Dave Lewis gave everyone a copy of language that has been drafted as amendments to HB 843 that authorizes the department to set up a method of distributing the \$100,000 for emergency assistance per year. (EXHIBIT 10).

Senator Story made a motion to accept these amendments.

The motion PASSED.

Judy Carlson, representing the Montana Association of Social Workers, gave the committee a list of agencies that the committee members might want to call and visit over the four-day break (EXHIBIT 11).

Senator Manning made a motion to treat the appropriation for the MMIS as a continuing appropriation, instead of appropriated for one year of the biennium.

The motion PASSED.

Peter Blouke and Chairman Winslow expressed their thanks to the staff of the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Sciences for their help during this budget review. Dave Lewis also expressed his thanks to the committee members for considering this difficult budget.

AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 843
(Re: General Relief Assistance)

1. Page 11
Following: line 9
Insert: "NEW SECTION. Section 6. Emergency assistance.

(1) Emergency assistance may be provided to those persons whose income and resources meet the criteria set forth in [Section 4] but are not otherwise eligible for general relief assistance.

(2) Emergency assistance is limited to the following:

(a) food, for no more than 3 days in any 12 month period, and only if food stamps are unavailable for reasons other than fraud;

(b) transportation to return to the county or state of residence or origin; and

(c) shelter, for no more than 3 days in any 12 month period.

(3) In state-assumed counties the total amount expended for this program of emergency assistance shall not exceed \$100,000 for state fiscal year 1986 and \$100,000 for state fiscal year 1987. Non state-assumed counties may adopt a plan of emergency assistance not inconsistent with this section."
