MINUTES OF THE MEETING HUMAN SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE MONTANA STATE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

January 16, 1985

The meeting of the Human Services Subcommittee was called to order by Chairman Cal Winslow on January 16, 1985 at 8:10 a.m. in Room 108 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present.

Chairman Winslow said there will be executive action taken in today's meeting on both the Management Services Division and Health Services Division of DHES.

For clarification before executive action is taken, Peter Blouke (9:B:016) from the LFA discussed the vacancy savings, inflation factor, and rent in both budgets.

Chairman Winslow made a point of clarification to all the motions to adopt funding with a specific dollar amount. It was the intent of the subcommittee that when they adopt the LFA or executive budget, it was the funding mix or funding scheme, and not the actual dollar amount that was adopted.

EXECUTIVE ACTION

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES

(Management Services Division)

Administration Bureau (EXHIBIT 1)

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level request of nine FTE.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for personal services of \$185,660 for FY86 and \$185,787 for FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for the operating expenses of \$45,867 in FY86 and \$49,318 for FY87.

The motion PASSED.

HUMAN SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE January 16, 1985 Page Two

JanDee May from the Office of Budget & Program Planning pointed out the executive budget did not include the legal bureau reorganization.

Chairman Winlsow made a motion to accept the executive proposal for reorganization of the legal bureau.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for equipment of \$8,400 in FY86 and 0 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for funding of \$239,927 in FY86 and \$235,105 in FY87.

There was some discussion in the difference in the Lab Division and Water Test fees, and the handling fees.

Representative Bradley made a substitute motion to accept the executive budget request of \$240,803 in FY86 and \$235,366 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Microbiology Laboratory (EXHIBIT 2)

Representative Rehberg (10:A:223) made a motion to accept the LFA current level request of nine FTE.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for personal services of \$234,096 in FY86 and \$234,428 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for operating expenses of \$93,883 in FY86 and \$98,202 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the executive budget request for equipment of \$7,000 in FY86 and 0 in FY87.

Discussion followed concerning the difference of \$400

from the LFA and executive budgets.

Representative Rehberg made a substitute motion to accept the LFA current level for equipment of \$7,400 in FY86 and 0 in FY87.

For clarification, the substitute motion does include the two specific pieces; the Bright Light microscope and the CO₂ incubator.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the executive budget request for funding of \$332,368 in FY86 and \$326,283 in FY87.

Discussion followed concerning the removal of the Water Test fees from the funding in Administration Bureau.

Senator Manning made a substitute motion to accept the LFA current level request for funding of \$335,379 in FY86 and \$332,630 in FY87.

The motion FAILED.

Senator Christiaens made a motion to accept the executive budget request for funding of \$332,368 in FY86 and \$326,283 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

(Microbiology Laboratory Modified Level) (EXHIBIT 3)

The Clinical Bureau would be reduced by the amount of funds that are for PKU level testing for FY86 and FY87 within the LFA current level.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the modified level appropriation for the Microbiology Laboratory of \$167,150 in FY86 and \$75,973 in FY87 with the understanding that there will be no additional general funds appropriated in and after FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Chemistry Lab (EXHIBIT 4)

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level request of six FTE.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg (10:B:005) made a motion to accept the LFA current level for personal services of \$166,097 in FY86 and \$166,565 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for operating expenses of \$81,539 in FY86 and \$85,422 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

In taking executive action on the equipment, Chairman Winslow pointed out that the turbidimeter and calculator were removed from the LFA budget.

John Hawthorne (10:B:031), chief of the Chemistry Laboratory Bureau, discussed the turbidimeter and calculator and explained the functions and necessities of these two items.

A question was asked if there was any depreciation scale for these two items.

Representative Bradley made a motion to accept the executive budget request for equipment of \$37,500 in FY86 and 0 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the executive budget request for funding of \$284,725 in FY86 and \$248,076 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Data Processing Section (EXHIBIT 5)

Senator Manning made a motion to accept the executive budget request of one FTE in both FY86 and FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for personal services of \$24,019 in FY86 and \$24,028 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for operating expenses of \$9,033 in FY86 and \$9,537 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the executive request for equipment of \$3,100 in FY86 and 0 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Senator Manning made a motion to accept the executive request for funding of \$36,422 in FY86 and \$33,386 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Chairman Winslow discussed the two spread sheets that Peter Blouke gave every member of the committee (EXHIBITS 5&6). He also told everyone the changes he made concerning the grants to counties, Handicapped Children Services, and the mouthrinse program.

(Health Services Division)

Dental Bureau (EXHIBIT 8)

Representative Rehberg (10:B:269) made a motion to accept the reorganizational plan of DHES for creation of an administrative bureau within the Health Services Division.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the current executive request of 2.4 FTE in both FY86 and FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Senator Manning made a motion to accept the executive request for personal services of \$89,391 in FY86 and \$89,624 in FY87.

Senator Christiaens made a point that it would be more appropriate to go with the LFA current level for personal services because that level deletes .5 FTE.

Representative Rehberg made a substitute motion to accept the LFA current level for personal services of \$75,405 in FY86 and \$75,630 in FY87.

The motion PASSED with Senator Manning voting NO.

Discussion followed requesting clarification of the 2.4 FTE just acted upon previously. It was the intent of the committee to accept the 2.4 FTE level and adjust the LFA personal services to include these positions.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for operating expenses of \$24,260 in FY86 and \$25,194 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Discussion followed concerning the operating expense issues of the executive containing \$900 more in clinics and photographic services, and \$1,000 more in freight charges than does the LFA in the dental program.

Representative Bradley made a motion to accept the \$900 above the current LFA level for the dental program.

The motion PASSED with Representative Winslow voting NO.

Senator Manning (11:A:084) made a motion to accept the executive request for grants of \$26,495 in FY86 and \$23,488 in FY87.

ROLL CALL VOTE

Request for a Roll Call Vote was made (11:A:099). The motion FAILED with Senators Christiaens and Story and Representatives Bradley, Rehberg, and Winslow voting NO and Senator Manning voting YES.

Representative Rehberg Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for funding of \$67,640 in FY86 and \$68,273 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the executive request for the Preventive Health Block Grant of \$75,922 in FY86 and \$73,113 in FY87. This motion is made with the understanding that it can be adjusted at a later date.

The motion PASSED with Senator Story and Representative Rehberg voting NO.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept taking \$15,000 out of the Maternal-Child Health Block Grant in FY86 and taking \$15,000 out of the Preventive Health Block Grant in FY87 instead of taking the total of \$30,000 out of the MCH Block Grant in FY86 and 0 in FY87 for the Modified Mouthrinse Program.

A question was directed at the reasoning for this change; it is an attempt to free up some funds to be used for additional funds for the county.

The motion PASSED.

Discussion followed concerning the issue of \$1,000 for freight and shipping; it could come out of the \$30,000 or it could be funded otherwise. If those freight fees could be included in the \$30,000, it could be taken care of.

Representative Rehberg made a motion that the amount for freight and shipping for the Mouthrinse Program be taken from the \$30,000 previously appropriated.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the modified proposal for the Health Risk Appraisal/Beha-vioral Risk Surveillance (EXHIBIT 9) of \$12,000 for FY86. The motion includes the understanding that is is for one year and no general funds will ever be expected to be appropriated.

The motion PASSED.

Nursing Bureau (EXHIBIT 10)

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level of 15 FTE in boty FY86 and FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for personal services of \$416,938 in FY86 and \$417,386 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for operating expenses of \$279,117 in FY86 and \$290,656 in FY87.

Discussion followed concerning the \$14,000 difference between the LFA and executive in FY87 for operating expenses; it is strictly inflation.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for equipment of \$1,500 in FY86 and \$1,000 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the executive request for funding of \$1,512,042 in FY86 and \$1,513,830 in FY87. The motion includes the requirement that 20 percent of all personal services and travel costs in childhood immunization program will be general funded. LFA has \$5,173 less in general fund in FY86 and \$7,627 less in FY87 than the 20 percent level.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for grants of \$818,964 in FY86 and \$818,964 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the appropriation of 2 FTE in each FY86 and FY87 for the modified level for the enhancement of the nursing staff. The total budget shall reflect those changes. The 2 FTE is for one consultant and one clerical.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the Family Planning modification of \$11,649 in FY86 and \$11,653 in FY87. For clarification, the motion approved .5 FTE.

The motion PASSED.

Chairman Winslow (11:A:462) commented on the Family Planning discussions this committee has had. His intent on bringing that up was to address those issues he felt would have impact on the health department; he clarified that he did not bring it up to be an emotional issue.

Clinical Bureau (EXHIBIT 11)

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for 16.5 FTE in FY86 and FY87.

The motion PASSED.

HUMAN SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE January 16, 1985 Page Nine

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for personal services of \$411,561 in FY86 and \$412,400 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Senator Story made a motion to accept the \$66,000 for the newborn transport service that is not included in the LFA current level for Handicapped Children's Service's expenses for FY86 and FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the executive request for operating expenses in the Clinical Bureau Administration of \$101,224 in FY86 and \$101,907 in FY87 with the understanding that these figures can be adjusted for legal and PKU testing.

Representative Bradley made a substitute motion to accept the LFA current level for operating expenses in the Clinical Bureau Administration of \$112,705 in FY86 and \$118,200 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg (11:A:007) made a motion to accept the LFA current level for operating expenses in Tumor Registry of \$19,830 in FY86 and \$20,975 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Senator Christiaens made a motion to include the \$1,000 in FY87 within contracted services for publication of the biennial report on cancer data which is not included in the current level.

The motion PASSED.

The executive contains \$5,346 in FY86 and \$105,024 in FY87 over current level for medical services under the Handi-capped Children's Service. There was a question as to why the \$100,000 increase in FY87. It is for increased costs of medical payment and hospitalization.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for operating expenses in Handicapped Children's Services of \$667,385 in FY86 and \$698,797 in FY87.

The motion PASSED

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for equipment of \$16,507 in FY86 and 0 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the executive request for grants of \$2,905,338 in FY86 and \$2,905,338 in FY87.

The difference in the grants from LFA to executive is due to where these funds would be allocated from. The current level has retained grants to counties within this bureau and the executive has transferred grants to counties to the Director's Division.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the LFA current level for funding of \$9,074,018 in FY86 and \$9,104,139 in FY87 with the understanding that if additional monies do come in, that they can be put into the appropriate areas.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the Perinatal Program's modified level of \$204,599 in FY86 and \$220,819 in FY87.

The motion PASSED with Senator Story voting NO.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the Cleft Palate's modified level of \$52,500 in FY86 and \$52,500 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the Women, Infants and Children's modified level of \$818,399 in FY86 and \$818,419 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

Representative Rehberg made a motion to accept the Child Nutrition Administration's modified level of \$213,805 in FY86 and \$213,811 in FY87.

The motion PASSED.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 a.m.
