#### MINUTES OF THE MEETING

### HOUSE COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATION

#### MONTANA STATE LEGISLATURE

April 24, 1985

The meeting of the Legislative Administration Committee was called to order by Chairman Menahan at 12:35 p.m., Wednesday, April 24, 1985, in Room 437 of the State Capitol Building.

ROLL CALL: Members present were Menahan, Brown, Donaldson, Grady and Zabrocki.

House Resolution No. 4, dealing with disposition of House supplies and furniture during the interim, was discussed. Points raised were that equipment replacement has not been dealt with in the past, and that there was no awareness of what kinds of equipment were available. It was recommended that during the next session equipment should be acquired, and that cost replacement and depreciation should be considered. One option would be to buy equipment and lease it back to a state agency during the interim.

It was proposed that page 2, line 4 of House Resolution No. 4 should be amended to add ", except for special sessions" after "interim." <a href="MOTION">MOTION</a>: Rep. Donaldson moved that House Resolution No. 4 do pass amended. Motion carried unanimously.

House Bill No. 960, allowing the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House to receive compensation and expenses for presession business, was considered. It was suggested that in the future, others could be included. MOTION: Rep. Donaldson moved that House Bill No. 960 do pass. Motion carried unanimously.

General discussion followed on problems with phone use and expense. It was pointed out that there are 150 legislators and 188 phones. Items which need to be controlled are the number of lines coming in and the number of hookup changes made. There is at the present time no policy on who gets phones and the number of phones. Problems noted with phone booths were that they are inconvenient, uncomfortable, and used by too many people. Suggestions were that there be a limit put on who can use the phones, and that there be time limits put on phone use.

Problems with restrooms were also discussed. Specific problems mentioned were inadequate cleaning and that too many people were allowed to use legislative restrooms.

MOTION: Rep. Donaldson moved that the Committee request that the Sergeant-at-Arms and the Chief Clerk make preparations for the next session so that legislators have the option of receiving second

reading packets each day on their desks. Motion carried unanimously.

One last point discussed was the noise and confusion level on the House floor. It was suggested that perhaps restrictions could be placed on who would be allowed on the floor.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 p.m.
