

MINUTES OF THE MEETING  
STATE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE  
49th LEGISLATURE SPECIAL SESSION III  
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

June 24, 1986

The meeting of the State Administration Committee was called to order by Chairman Sales on June 24, 1986 at 9:30 a.m. in Room 317 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: Fourteen members were present with Reps. Campbell, Kennerly, Moore and Smith being absent.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL NO. 16: Chairman Sales explained to the Committee members that there had been a great deal of confusion about HB 16 and he was approached to see if the Committee wished to reconsider its action on the bill. He said it was putting the administrative costs back on the local governments, schools and the state.

He explained the amendments that Lois Menzies, Staff Researcher, had prepared at his request. The administrative expenses would be attributed to each retirement system and they would come out of the earnings of the fund. Hopefully, this would help in the future when they come in and ask for an increase on the local government entities. Chairman Sales said that he had discussed this with Rep. Driscoll who is quite knowledgeable on retirement system- and he said that this is the way it should be.

EXECUTIVE ACTION:

Rep. Pistoria moved that the Committee RECONSIDER ACTION ON HB 16, seconded by Rep. Phillips. MOTION CARRIED.

Rep. O'Connell moved ADOPTION OF THE AMENDMENTS, seconded by Rep. Jenkins. MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Larry Natschein, Administrator of the PERS, explained their situation and said they had no problems with the amendments.

Rep. O'Connell moved that HB 16 DO PASS AS AMENDED, seconded by Rep. Phillips. MOTION CARRIED.
