MINUTES OF THE MEETING STATE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE MONTANA STATE SENATE

February 15, 1985

The twenty-eighth meeting of the State Administration Committee was called to order by its Chairman Jack Haffey in Room 331, Capitol, at 6:00 p.m. on Friday, February 15, 1985.

ROLL CALL: All the members were present.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SENATE BILL 210: Senator Mohar explained to the Committee that Senate Bill 210 had been studied long and hard in the subcommittee that he chaired. He told the Committee that the amendments would help the bill in that it wouldn't keep the younger contractors out of the market. He also felt that it gave the people applying for a license an opportunity to study all the things they would need to know. He went through the amendments one at a time. Senator Blaylock felt that the amendments took all the "bite" out of the bill. He felt that it still did not protect the public when they hired a licensed contractor. Senator Mohar moved that the amendments be adopted. Question was called, and with Senator Manning voting no, the amendments carried. Senator Mohar moved the bill as amended. Senator Hirsch spoke against the bill saying that the state did not need more boards. Question was called and with Senator Hirsch voting no, <u>SENATE BILL 210 DO PASS AS AMENDED</u>. (For a copy of the amendments see Exhibit "1" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.)

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SENATE BILL 274: Senator Haffey explained that this was a bill that would allow the Department of Commerce to withhold licenses from people for doing things others, already licensed, would lose their license for. He said the Committee felt the bill was too broad and gave the Department of Commerce too much power. Valencia Lane entered amendments which answered these questions. Senator Mohar moved that the amendments be adopted. Question was called and the amendments were adopted unanimously. Senator Mohar moved the bill as amended. Question was called, and with Senator Lynch and Senator Harding voting no, SENATE BILL 274 DO PASS AS AMENDED. (For a copy of the amendments see Exhibit "2" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.)

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SENATE BILL 222: Valencia Lane, staff attorney, explained that this bill had to do with rule making authority for the Department of Commerce. The Committee felt that they should not be able to deny licenses without any rules in place. She explained that she has put in rule making, and amendment language, stricken. She went into detail concerning the amendments. Since the last two amendments were optional, Senator Mohar moved amendments 1, 2, and 3. Senator Haffey told the Committee that this was a bill that allowed boards to be more caring and flexible in the way they treated people who need disciplinary action. Ouestion was called and with the Committee voting unanimously, amendments 1, 2, and 3 were passed. Senator Mohar moved that the \$500 fine be changed to \$150 and amendment 4 be approved. Question was called and with the Committee voting unanimously, amendment 4 was adopted. With regard to amendment 5, Senator Mohar felt that we should not let them put this money into their own "pot" it should go into the general fund, and then the fines would not become oppressive. With that amendment reading that the money go into the general fund, Senator Mohar moved that amendment 5 be adopted. Question was called and with the Committee voting unanimously, amendment 5 was adopted. Senator Manning moved that SENATE BILL 222 do pass as amended. Senator Lynch spoke against this bill saying that he felt they were giving them too much power to take away that guy's license. Senator Mohar didn't think so, but Senator Lynch remembered the man saying that his competitors would love to serve on this board with that kind of power because they could then take his license away. Senator Haffey told the Committee that he had received a letter from the Cosmetology Association saying that they were in favor of this bill, so he felt there was dissension in the ranks. Senator Mohar wondered if this bill would need a Statement of Intent since they were giving them new rule-making authority. Question was called. Senator Haffev called for a roll call vote. The Committee voted 6-4 against the motion. Senator Manning reversed his motion to a do not pass. Question was called and with Senator Lynch and Senator Haffey voting no, SENATE BILL 222 DO NOT PASS AS AMENDED. (For a copy of amendments and roll call vote see Exhibits "3" and "4" respectively, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.)

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SENATE BILL 275: Valencia Lane, staff Attorney, explained that this bill regarded Architects. The amendments would define public buildings. She said the Committee was concerned that this was an Architects' relief bill and these amendments would allay that fear. She said that Senator Hirsch was concerned that the bill by-passed the Administrative Procedures Act and the amendments put that back in, together with making sure there was due process under the law. Senator Mohar moved the amendments. Question was called and with Senator Farrell voting no, the amendments carried. Senator Lynch moved to amend all of subsection (2). He felt that they should not be so lazy that they couldn't make up a new test. Ray Johnson, for himself and the Board of Architecture, said that if these tests were made public, the students would know which questions to study for and it would not give the Board and overall view of what they had learned. Senator Lynch moved Page 3

that Subsection (2) be stricken in its entirety. The Committee voted 6-4 in favor of the motion after Senator Haffey called for a roll call vote. Senator Manning made a motion that SENATE BILL 275 as amended do pass. Senator Hirsch opposed the bill on the grounds that anyone who has gone to school for five years should be able to practice Architecture in the state of Montana. Mr. Johnson said this was set up for reciprocity. It is a pretty standard thing in all states for an Architecture graduate to have to serve a three year apprenticeship. Question was called and Senator Haffey asked for a roll call vote on the motion. The Committee voted 6-4 in favor of the bill, so <u>SENATE BILL 275</u> <u>DO PASS AS AMENDED</u>. (For copies of roll call votes and amendments see Exhibits "5" through "7" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.)

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 15: Senator Manning made a motion that SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 15 do pass. Question was called, and the Committee voted unanimously that <u>SENATE JOINT</u> RESOLUTION 15 DO PASS.

Peg Krivec, Commissioner of Political Practices, wrote Senator Haffey a letter requesting that the Committee meet and rule on whether the term of office for the Commissioner should be 8 years instead of 6 in order to coincide with the Governor's term. Senator Haffey explained that it would take a three-fourths majority of the Committee to have a committee bill drafted. Senator Haffey called for a roll call vote. The Committee voted 7-3 in favor of the motion, but this was not sufficient so the request is denied.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 p.m.
