

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
NATURAL RESOURCES COMMITTEE
49TH LEGISLATURE SPECIAL SESSION III

June 24, 1986

The meeting of the Natural Resources Committee was called to order by Chairman Dennis Iverson on June 24, 1986, at 11:50 a.m. in Room 312-1 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present with the exception of Rep. Cobb, Rep. Garcia, Rep. Harp, Rep. Miles and Rep. Peterson, who were excused.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL NO. 47: Rep. Loren Jenkins, District 13, appeared as sponsor of the bill, and presented it to the committee. He said some of the data sheets can go as long as 20 pages, the clerk and recorder records the information, but this bill makes it voluntary whether the company wants to file it.

PROPOSERS: Tucker Hill, representing Montana Wood Products, said they have worked to see that this came about, and they support the bill as it is.

George Ochenski, representing Montana Environmental Information Center, said they acquiesce to this proposal.

Gordon Morris, representing Montana Association of Counties (MACo), stated they also support this bill.

Gary Langley, Montana Mining Association, said they want to go on record in support of the bill.

OPPOSERS: There were no opposers present.

DISCUSSION ON HOUSE BILL NO. 47: Rep. Kadas asked Rep. Jenkins what the person who has the hazardous chemicals has to do. Rep. Jenkins replied they always had to file a list of chemicals with the clerk and recorder. This expands a little.

Rep. Kadas asked if this requires them to include a list of chemicals used on the job. Rep. Jenkins answered yes. This was an early agreement with all parties, that they would touch just this part of the bill.

There was no further discussion. Rep. Jenkins closed.


DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL NO. 47: Rep. Raney made the motion that HB47 DO PASS, seconded by Rep. O'Hara.

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Motion PASSED unanimously.

Chairman Iverson said Rep. Garcia and Rep. Cobb, who were excused, wanted to go on record as voting aye.

There being no further business to come before this committee, the hearing was adjourned at 12:00 noon.
