a substitute motion that House Bill 919 be amended as follows (EXHIBIT 16). A roll call vote was taken and the motion failed, with Representatives Bardanouve, Bradley, Connelly, Hand, Manuel, Menahan, Peck, Quilici, Spaeth and Waldron voting no. (It was a tie vote.)

Representative Waldron made a motion that House Bill 919 DO PASS. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Moore, Nathe and Swift voting no.

HOUSE BILL 949: A motion was made that House Bill 949 Do Pass.

Representative Peck made a substitute motion that House Bill 949 Do Not Pass. A roll call vote was taken and the motion failed, with 12 members voting no.

The committee requested the votes to be reversed, resulting in the action that House Bill 949 DO PASS.

HOUSE BILL 929: Representative Donaldson (356) made a motion that House Bill 929 be TABLED. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with 8 members voting no and 12 members voting yes.

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HOUSE BILL 165: Representative Connelly (375) made a motion that the committee reconsider its action on House Bill 165. A roll call vote was taken and the motion failed on a tie vote.

HOUSE BILL 909:

Representative Manuel (475) offered amendments to the bill (EXHIBIT 17). He made a motion that the amendments be accepted. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Representative Manuel made a motion that House Bill 909 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 904:

Representative Winslow (559) made a motion that House Bill 904 DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 951: This bill 951, authorizing issuance and sale of bonds to finance construction of certain University System buildings; appropriating proceeds, was assigned to the Long Range Planning subcommittee by Chairman Bardanouve. It will be heard after transmittal, he said.

HOUSE BILL 935:

Representative Waldron made a motion that House Bill 935 DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 946: House Bill 946 was TABLED by a voice vote.

(Tape 77:A:000)

HOUSE BILL 955: Representative Nathe presented the committee with a letter to Gordon Morris, Montana Association of Counties from David Woodgerd, Tax Counsel re: "Applicability of Schwinden v. Burlington Northern", but said his bill will be heard tomorrow. The letter is EXHIBIT 18.

SENATE BILL 195:

Proposed amendments were presented to the committee (EXHIBIT 19).

Representative Donaldson (305) made a motion that the amendments to Senate Bill 195 be accepted. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Bardanouve, Hand, Lory, Moore and Waldron voting no.

Representative Menahan made a motion that Senate Bill 195 As Amended Do Pass. A roll call vote was taken and the motion and the motion failed on a tie vote; therefore, Senate Bill 195 will go to the Floor WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION.

(Tape 77:B:000)

SENATE BILL 361: Representative Moore (067) made a motion that Senate Bill 361 be TABLED. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Connelly, Lory, Menahan, Miller, Peck and Quilici voting no.

Dr. Lory (087) made a motion the committee reconsider its action on Senate Bill 361.

Representative Menahan asked Leo Berry what this bill does for the lower-paid people working for him. Leo Berry said the formula was designed in cooperation with the PERS Board to assist people at the lower end of the scale and the people at the upper end of the retirement scale would receive a smaller increase. He said the Board of Investments have increased the PERS Fund by .14 percent. The bill could be funded at no cost to the state by reducing the \$45 down to \$25 and leaving the employer contribution where it is. Chairman Bardanouve said this would use up the PERS reserves. Leo Berry said the PERS Board has agreed the Fund can be actuarially sound and in compliance with standards if that is done. The Board has given authorization to have this done, he said. Representative Bardanouve said he has heard this same kind of argument and two years later the Legislature is told, "Well, it's running a little bit behind." Leo Berry said the Fund has gone from an unfunded liability of 42 years to 36 years in the last biennium, so there is some cushion and in order to help these people a little bit, the Board felt they were willing to do this as a one-time increase.

A roll call vote was taken and the motion failed, with Representatives Bardanouve, Ernst, Hand, Manuel, Moore, Nathe, Peck, Rehberg, Swift, Thoft and Waldron voting no.

HOUSE BILL 754: Representative Connelly made a motion that House Bill 754 DO PASS. A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Ernst, Hand, Nathe and Swift voting no.

SENATE BILL 315: Representative Donaldson made a motion that Senate Bill 315 be TABLED. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

HOUSE BILL 632: Representative Donaldson made a motion to amend the bill, with the amendments to be written up by the LFA (See Standing Committee Report). A roll call vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representatives Connelly and Menahan voting no.

Representative Donaldson made a motion that House Bill 632 AS AMENDED DO PASS. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried, with Representative Lory voting no.

SENATE BILL 247: Representative Moore made a motion that Senate Bill 247 BE CONCURRED IN. A roll call vote was taken and the

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motion carried, with Representatives Bardanouve and Hand voting no.

SENATE BILL 315: A motion was made that Senate Bill 315 be TABLED. A voice vote was taken and the motion carried.

Adjourn: The meeting adjourned at 7 p.m.

SB 77

Testimony presented by Jim Flynn, Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks

March 25, 1985

The Department of Fish, Wildlife & Parks supports passage of SB 77.

This bill was introduced in response to a recommendation made by the State Legislative Auditor as a result of a performance audit of the Parks Division conducted in 1983. The audit had two recommendations with respect to the Coal Tax Parks Acquisition process. Since both recommendations relate directly to SB 77, I will recap them together with our response.

WE RECOMMEND THE DIVISION REDESIGN THE COAL TAX PARKS ACQUISITION PROPOSAL SUMMARY TO INCLUDE A DIVISION EVALUATION OF EACH PROPOSAL.

Response - Conditionally concur.

Implementation - Based upon experience gained during the three previous legislative sessions, the department is providing the legislature the information it desires in a form which is acceptable to that body. However, the department will be prepared to provide additional evaluation information and make recommendations on proposed sites if the legislature requests it. In the 1985 session we will again discuss with the long-range building committee the form and content of the report we provide to them. We would be happy to make any changes requested by the committee and will be willing to draft legislation to accommodate those changes if it appears to be necessary.

WE RECOMMEND THAT LEGISLATION BE ENACTED TO CHANGE THE COAL TAX PARKS PROPOSAL SUBMITTAL DATE TO JULY 1 OF THE YEAR PRECEDING THE CONVENING OF A LEGISLATIVE SESSION.

Response - Conditionally concur.

Implementation - The department will draft such legislation if requested to do so by the legislature.

~~In summary, if the long-range planning subcommittee wants more information from the department regarding acquisition proposals, the change of the submittal deadline date to July 1 would be very helpful. In fact, even if the legislature is satisfied with our presentations, the change in the deadline would be helpful because proposals are usually incomplete when initially submitted and often take considerable time and effort prior to preparing our report. At the present time we have the month of December to accomplish that, and the additional five months could be put to very good use. Consequently, we support the passage of SB 77.~~

My name is Pete Penner; I live north of Florence in Missoula County. I am here to testify in favor of HB 950 and HB 954, and the appropriations provided for in these bills.

There are numerous reasons for the people of rural Missoula County to be disenchanted with our present administration. We do not fault our Sheriff or Road Departments or object to the basic State health standards, which are a necessity. REGARDING HB 950, Proposed secession of Clinton area from Missoula County and also
REGARDING HB 954, Proposed secession of the Lolo area from Missoula County.
We urge you to vote yes on these two bills, up before this Committee.

There is no mandate in either the United States Constitution or the State of Montana Constitution requiring such a plan as the Missoula Comprehensive Plan. The United States Constitution in its original text prohibits it. The Montana Constitution allows it but in no way mandates it, as we had been led to believe for several years. Our County Attorney cleared this up for us. *Mar. 27, 1985*

The Missoula Comprehensive Plan is a dictatorial rule which was chosen and drafted by 950 people. There are 77,000 people in the county, most of whom reject the Comprehensive Plan. The Constitutions of our nation and our state were designed for the rule of the majority. In four days the Clinton area collected over 400 signatures for secession because of the Comprehensive Plan, ~~more than~~ *near* half the number who drew up the Comprehensive Plan. Our majority collective voices were never heard, nor indeed solicited at the early date of the first draft. Anything of such magnitude (and specifically so dictatorial) should have been put to the vote of the people before those drafters ever began work on such a document. Also, the drafters of the plan ranged either from not working at all to working ^{only} a 40 hr. week, while the farm and ranch community works 84 to 126 hours per week. Now the 950 complain that it was our fault that we did not get involved. First, we trusted our

national and state Constitutions to protect us, which was right and proper in the United States of America. Second, none of us would have dreamed of dictating to our neighbors, and could not believe our neighbors could do such a foul thing to us. *Some planning officials have quit because of this, & are on our side of the fence.*

The U. S. Const. was altogether ignored in the Missoula Comp. Plan, and the State Const. was stretched falsely and severely to cover the actions of our local County Gov't in order to rule over us with an iron hand against our will.

Free enterprise cannot exist in harmony with the Missoula Comprehensive Plan. In the March 28th meeting of the Missoula Planning Board, the Chamber of Commerce and the Association of Realtors announced that they were ^{therefore} against the Comp. Plan of Missoula, each having four speakers present.

It is unthinkable that our County Gov't should enact such exaggerated & radical regulations upon its citizens without first taking the matter to the ballot box. Now some of them call us ignorant, radicals, ungrateful...^{etc, etc} and it is our land that has been all but taken from us. At each Planning Board meeting there is someone who speaks in behalf of the Comp Plan, saying we don't know what is good for us. ^{Should} 950 people ~~can~~ tell 77,000 people what is good for them? And, our hired officials support that view without any consent from us!

After ten years of fighting for recognition, we have chosen to let them have their monstrous brainchild and we have chosen to secede from their midst. It is with deep sorrow that we find this necessary. But, it is necessary.

We, therefore, urge you to liberate us by allowing us to secede to Granite County peaceably. We cannot tolerate their dictatorial rule any longer.

Please vote for HB 950 and 954 affirmatively, and for our appropriations bills to cover part of our costs.

Dear Representative Marks:

As you requested, we have estimated the costs of implementing the pay plans you proposed for the 1987 biennium based on the FTE approved on the House floor for HB 500. Your first alternative involves a payment of \$300 per FTE (which prorates the payment for part-time employees) on December 1 of each year for those who have been employed by the state since at least the preceding July 1. The state's contribution to group insurance benefits would rise \$10 per month per FTE in fiscal 1986 and an additional \$10 per month per FTE in fiscal 1987. According to our calculations, this alternative would cost \$14.9 million for the 1987 biennium, of which \$9.5 million would be general fund. To make these estimates, we used vacancy savings of 2.1 percent. Our FTE totals contain all state employees, including those of the university system and portions of those

employed by the vo-tech centers and community colleges.

Consistent with the intention of the subcommittee dealing with the Department of Institutions' budget, community mental health centers were allowed \$30,000 general fund for the biennium to cover their pay plan costs.

Your second alternative is the same as the first except that each FTE receives \$400, rather than \$300, each December 1

For this alternative, we estimated a cost of \$18.2 million for the 1987 biennium, of which \$11.5 million would be general fund. We estimate that the executive pay plan with amendments proposed through March 28, 1985 would cost \$26.1 million, of which \$16.5 million would be general fund.

Table 1 summarizes the pay plan costs for your two alternatives and the executive proposal.

Dear Mr. Morris:

Pursuant to my telephone conversation with Bev Gibson, I am enclosing a list of counties with the number of financial institutions in the county which have filed refunds. As you can see, refunds have been filed in 46 counties on behalf of 97 different financial institutions.

When I talked to Ms. Gibson, the biggest concern appeared to be Daniels County. As explained in the December 6, 1984 memorandum, which I hope you have received, it appeared that the same situation may have existed in other counties. Upon checking the files further, it now appears that Daniels County is the worst case. In Custer, Richland, and Roosevelt County, all four years were in effect refunded, but in those cases the refunds were offset against the 1983 tax liability and no actual money was returned to the financial institutions. In Treasure County, the schedule was submitted without the total amounts filled in and thus was treated as a refund claim for only two years. At this time, it appears that these are the only counties with the situation described in the postscript. However, new situations and problems are bound to crop up as time goes on.
