

MINUTES OF THE MEETING
HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE
50TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The meeting of the House Appropriations Committee was called to order by Chairman Rep. Gene Donaldson on March 28, 1987 in Room 104 of the State Capitol.

ROLL CALL:

All members were present at the meeting except Rep. Thoft who was excused, Rep. Iverson who was absent and Rep. Rehberg who arrived late. Also in attendance were Peter Blouke, LFA and Denise Thompson, Secretary.

HB 906: (112:A:1.01)

Rep. Jack Ramirez, Billings presented the bill to the committee saying this was the distribution of the money from the sales tax if the sales tax bill were to pass. It is the appropriation to the Department of Revenue for their expenses to gear up to collect the tax and the statutory appropriation of the money thereafter. The numbers were calculated with the assumption that sales tax would be in place in 1989, if it were to be in place in 1988, this would have to be moved up a year.

The hearing was closed on the bill

SB 321: (112:A:32.43)

Sen. Jergeson presented the bill saying it was an Agriculture Mediation Bill that would compel people to go to the table and negotiate regarding financial difficulties.

PROPONENTS:

Mr. Keith Kelly, Director of the Department of Agriculture said that the bill would urge people to use a voluntary mediation program to help in assisting with alternatives to foreclosure (Exhibit 1).

Mr. Joseph Moore, Montana Peoples Action said they would have liked to see mandatory mediation but will provide a very viable solution.

Minyon Waterman of the Montana Association of Churches stated support for the bill.

(112:A:40.35) Mr. John Erickman, Montana Association of Churches, also supported the program. Sitting down at the table and talking about these things would certainly help.

There were no opponents to the bill.

QUESTIONS: (112:B:0.01)

Rep. Bardanouve questioned how many cases of mediation they have so far and how successful they have been in being able to resolve the issues. Mr. Kelly stated that they had a total of 28 cases, they completed 5, 5 are still in the process, and 8 or 9 were declined. He assessed the program and he feels it has been successful in its implementation and very cost effective.

(112:17.18) Sen. Jergeson closed on his bill by suggesting amendments to the bill as the committee sees fit.

The hearing was closed on the bill.

HB 870&871: (112:B:17.50)

Rep. Miller stated he would like to combine the two bills as they both refer to the same subject. He also stated there were amendments to both bills. The bills are for teacher salary increases for the teachers at the School for the Deaf and Blind and Mountain View and Pine Hills. The salaries are lower than anywhere else in the state and these people have very adverse working conditions.

PROPOSERS:

Mr. Phil Campbell, Montana Education Association said that regarding HB 870, there are other teachers on the matrix other than Mountain View and Pine Hills. He stated he had previously presented information regarding the teacher salaries and the salaries are in some cases \$2,000 lower in those schools than the average pay matrix.

(112:B:28.53) Terry Minnow, Montana Federation of Teachers, Montana Federation of State Employees stated the teachers at the Montana State Hospital and others are working under difficult circumstances and their pay is sadly inadequate. It is 23 percent less than any teacher in the system.

HB 870 calls for teachers in the institutions salaries to be brought up to the state level. HB 871 addressed the School for the Deaf and Blind salaries.

The people who teach at these institutions only do so because they want to. It is not because of the salary they receive. There is no incentive for these people to stay, and it is difficult to recruit them.

Henry Hislop, Montana State Hospital, stated he has worked with many different types of people. Many qualified teachers leave the institution because the salary is so low. There is a pretty bad morale problem. They teach 7 out of 8 hours of class a day. They get less salary than most 9 month teachers and they work 12 months.

(112:B:34.00) Debbie Gabse, Boulder, stated she liked her job a Boulder. She liked the area. The people were very slow and hard to teach but she had patience and liked it. She urged support of equity in salaries for teachers at the various state institutions (Exhibit 2).

Cladette Morton, Board of Public Education, said the Board is concerned about the quality of education for all the children in Montana and the support the bills. They are concerned about HB 871 because the School for the Deaf and Blind needs a speech therapist. They can not get one for the salary that has been offered and it is very difficult to maintain the necessary staff at the school on the salary that is there currently. They have been frozen on their salary for 6 years and they would like to see some help.

Chairman Donaldson stated he wished to go on record as a proponent regarding this issue.

There was also written testimony given by Toni Tyson (Exhibit 3).

Lori Eckenger, Department of Administration urged the committee to support the bill. She stated that there are 53 teachers in the institutions and 40 in The School for the Deaf and Blind which would be addressed by HB 870 and 871.

EXECUTIVE ACTION:

HB 854: Rep. Winslow moved to accept the amendments on HB 854, the one stop licensing bill (Exhibit 4) on HB 854, to change it to an act that money is appropriated, and House Bill 862 appropriates to the Department of Commerce insert: \$5,000 and delete "from the general fund" on page one line 24, beginning July 1, 1987. Rep. Bardanouve called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

(113:A:35.40) Rep. Winslow moved HB 854 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Rep. Quilici called the question. Reps. Nathe, Switzer, Devlin voted NO. The motion CARRIED.

HB 855: Rep. Winslow moved to amend HB 855 as per Exhibits 5 and 6) and reference HB 862. Rep. Connelly called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Rep. Winslow moved that HB 855 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Rep. Swift and Menke voted NO. The motion CARRIED.

HB 887: Mr. Peter Blouke, LFA explained the amendments to HB 887 to the committee. The amendments would remove the appropriation from SB 321 and put it in HB 887.

Rep. Winslow moved to amend SB 321, (Exhibit 7) to take the appropriation out. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Rep. Winslow moved SB 321 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Rep. Bardanouve called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Rep. Winslow moved to amend HB 887 as indicated in Exhibit 8). Rep. Bardanouve called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Rep. Winslow moved that HB 887 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Rep. Quilici called the question. Reps. Poulsen, and Rehberg voted NO. The motion CARRIED.

HB 898: Rep. Menahan moved to Do PASS HB 898. Rep. Menke called the question. There was a roll call vote. Reps. Bradley, Connelly, Manuel, Menahan, Miller, Poulsen, and Quilici voted YES. REPs. Donaldson, Winslow, Bardanouve, Devlin, Menke, Nathe, Peck, Rehberg, Spaeth, Swift and Switzer voted NO. The motion FAILED 7 to 11. The vote was reversed on a DO NOT PASS MOTION and the motion CARRIED 11 to 7.

HB 906: Rep. Menahan moved amendment 2 on Exhibit 9 to strike line 14 in its entirety. Rep. Bardanouve called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Rep. Switzer moved amendments 1, 3, 4, and 5 be approved. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Rep. Swift moved to DO PASS 906 AS AMENDED. There was a roll call vote. Reps. Donaldson, Winslow, Bardanouve, Bradley, Devlin, Manuel, Menke, Miller, Nathe, Poulsen, Rehberg, Spaeth, Swift and Switzer voted YES. Reps. Connelly, Menahan, Peck, and Quilici voted NO. The motion CARRIED 14 to 4.

HB 870 and 871: Action on these bills was postponed until Monday.

HB 593: (113:B:25.35) Rep. Rehberg moved to reconsider action on HB 593. Rep. Devlin called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously. The amendments he presented to the committee would strike all of section 4 on page 2 and take out the appropriation of \$500,000 and puts a \$500 figure in, page 1 line 18, change "prohibiting" to "limiting" so that the fiscal note is no longer applicable (Exhibit 10).

Rep. Rehberg moved to accept the amendments. Rep. Quilici called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Rep. Rehberg moved to DO PASS as AMENDED HB 593. Rep. Quilici called the question. Rep. Bardanouye made a substitute motion to strike Section 11. There was a roll call vote. Reps. Bardanouye, Bradley, Connelly, Menahan, Nathe, Poulsen, and Quilici voted YES. Reps. Donaldson, Thoft, Devlin, Manuel, Menke, Miller, Peck, Rehberg, Spaeth, Swift and Switzer voted NO. The motion FAILED 7 to 11.

(113:A:02.34) Rep. Rehberg moved to DO PASS HB 593 AS AMENDED. Rep. Menahan called the question. Reps. Bardanouye, Menahan, Quilici and Connelly voted NO. The motion CARRIED.

Rep. Menahan moved to reconsider action on HB 38. Reps. Connelly, Manuel, and Winslow voted NO. The motion CARRIED.

Rep. Miller moved to DO PASS HB 38 AS IS no AMENDMENTS.

Rep. Spaeth moved to adopt amendments 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 14, and 15 (Exhibit 11). Rep. Quilici called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

(114:A:17.55) Rep. Spaeth moved new sections 18, 19, and Section 16 and included new section 20 and the adjustment of all numbers throughout the bill. Rep. Quilici called the question. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Rep. Miller moved to DO PASS HB 38 AS AMENDED. There was a roll call vote. Reps. Devlin, Menahan, Menke, Miller, Nathe, Peck, Quilici, Rehberg and Swift voted YES. Reps. Donaldson, Winslow, Bardanouye, Bradley, Connelly, Manuel, Poulsen, Spaeth, and Switzer voted NO. The motion FAILED 9 to 9.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

Chairman Donaldson and members of the committee. The Montana Department of Agriculture supports Senate Bill 321 as amended providing for voluntary agricultural debt mediation.

The adversities facing our agricultural producers have not disappeared and may, in fact, continue to impact the farm/ranch, rural communities, and the overall economy of our state for some time to come. Recent studies leave serious doubt as to whether or not we are even at the bottom of the slide. Continued land devaluation and inadequate cash flow compound the magnitude of the financial stress affecting agricultural producers and lenders alike.

Voluntary debt mediation offers an excellent opportunity for both producer and lender to sit down with a neutral third party to negotiate workable alternatives to foreclosure. The existing debt mediation program offers an excellent alternative to other courses of action such as Chapter 12 bankruptcy.

Several mediation cases conducted through the existing voluntary program have resulted in creative and positive outcomes, allowing the producers to continue in agriculture and avoid very costly

litigations, etc. The various financial institutions represented in the state have, for the most part, been very willing to work with the voluntary mediation program and have encouraged participation whenever possible.

Activities that reduce the financial stresses in agriculture will help to mitigate the forces that are causing the downward pressure on the agricultural economy and eventually improve long-term recovery for agricultural producers and the state of Montana. For these reasons, the Montana Department of Agriculture supports Senate Bill 321.
