

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE
49TH LEGISLATURE SPECIAL SESSION III
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

June 30, 1986

The meeting of the Appropriations Committee was called to order by Chairman Bardanouve on Monday, June 30, 1986 at 8:00 a.m. in Room 104 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present with the exception of Reps. Quilici and Spaeth who were absent. Pam Joeehler from the LFA's Office was also present.

CONSIDERATION OF SB 13: AN ACT TO REDIRECT COAL TAX REVENUE FROM THE LOCAL IMPACT AND EDUCATION TRUST FUND TO THE SCHOOL FOUNDATION PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 1987.

Senator Dave Fuller, Senate District 22, sponsor of SB 13, said this bill amounts to a redirection of funds amounting to approximately \$6.7 million. He advised the committee there were a few technical problems with the bill and that is the reason for submittal of the attached amendments. (See Exhibit 1)

There were no further proponents.

OPPONENTS: (030) Eric Feaver, representing MEA, said that although he understands the difficult decisions the legislature has to make, the MEA prefers to see the education trust remain inviolate.

There were no further opponents, and Chairman Bardanouve opened the meeting up for discussion and questions.

Rep. Donaldson who had helped prepare the amendments, explained their purpose. The amendments allow for a 1-year reversion of income from the education trust fund to the school foundation program. He pointed out that this is about a \$500,000 impact next biennium. If it is kept for three years, we would be short \$2 million. The bill itself as it goes along moves everything back to its original form after July 1, 1987, so there is no need for a termination date and there is no need to talk about coal that is mined after March, 31, 1987, said Rep. Donaldson.

ACTION ON SB 13: Rep. Donaldson moved the proposed amendments. The motion was seconded by Rep. Moore, the question called, and the motion to adopt the amendments CARRIED unanimously on a voice vote. Rep. Donaldson further moved

SB 13 BE CONCURRED IN AS AMENDED. The motion was seconded by Rep. Moore. The question was called, and the motion CARRIED on a voice vote with Reps. Peck, Connelly and Bradley voting no.

RECONSIDERATION OF HB 12: AN ACT TRANSFERRING MONEY FROM THE CASH ACCOUNT OF THE LONG-RANGE BUILDING PROGRAM CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND TO THE GENERAL FUND.

Rep. Moore moved that HB 12 be taken off the table. (The Long-Range Planning Subcommittee had previously tabled the bill.) The motion was seconded by Rep. Manuel and CARRIED on a voice vote.

Rep. Thoft resisted the motion to reconsider by saying the \$2 million carry-over doesn't even begin to touch our problem. He said that next session, we'll have \$7,082,000 for projects that have already been requested. By adopting this, it will put us even further in the hole. He pointed out that there are 2,500 state buildings worth approximately \$1 billion. He feels it would be irresponsible and short-sighted to even consider HB 12.

Asked to comment, Tom O'Connell, chief of the Facility Planning Bureau of the Department of Administration, stated that the appropriation of the cash program last May intended to take care of major maintenance, remodeling, etc. was \$11 million. If this bill were to pass, we would have \$5 million to do those same kinds of things. The total amount of agency projects amounted to \$167 million last February. There was \$22 million that was strictly identified as major maintenance type projects. Another \$9 to 10 million was identified as health and safety type projects. Mr. O'Connell pointed out that \$5 million will not solve even the health and safety projects that have been requested. It won't even get into the major maintenance type projects.

Rep. Thoft said the legislature did not fund the projects that should have been funded last session simply because they were working with a subjective revenue. That doesn't mean that the job was done right, but it means that the amount of money that was projected was used up. He said this money can help fund a number of projects that really need to be completed.

Rep. Moore commented that the legislature doesn't know what the actual revenues will be. He suggested that the legislature find the money they can, balance the budget, then delve into this matter next January during the regular session.

Rep. Manuel said, "You don't remodel the ranch house when you are broke."

ACTION ON HB 12: (380) Rep. Moore moved that HB 12 DO PASS. The motion was seconded by Rep. Peck and FAILED 8-9. (See roll call vote.) The vote was reversed, and the committee reported HB 12 out as DO NOT PASS.

ADJOURN: There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:40 a.m.
