

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
HUMAN SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE
MONTANA STATE
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

January 25, 1985

The meeting of the Human Services Subcommittee was called to order by Chairman Cal Winslow on January 25, 1985 at 8:05 a.m. in Room 108 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present.

Chairman Winslow announced that there is a tour going to Boulder on Saturday, February 16, so the committee would not take executive action on that date.

Assistance Payments program

Jack Ellery, administrator of the Economic Assistance Division of SRS, discussed the assistance payments program, and also the AFDC program. He gave everyone on the committee statistical reports for FY84 and for October 1984 (EXHIBITS 1 & 2). He also gave everyone an eligibility pamphlet for the AFDC program (EXHIBIT 3). The assistance payments program directs the administration and support of the AFDC program, LIEAP, general assistance, state medical program, weatherization, community services block grant (CSBG), food distribution, food stamps. It currently has 47.5 FTE and operating expenses in FY84 of \$2.8 million. They are requesting 2 additional staff. They are requesting a slight increase over the executive budget (EXHIBIT 4). He also listed the staff within the division and their duties:

- 1) Field services staff
- 2) Eligibility policy staff
- 3) Energy assistance staff
- 4) Food distribution staff
- 5) Management operations staff

Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC)

The AFDC program is an entitlement program; all people who meet the eligibility requirements are entitled to receive those services. He then went over an eligibility scenario with the committee using information he provided (EXHIBIT 5).

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The need to receive AFDC benefits is based on several criteria and must be met as conditions of eligibility. Those conditions: (23:B:120)

- 1) Having at least 1 child living with a parent, or someone blood-related, who is under 18, or 19 if that individual is a full-time student;
- 2) Child must be deprived of parental support;
- 3) Family head must be a U.S. citizen and resident of county in which the application is taken;
- 4) Must apply for a Social Security number;
- 5) Applicants must assign any rights to child support payments to the state;
- 6) Must meet established income and resource limits.

AFDC also provides incentive opportunities: The Work Incentive program (WIN). The WIN program provides people with employment, training, and allows for public service participation. He then discussed EXHIBIT 5 using, as an example, a divorced mother of two.

There was discussion during the presentation on an absent parent and the child support payments being turned over to the state. Chairman Winslow asked if there was any way there could be some enforcement for an absent father not paying for child health insurance.

Senator Story (23:B:398) asked what the average AFDC payment per month is; it is \$305 per month in FY84.

Jack Ellery pointed out that throughout the state, parents who are not needed in the home to take care of young children, are required to participate in a jobs training program; the work incentive program.

Representative Rehberg (23:B:481) asked about a mother with four kids that wants to go part-time to school; he asked if she would qualify. He wondered why she wouldn't qualify if she wanted to better herself. He was told that generally people in her situation wouldn't qualify; the program does not include going to school.

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Jack Ellery then discussed the funding of the assistance payments program and its expenditures. He referred to the six charts included in EXHIBIT 6. (23:B:553)

He said there will be cost savings of approximately \$490,000 due to the revision of numbers.

His concerns regarding the proposed budgets: (24:A:015)

- 1) The executive maintains the current level at 47.5 percent of poverty; the LFA current level maintains poverty at 51 percent. The department has a modified request to bring the AFDC payment level up to 51 percent.
- 2) The impact of the Deficit Reduction Act of 1984 (DEFRA) for Medicaid.

He listed the number of cases added in the last three months of 1984 in relation to the impact DEFRA has over AFDC and Medicaid:

October	21 cases)
November	27 cases)--DEFRA impact on AFDC
December	32 cases)

October	54 cases)
November	66 cases)--DEFRA impact on Medicaid
December	88 cases)

Chairman Winslow asked Jack Ellery if he knows of any legislation being proposed that would affect AFDC. Chairman Winslow asked Peter Blouke if he would get copies of those bills affecting AFDC.

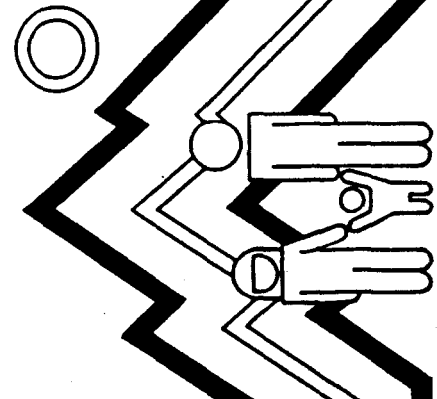

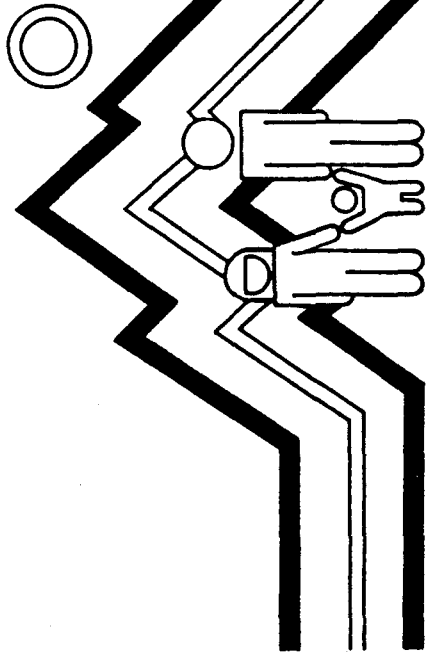

FOOD STAMPS STATE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE, 1984

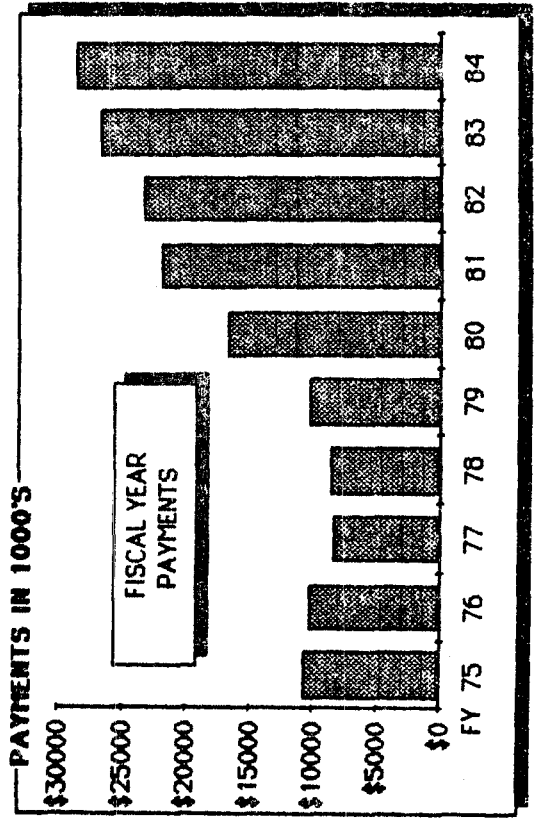
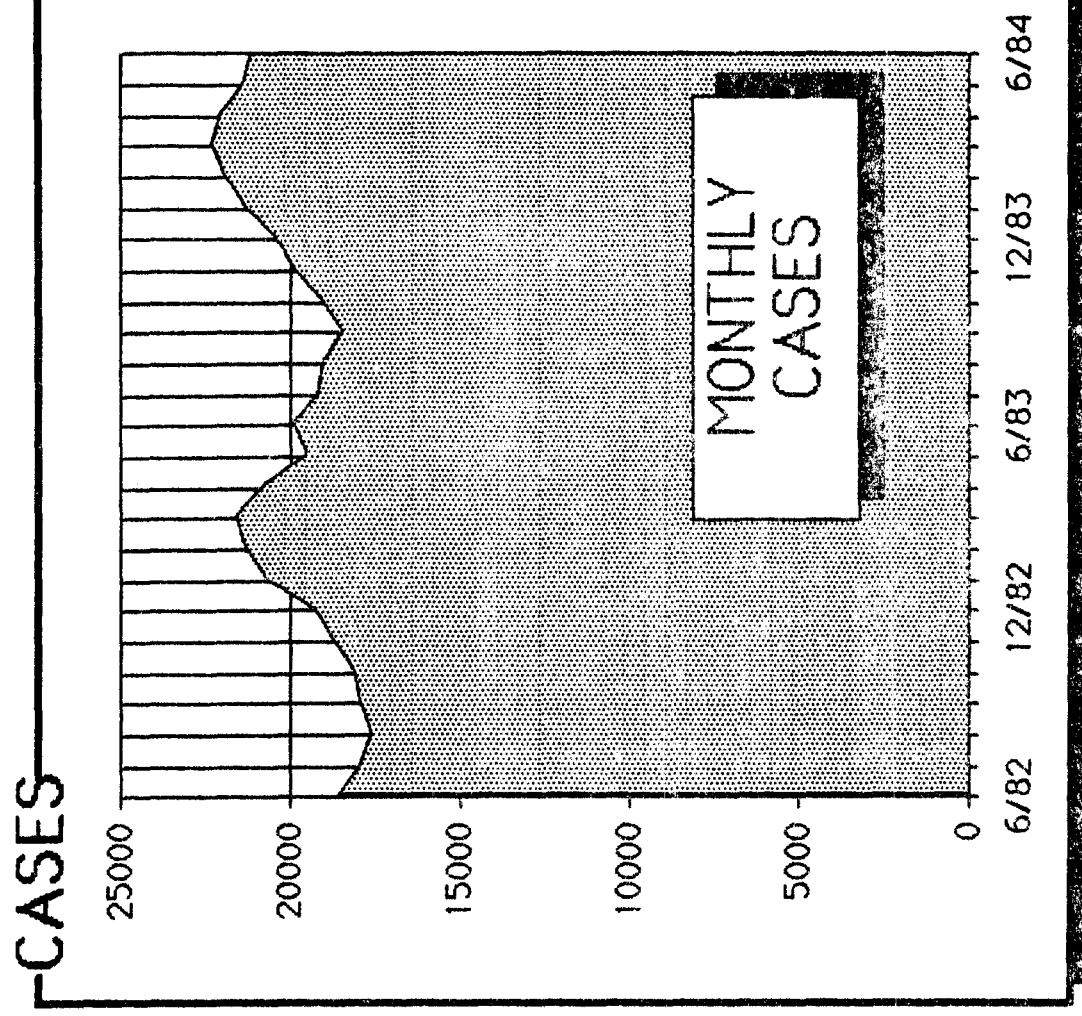
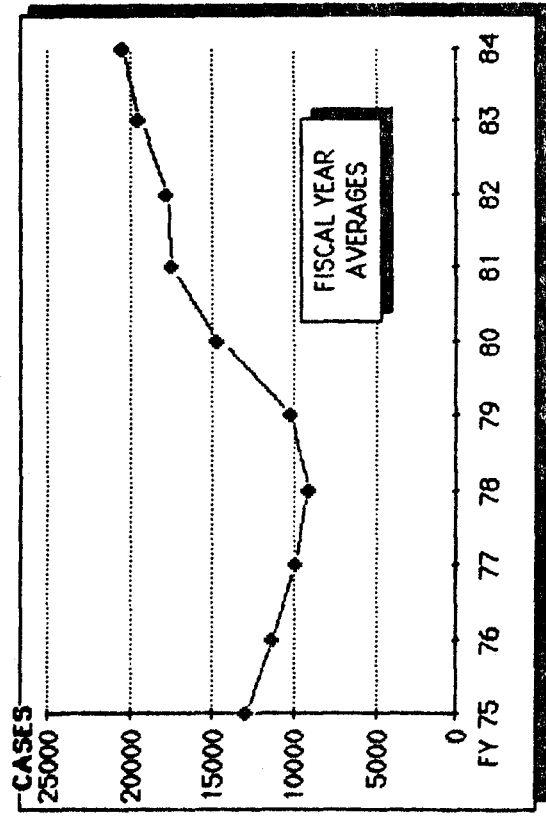

AVERAGE MONTHLY PAYMENT PER CASE



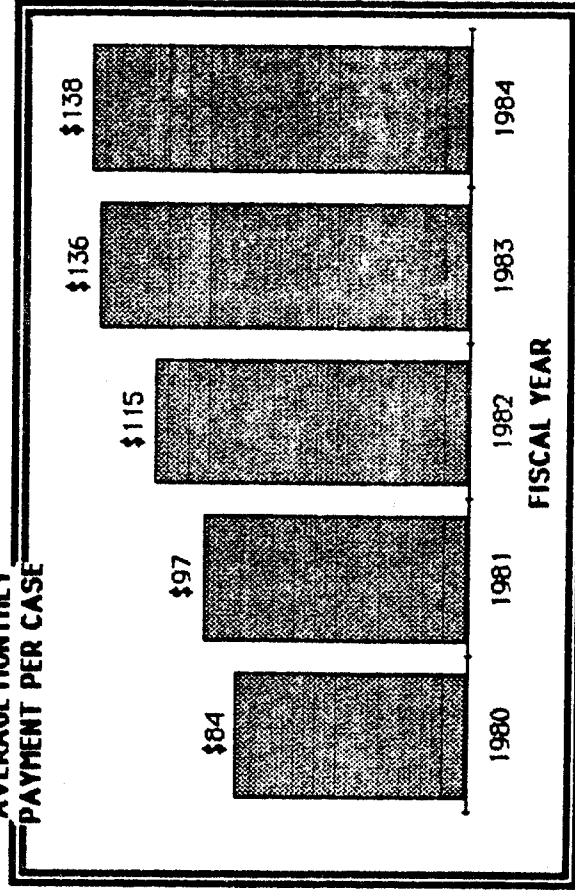

EXPLANATION OF TABLES 9 AND 10

THE WIN PROGRAM IS A BI-AGENCY EFFORT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL AND REHABILITATION SERVICES (SRS) AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY TO REDUCE WELFARE DEPENDENCY BY ASSISTING AFDC RECIPIENTS TO BECOME SELF-SUFFICIENT. IT IS ADMINISTERED BY THE COMMUNITY SERVICES DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF SRS.

AFTER APPLYING FOR AFDC THROUGH THE ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF SRS, APPLICANTS ARE REGISTERED FOR EMPLOYMENT THROUGH THE JOB SERVICE. THE SRS SOCIAL WORKER LOCATED AT THE JOB SERVICE OFFICE MAY ARRANGE FOR AND PROVIDE SUPPORTIVE SERVICE THAT ASSISTS THE CLIENTS IN EMPLOYMENT AND REMOVES THEM FROM AFDC.

THE FIGURES ON TABLES 9 AND 10 REFLECT ACTIVITY THAT OCCURRED IN THE WIN PROGRAM OFFICES LISTED. THEY DO NOT INCLUDE CASELOADS, WELFARE SAVINGS, OR SERVICES PROVIDED BY COUNTY BASED SOCIAL WORKERS.

CASES OPENED: CASES WHICH HAVE BEEN APPRAISED TO DETERMINE WHICH SUPPORTIVE SERVICES MAY BE NECESSARY FOR THE APPLICANTS TO BE PLACED INTO EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING.

CASES CERTIFIED W/SERVICES: OPEN CASES WHICH HAVE HAD SUPPORTIVE SERVICES ARRANGED OR MADE AVAILABLE.
INDIVIDUALS EMPLOYED: INDIVIDUALS ENTERING WIN EMPLOYMENT WITH EARNINGS; INDIVIDUALS HIRED IN ON-THE-JOB TRAINING POSITIONS WITH EARNINGS; AND INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE APPLIED FOR AFDC, BUT BECAUSE OF THE EFFORTS OF WIN PERSONNEL ARE PLACED IN EMPLOYMENT BEFORE THE AFDC GRANT IS APPROVED.

INDIVIDUALS SANCTIONED: THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS WHO, AFTER RECEIVING A HEARING, HAVE HAD THEIR AFDC GRANTS REDUCED BECAUSE THEY WERE NOT ADHERING TO WIN STANDARDS.

WELFARE SAVINGS: THE AMOUNT OF AFDC GRANT DOLLARS SAVED OR REDUCED DUE TO EMPLOYMENT EARNINGS. THE FIGURES IN THE WELFARE SAVINGS COLUMNS REFLECT THE FIRST MONTH'S SAVINGS FOR EACH CASE, ALTHOUGH IN ACTUALITY THE STATE REALIZES SAVINGS EACH MONTH THE WAGE EARNER RECEIVES EARNINGS.

MEDICAL EXAM: A PHYSICAL OR MENTAL DIAGNOSTIC SERVICE NECESSARY TO DETERMINE ANY LIMITATIONS TO EMPLOYMENT.
HOME AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT: A SERVICE OF INSTRUCTION IN HOME MAINTENANCE AND CARE INCLUDING FOOD PREPARATION, NUTRITION, FAMILY LIFE, BUDGETING AND CONSUMER EDUCATION.

HOUSING IMPROVEMENT: THE SERVICE REQUIRED TO ASSURE THAT THE REGISTRANT MAY LIVE IN, OR CONTINUE TO LIVE IN ADEQUATE, SAFE, FINANCIALLY FEASIBLE AND SANITARY HOUSING.

TRANSPORTATION: THE SERVICES REQUIRED TO TRAVEL TO AND FROM NEEDED SOCIAL SERVICES.

EMERGENCY INTERVENTION: THE SERVICES REQUIRED WHEN THERE IS A BREAKDOWN IN THE NORMAL STRUCTURE OF A REGISTRANT'S LIFE AND WHICH ARE REQUIRED TO RE-ESTABLISH THE REGISTRANT'S NORMAL FUNCTIONING.

CHILD CARE: THE SERVICES WHICH PROVIDE FOR THE PHYSICAL WELL BEING AND SAFETY OF CHILDREN AND WHICH PROMOTE THEIR PHYSICAL, MENTAL AND SOCIAL CAPABILITIES. SERVICES ARE PROVIDED BY DAY CARE CENTERS, FAMILY AND GROUP HOME DAY CARE PROVIDERS OR IN-HOME PROVIDERS.

REMEDIAL/DENTAL: THE SERVICES OF ARRANGING OR PROVIDING FOR MEDICAL OR DENTAL TREATMENT RELATING TO EMPLOYABILITY SO THAT THE RECIPIENT'S TRAINING OR WORK PROGRAM IS NOT UNDULY DELAYED.

VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION: THOSE SERVICES AND GOODS NECESSARY FOR AN INDIVIDUAL WITH PHYSICAL OR MENTAL BARRIERS TO BE RENDERED EMPLOYABLE, INCLUDING REFERRAL TO THE VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION AGENCY.

HOMEMAKER SERVICES: THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY TRAINED AND SUPERVISED HOMEMAKER TO THE RECIPIENT IN THE RECIPIENT'S HOME FOR THE PURPOSE OF STRENGTHENING THE FUNCTIONING OF THE FAMILY AND ASSESSING THAT EMERGENCY BARRIERS TO EMPLOYMENT WILL NOT BE INCURRED.

FAMILY PLANNING: THE SERVICES UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A PHYSICIAN NECESSARY TO ENABLE INDIVIDUALS TO VOLUNTARILY CONTROL FAMILY SIZE AND SPACING OF CHILDREN.

COUNSELING: A SERVICE BETWEEN THE REGISTRANT OR A MEMBER OF THE FAMILY AND THE TRAINED STAFF DESIGNED TO UNCOVER AND RESOLVE PERSONAL PROBLEMS RELATING TO WORK.

THE STATE TOTAL OF HEAT ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS DOES NOT EQUAL THE SUM OF THE COUNTY HEAT ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS. THE STATE TOTAL OF HEAT ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS EQUALS THE TOTAL HEAT ASSISTANCE CHECKS WRITTEN MINUS REFUNDS THE STATE RECEIVED FROM VENDORS. THE PAYMENTS ARE STILL SLIGHTLY HIGH BECAUSE SOME CHECK CANCELLATIONS ARE NOT ACCOUNTED FOR. FY84 REFUNDS RECEIVED AFTER JULY 1984 ARE NOT INCLUDED IN THE STATE TOTAL FIGURE.

HANDICAPPED CASES: THOSE CASES WITH AT LEAST ONE HANDICAPPED PERSON IN THE HOUSEHOLD. SENIOR CIT. CASES: THOSE CASES WITH AT LEAST ONE PERSON WHO IS OVER 59 YEARS OF AGE IN THE HOUSEHOLD.

HEAT ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS: HEAT ASSISTANCE DOLLARS SPENT DURING REPORT PERIOD.

HEAT ASSISTANCE OBLIGATIONS: THE TOTAL HEAT ASSISTANCE DOLLARS OBLIGATED FOR CURRENT CASES.

WEATHERIZATION REQUESTS: THE NUMBER OF REQUESTS FOR ASSISTANCE UNDER THE WEATHERIZATION PROGRAM.

EXPLANATION OF PROGRAMS

AID TO FAMILIES WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN (AFDC): Monthly grants to provide day-to-day requirements of low income children in need because of the absence or incapacitation of a parent.

FOOD STAMPS: This program supplements the food costs of low income households with food stamps that are redeemable for groceries. This data is reported by household (case), recipient, and amount. There are two kinds of assistance: Public Assistance -- households receiving food stamps in addition to AFDC or General Assistance. Non-Assistance -- households receiving food stamps only.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE, COUNTY MEDICAL, TRANSIENT RELIEF, BURIALS: Various types of temporary assistance for persons in need who do not qualify for Federally assisted programs.

LOW INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE: Direct payment to fuel vendors for heating on behalf of low income families and senior citizens. The heating season spans from October 1 through April 30.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE: Payment of medical costs for AFDC and SSI individuals and families, and for others who qualify. Each person is counted as a case.

SOCIAL SERVICES: Services provided by county-based workers such as adoption, day care, foster care, homemaker services, protective services, adult and child, WIN services and counseling, health services, case management, institutional placement and counseling.

VISUAL SERVICES: Evaluation, counseling, training, medical treatment, orientation and mobility services, and special low-vision aides to assist the visually impaired become as independent as possible.

VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION: Evaluation, counseling, training, and medical treatment of people 16 years of age and older to assist entry or re-entry into the job market.

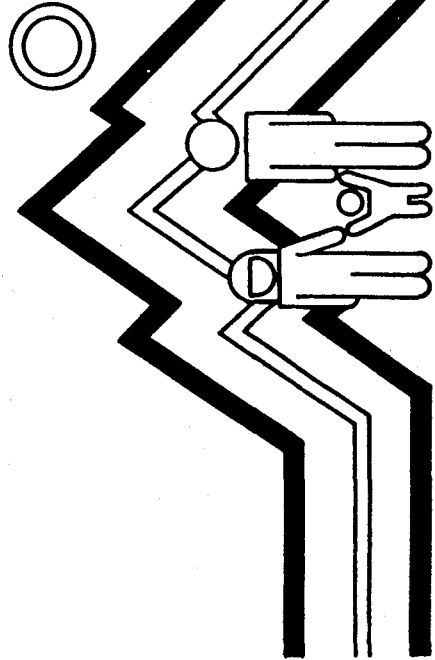
WEATHERIZATION: Services to insulate and make weather-tight the homes of low income families and individuals.

WIN: The WIN program is a bi-agency effort between the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services and the Department of Labor and Industry to reduce welfare dependency by arranging for and providing supportive services that assist AFDC clients in employment.

FOOD STAMPS OCTOBER, 1984

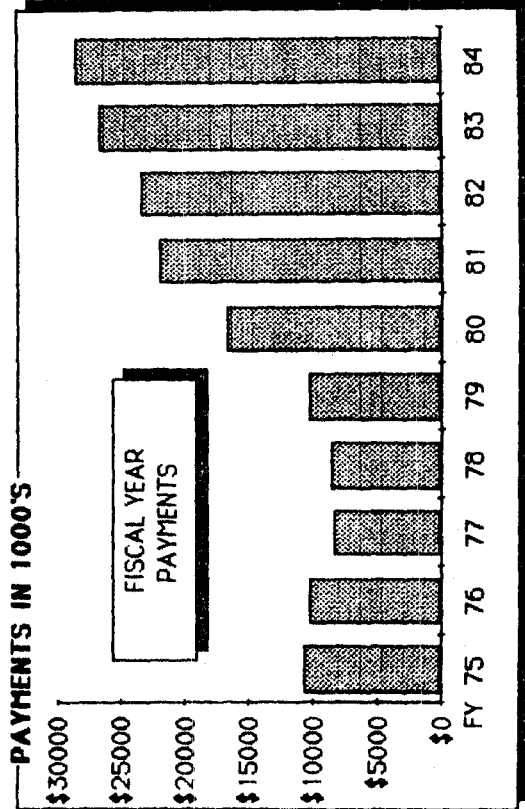
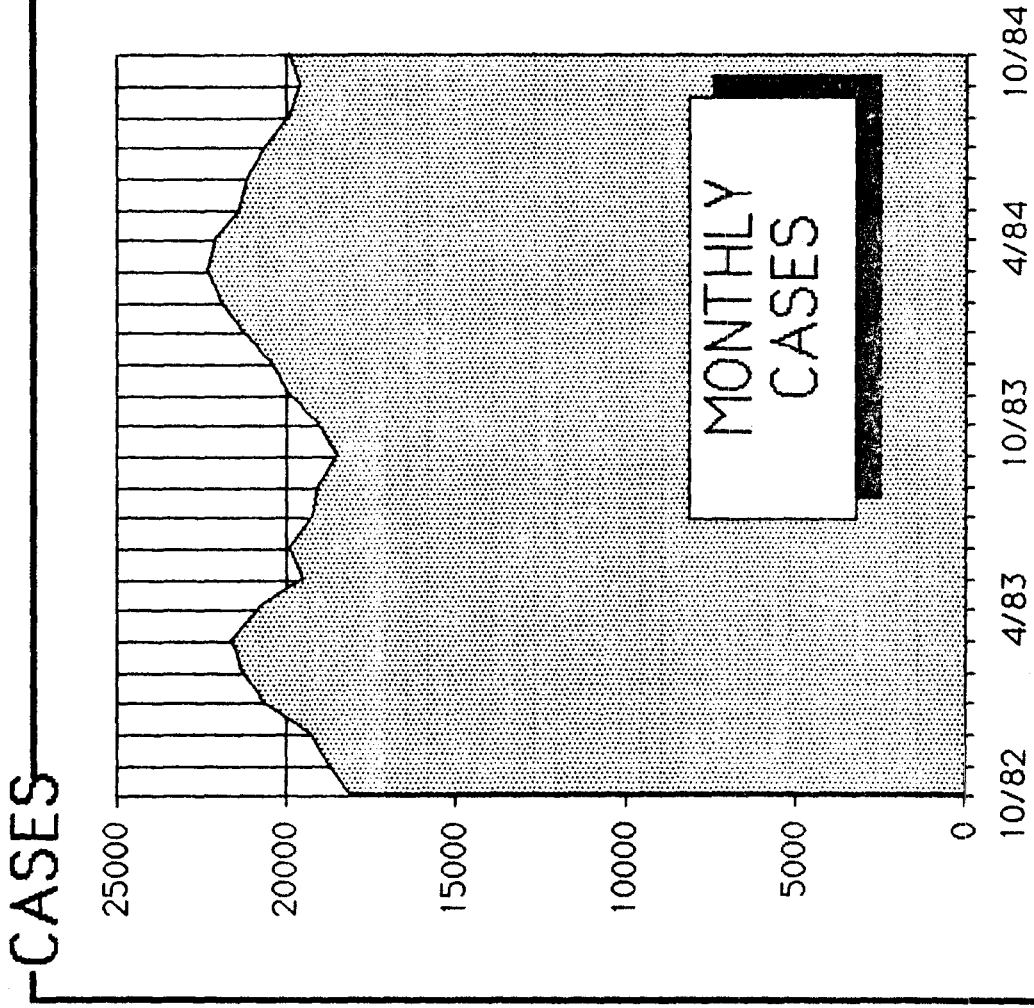
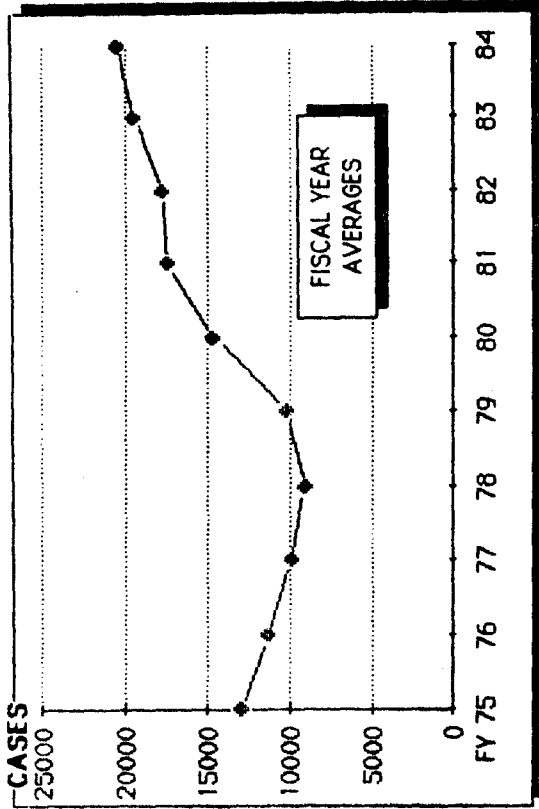

EXPLANATION OF PROGRAMSAid To Families With Dependent Children (AFDC)

Monthly grants to provide day-to-day requirements of low income children in need because of the absence or incapacitation of a parent.

Food Stamps

This program supplements the food costs of low income households with food stamps that are redeemable for groceries. This data is reported by household (case), recipient, and amount. There are two kinds of assistance:

- Public Assistance -- households receiving food stamps in addition to AFDC or General Assistance.
- Non-Assistance -- households receiving food stamps only.

General Assistance, County Medical, Transient Relief, Burials

Various types of temporary assistance for persons in need who do not qualify for Federally assisted programs. These are county-operated programs.

Low Income Energy Assistance

Direct payment to fuel vendors for heating on behalf of low income families and senior citizens. The heating season spans from October 1 through April 30.

Medical Assistance

Payment of medical costs for AFDC and SSI individuals and families, and for others who qualify. Each person is counted as a case.

Social Services

Services provided by county based workers such as adoption, day care, foster care, homemaker services, protective services, adult & child, WIN services and counseling, health services, case management, institutional placement and counseling.

Visual Services

Evaluation, counseling, training, medical treatment, orientation and mobility services, and special low-vision aides to assist the visually impaired become as independent as possible.

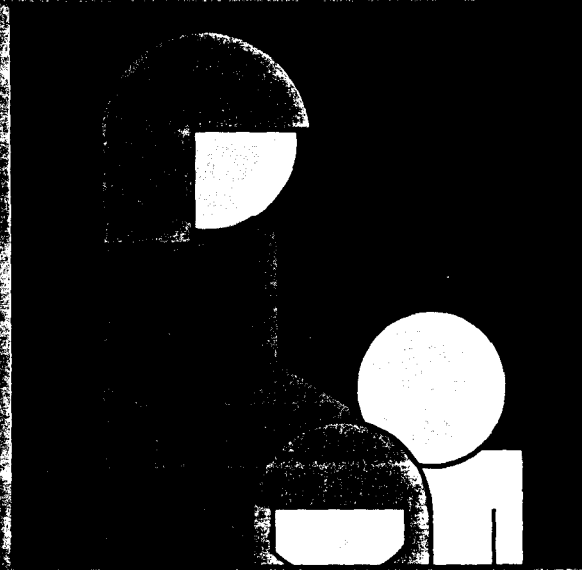
Vocational Rehabilitation

Evaluation, counseling, training, and medical treatment of people 16 years of age and older to assist entry or reentry into the job market.

Weatherization

Services to insulate and make weather-tight the homes of low income families and individuals.

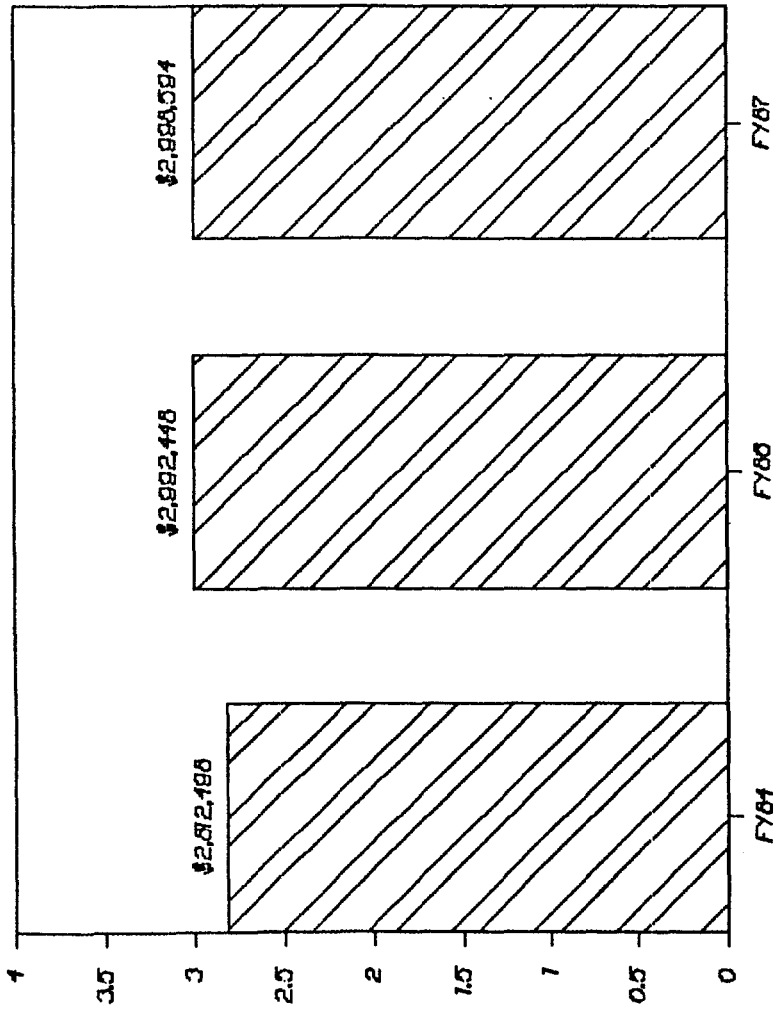

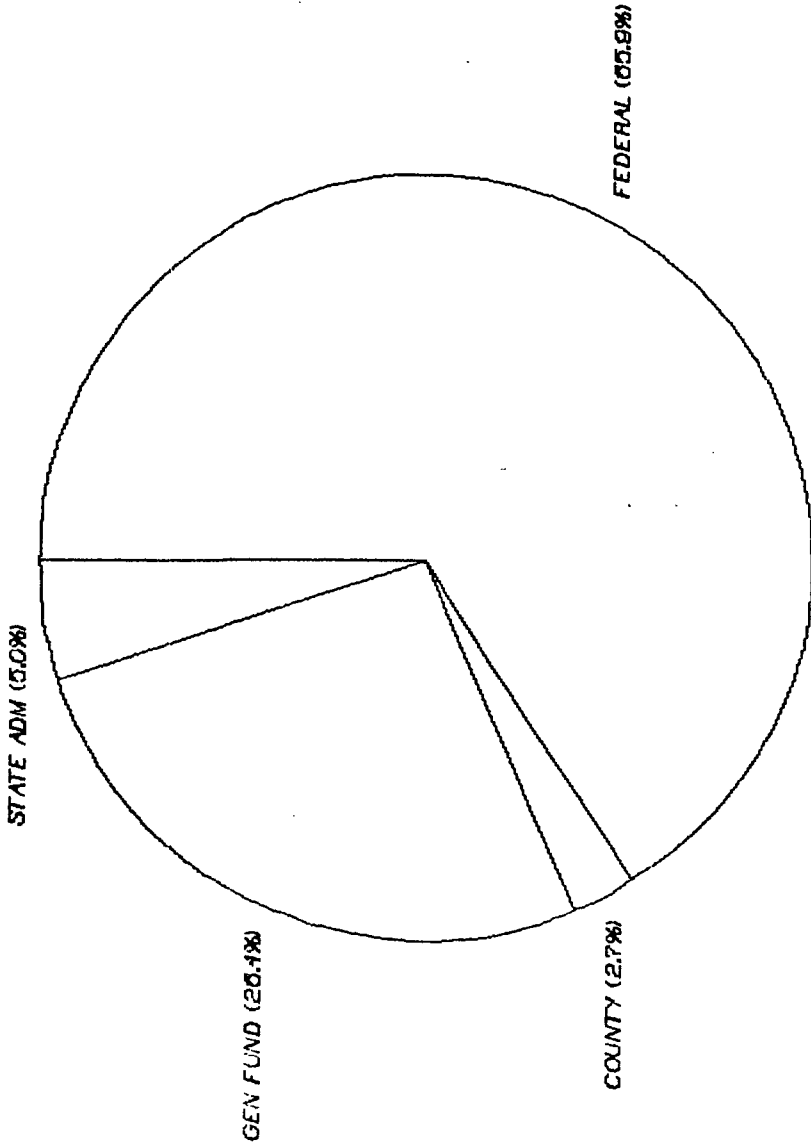

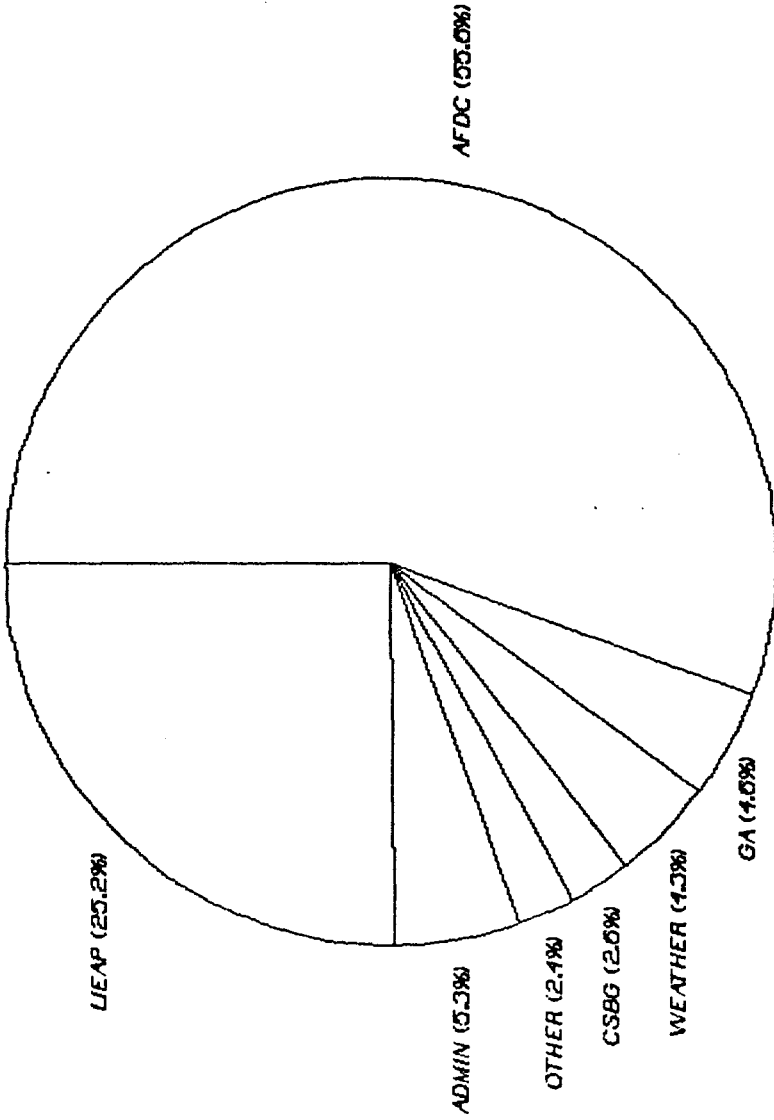

FOR THE 67 BIENNIUM

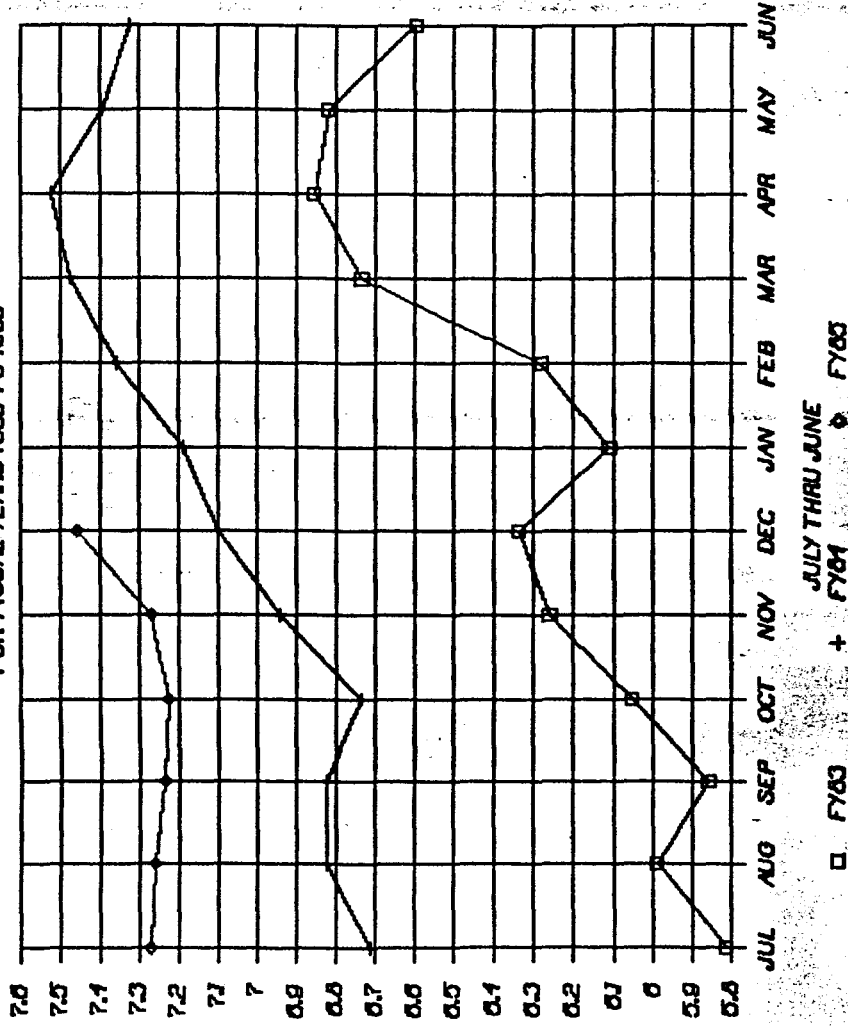


ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS

AFDC ACTUAL CASELOAD

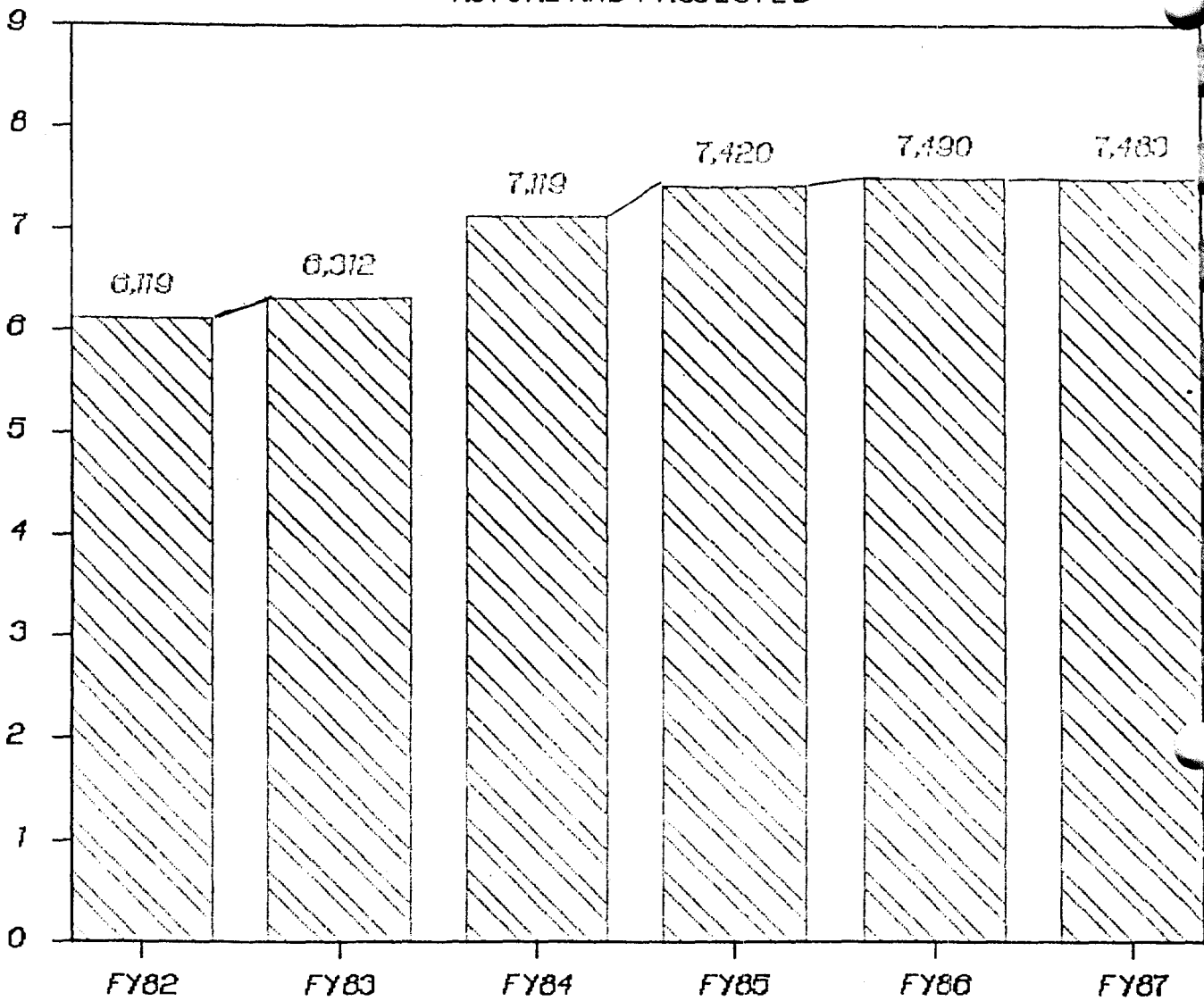
FOR FISCAL YEARS 1963 TO 1965

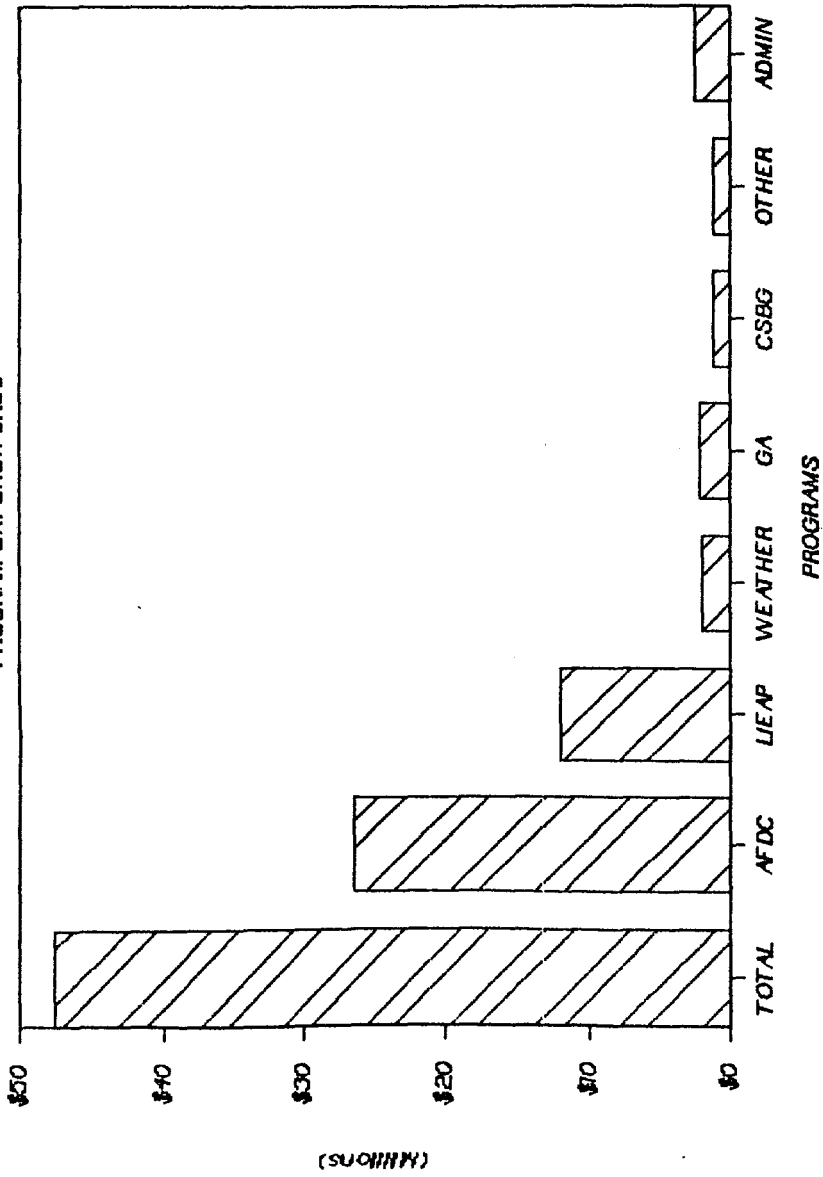
AVERAGE AFDC CASELOADS

ACTUAL AND PROJECTED



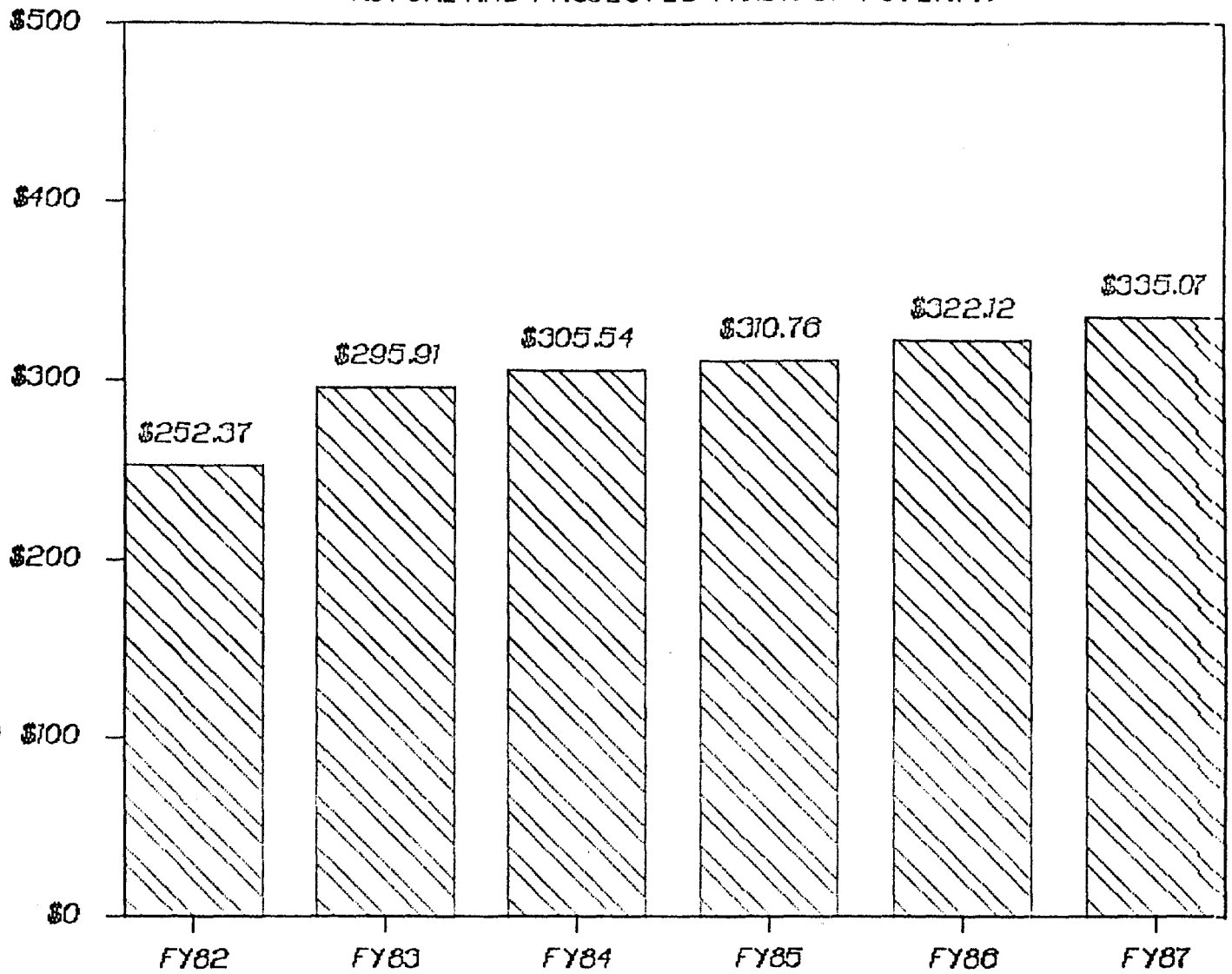
ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS
