## MINUTES OF THE MEETING APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE 50TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The meeting of the Appropriations Committee was called to order by Chairman Rep. Gene Donaldson on January 29, 1987, at 1:30 p.m. in Room 104 of the State Capitol.

(15:A:0.01)

ROLL CALL: All members were present at the meeting except Reps. Winslow, Nathe, Poulsen, and Spaeth. Also attending were Judy Rippingale, LFA, and Denise Thompson, Secretary.

### HB 214:

Rep. Jan Brown, House District 46, Helena, presented the bill to the committee stating that this was at the request of the Department of Military Affairs. The bill would increase the amount in the governor's Disaster and Emergency Fund from \$1 million to \$1.5 million.

### PROPONENTS:

General Jim Duffy, Adjutant General, Director of The Department of Military Affairs, stated he supported the bill because the emergency fund was currently down to approximately \$200,000 which means if a disaster should occur between now and July 1, the governor may not be able to properly handle it because of lack of funds. He stated the governor can only use this fund in an emergency and the governor has to declare the emergency before funds can be expended.

(15:A:5.59) Rep. Bardanouve spoke in support of the bill. He said that if it hadn't been for the national guard coming in and helping during the flood in the Malta area, a tremendous amount of damage would have occurred from the flood.

Chairman Donaldson also referred to the assistant and direction which was provided by the national guard during a disaster and that he felt this money was necessary to give the governor more flexibility in case he needed it.

(15:A:7.46) Rep. Quilici asked if this money was built into the budget. General Duffy stated that it is in an account drawing interest.

(15:A:10.58) Mr. DeWolf stated the money is tied directly to the governor's disaster fund but it relates directly to the federal money that comes into the state of Montana also. If there is a presidential declaration, the governor does have to have this money as a local and state match of 25 percent.

(15:A:12.46) Rep. Swift asked if the governor had authority if an emergency arose and the dollars weren't there, to raise the money. Rep. Menahan said the governor has no authority to appropriate money and there would have to be a special session to handle that. In the case of a real emergency, there may not be time to get everything together in order to get the money promptly to handle an emergency effectively.

Rep. Brown closed on the bill.

Rep. Quilici moved that HB 214 DO PASS. Rep. Thoft called the question. Rep. Swift voted NO. The motion CARRIED.

## ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business before the committee, the meeting was adjourned at 2:00 p.m.
