

MINUTES OF THE MEETING  
NATURAL RESOURCES SUBCOMMITTEE  
MONTANA STATE  
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

March 13, 1985

The meeting of the Natural Resources Subcommittee was called to order by Chairman Manuel on March 13, 1985 at 4:45 p.m. in Room 132 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present with the exception of Senators Boylan and Lane, who were excused.

E X E C U T I V E   A C T I O N

HOUSE BILL NO. 671: Senator Smith made a motion to recommend to the full Committee to TABLE House Bill 671. Representative Swift seconded. A Voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

HOUSE BILL NO. 886: Representative Spaeth said he felt #'s 3 and 4 of House Bill 886 are very important. Representative Swift agreed.

Representative Spaeth made a motion to recommend to the full Committee House Bill 886 be a high priority if any money comes in. Representative Swift seconded. A Voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Representative Spaeth made a motion to recommend to the full Committee to TABLE House Bill 886. Representative Nathe seconded. A Voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

HOUSE BILL NO. 740: Representative Spaeth made a motion to recommend to the full Committee House Bill 740 be TABLED. Representative Swift seconded. A Voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

HOUSE BILL NO. 909: Discussion was held.

Representative Swift made a motion to recommend to the full Committee this bill be TABLED. Senator Smith seconded. A Voice vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Senator Smith (79:B:84) said he was asked to introduce a bill by the Department of Administration, Building Codes Division, to transfer the Building Codes Division

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from the Department of Administration to the Department of Commerce. Senator Smith was asked to request a fiscal note.


Norm Rostocki, Office of Budget and Program Planning (OBPP), said in the revised fiscal note there will be a higher cost attached.

The fiscal note would state this is earmarked money and spending authority will have to be added into the Building Codes Division to cover their administrative costs. This would be about \$75,000 in FY '86 and \$60,000 in FY '87. The cost in the Department of Administration would not go up, the costs in the other programs in Commerce will be reduced by the same amount.

Jim Kembel, Administrator, Building Codes Division, Department of Administration, said the Department of Administration is General Funded and the Department of Commerce is more self supporting.

Discussion was held.
