Call to Order: By Chairman Dave Brown, on January 11, 1989, at 8:06 a.m.

HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 13

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor: Rep. Quilici, House District 71, stated that this bill will revise the crime victims compensation act, capping a fund of \$200,000.00. Over the years there has been a numerous amount of amendments to make the act more compatible with the innocent victims of crime. The amendments change the definition of criminally injurious conduct, and allows the Crime Control Division to obtain certain medical and insurance reports. According to the administrator these funds should be adequate under the existing statute to handle the innocent victims of crime. Anything over the \$200,000.00 will revert to the general fund.

- Cheryl Bryant stated that the purpose of the crime victims compensation act is to compensate and assist innocent victims who are injured as a direct result of the criminal acts of others. This bill will help to lessen or eliminate the paper work that an innocent victim would have to do on their own claim. It will also be much easier and faster to process these claims by allowing a statutory release of insurance and medical records. This change in the law will allow the necessary information so a claim can be paid in a timely manner without any extra work on the behalf of the innocent victim or without exposing the medical provider or insurance company.
- Jerry Loendorf commented that the aspect of this bill that the Mont. Medical Assoc. (MMA) is interested in is the waiver of privilege of the patient. This permits the Board of Crime Control to obtain patients records without the patient's authorization. This provision is generally consistent with the existing law; Rule 35-B-2, which requires that a person waives his privilege concerning his physical condition when he files a claim in court concerning that physical condition. This bill, with respect to people who file claims for crime victims compensation, states that once they make their physical condition an issue they then waive that privilege and records can be obtained to check if the condition their claiming actually exists.
- In opposition to HB 13, Jim Ahrens stated that this bill and the section on the release of medical records puts the Montana Hospital Assoc. (MHA) in a difficult position. The medical record is a private document between the patient and the facility and/or the treating physician.
- Questions From Committee Members: Rep. Brown asked Cheryl Bryant the difference between the Hospital Association and the Montana Medical Association. Mrs. Bryant gave as an example an incest case where the offender was the one insured and also had the right to the records. In cases such as this, the Dept. has been unable to get any cooperation from the offender. Another example was when the natural father of the child was the insured. They did not know what his name or location was to get this information so they could not make the appropriate amount of the payments.

- Rep. Brown continued by asking why the uniform health care information act does not cover this bill in its original form. Why is the additional language needed? Mrs. Bryant replied by stating that John MacMaster did the legislation drafting and the uniform health care act was amended because there is no catch-all provision that says "as provided by law."
- Rep. Boharski, referring to page 7, line 15 of the bill questioned the word "may" be deposited to the general fund. It was to his understanding that it should read "shall". Mrs. Bryant stated that there is no particular reason as the why it is written that way, that it is just a permissive use. Rep. Quilici stated that the intent is anything over \$200,000.00 will be reverted to the general fund, and if appropriate, would be willing to change the word to "shall".
- Rep. Hannah questioned Mrs. Bryant if she had an approximate figure as to how much of the funding was currently going into mental health counseling. She stated that for the secondary victims it is a very small amount, approximately \$200.00. She also stated that the mental health counseling became effective October 1, 1987 and since that date they have only had about 20 claims filed.
- Rep. Mercer questioned the opponents as to putting a blanket consent on the standard claim form. Mr. Browning stated that it would be creating an exception that is too broad.
- <u>Closing by Sponsor:</u> Rep. Quilici stated that without the release of these reports, there is no way to find out if the innocent victim was insured or if they have been paid for health costs by the insurance company. In many cases it is difficult to reach the innocent victim or guardian of, and are therefore unable to attain the information needed. This bill would allow for the information to be obtained directly from the medical provider or insurance company. Rep. Quilici strongly expressed that in no way will the privacy act by abused.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 13

Motion: No motions.

Discussion: None.

Amendments and Votes: None.

Recommendation and Vote: Close the hearing on House Bill 13. No action taken.

EXECUTIVE SESSION HOUSE BILL 27

Motion: Rep. Darko made a DO PASS motion, seconded by Rep. Nelson.

- Discussion: Rep. Addy expressed to the committee that killing in any way is wrong, and why is it right for them to deliberately decide to put someone to death whether they are an innocent victim or whether they are a criminal. This bill would basically give the State the ability to control life.
- Rep. Brooke stated that we as a society cannot continue the killing. She feels that if we break the cycle of killing that we are making a statement against violence and killing.

Recommendation and Vote: A Roll Call Vote was called for on the DO PASS motion and CARRIED with 13 voting aye, and 4 nays.

EXECUTIVE SESSION HOUSE BILL 42

Motion: Rep. Hannah offered a DO NOT PASS motion, seconded by Rep. Daily.

- Discussion: Rep. Hannah stated that he feels this bill would create more problems than it would solve, particularly in the small towns of Montana.
- Rep. Stickney does not see any problems with this bill since the final decision will be left up to the local community to enact the kind of provision they chose to. She doubts that any community that would be affected by this bill would enact it, whereas those communities that want to control the situation can act on it to the communities benefit.
- Amendments and Votes: Rep. Brown presented for the committee's review proposed amendments to HB 42 (EXHIBIT 1).
- Motion: Rep. Gould made a substitute motion to TABLE HB 42, motion seconded by Rep. Hannah. A Roll Call Vote was taken and FAILED with 5 ayes and 12 nays.

Recommendation and Vote: A Roll Call Vote was taken on the DO NOT PASS motion and CARRIED with 10 ayes and 7 nays. HB 42 recommended DO NOT PASS.
