MINUTES OF THE MEETING BUSINESS AND LABOR COMMITTEE 50TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION

February 14, 1987

The meeting of the Business and Labor Committee was called to order by Chairman Les Kitselman on February 14, 1987 at 8:00 a.m. in Room 312-F of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL: All members were present.

EXECUTIVE ACTION

ACTION ON HOUSE BILL NO. 694

Rep. Thomas moved that House Bill No. 694 DO PASS.

Rep. Thomas moved the amendments. Exhibit No. 1. The motion carried unanimously.

Rep. Cohen asked Rep. Thomas why there was no fiscal note with this bill as the State Auditor's Office stated it was going to cost \$30,000 to implement. Rep. Thomas stated there would not be much cost involved, all they have to do is file the reports, which should not take much of their time.

Rep. Wallin stated that this seemed a lot of extra work for information that not many people were interested in, and doesn't think the bill is needed.

Rep. Brandewie asked if anybody would be able to read these reports, if the reports come in and nobody compiles them, he sees no reason in having them. Rep. Thomas responded that these forms would be similar to an annual statement that the companies print every year, and they should be readable.

Rep. Simon stated that there has to be some costs involved in this; in compiling summaries of data, adopting rules, etc. Also, he said, the bill requires collecting unnecessary data, and adding extra regulations to the insurance industry unnecessarily.

Rep. Simon moved that House Bill No. 694 BE TABLED. The motion carried with Reps. Hansen, Swysgood, Driscoll, Nisbet, Bachini, Cohen, and Thomas opposed.

ACTION ON HOUSE BILL NO. 648

Rep. Swysgood moved that House Bill No. 648 DO PASS.

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Rep. Cohen moved an amendment to exclude calcuttas in any school related sport activities. He said it starts to edge too close to problems that have occurred in other parts of the nation for young people to resist in getting involved in the outcome of the game.

Rep. Driscoll moved a substitute motion on an amendment on page 1, line 18, insert, "sports event" does not mean any elementary school or high school sports event" following "rodeo". The motion carried with Rep. Simon, Rep. Swysgood, Rep. Thomas and Rep. Kitselman opposed.

Rep. Simon moved an amendment on line 11, following "auction pool" insert, "conducted for the benefit of the organizations sponsoring the event". The motion failed.

Rep. Cohen moved that House Bill No. 648 DO PASS AS AMENDED. The motion carried with Rep. Kitselman, Rep. Hansen, and Rep. Cohen opposed.

ACTION ON HOUSE BILL NO. 585

Rep. Driscoll moved that House Bill No. 585 DO PASS.

Rep. Smith stated that there is some merit to this bill, but there is a problem with it, which is taxes. He said what they were trying to do was to expand the areas that cooperatives were working in, and he is uncomfortable with that.

Rep. Simon stated he also has a problem with this because the playing field is leveled only on one side. He said that the cooperatives would be allowed to go in and begin competing against other businesses, but at the same time, the situation is not addressed that they are treated differently for tax purposes than the companies they would be competing against. He recognizes that Mountain Bell was a proponent, but he knows that other telephone companies stated that they are definitely not in favor of the bill. He said he could not support the bill.

Rep. Cohen stated that these cooperatives are providing service at a high cost in low density rural areas, and when the population grows and it is no longer a rural area but something that is a little more profitable, they lose their business to a private company, and the cooperatives are left with the low density, high cost areas. He said he doesn't see where that is in the interest of assisting these people so they can live in rural areas; until there were rural co-ops, there was no telephone service or electrical service, or much of any other services in the rural areas.

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Rep. Thomas stated the rural co-ops are serving the low density rural areas, but they are not paying taxes, and are not on a level playing field, but if an area does grow and somebody takes them over, then they start paying taxes and also at the same time their costs should be going down, because of the higher density.

Rep. Driscoll stated co-ops do pay taxes. He said they pay property taxes, and every tax an investor owned corporation pays, except they don't make a profit, because they are a non-profit corporation. If they do make a profit, they lose their status, so they lower their rates or build more lines with the money, but they pay property taxes.

Chairman Kitselman stated that the technology has changed recently and the co-ops can serve the rural areas with the new satellite signals. He said the utilities are assigned territories, and as the urban area grows around them, they lose their service areas because they are no longer rural, and the other utilities come in to compete with them.

There was more discussion on the taxes the cooperatives paid.

Rep. Driscoll's motion of DO PASS was voted on. The motion carried with 8 opposed.

ACTION ON HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 8

Rep. Simon moved that House Joint Resolution No. 8 DO PASS.

Rep. Simon moved the amendments. The motion carried unanimously.

Rep. Simon moved that House Joint Resolution No. 8 DO PASS AS AMENDED. The motion carried unanimously.

ACTION ON HOUSE BILL NO. 475

Chairman Kitselman stated he would refer this bill to the Judiciary Committee.

ACTION ON HOUSE BILL NO. 313

Rep. Pavlovich moved to reconsider the action on House Bill No. 313.

Rep. Pavlovich stated he had more amendments that he wanted to include.

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Rep. Pavlovich moved the technical amendments. The motion carried unanimously.

Rep. Pavlovich moved DO PASS AS AMENDED. The motion carried with Reps. Bachini, Glaser, Wallin, and Kitselman opposed.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at 9:15 a.m.
