# HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 334

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

REPRESENTATIVE CONNELLY, District 8 explained the background on House Bill 334. In 1983 the County Task Force Program was established through the County Commissioners and Highway Safety Traffic Department. In 1987 the \$50 reinstatement fee was put on. There has been some misunderstanding as far as how this fee should apply. House Bill 334 is to clarify in order to get your license back you must first pay the fee. In some cases, the counties were not charging the \$50 fee. They were allowing the person to get their license back and that was not the purpose of the program. The fee was originally put on to discourage driving while drinking.

#### Testimony:

PETER FUNK, Assistant Attorney General for the Department of Justice stated that his Department does support House Bill 334. The existing language which is proposed to be changed creates a problem. The problem is what happens when a person fails to pay the \$50 and continues to drive. The language of the statute says "the license may not be restored". So when a person is stopped while driving and they have not paid the fee, some County Attorneys are reluctant to charge them with the offense of driving while your license has been suspended or pulled.

Closing by Sponsor: REPRESENTATIVE CONNELLY closed the hearing on House Bill 334. She stated that they have had excellent results with the DUI Task Force. In Flathead the DUIs have dropped by 70%.

#### HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 331

# Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

REPRESENTATIVE HARPER, District 44 stated that House Bill 331 was at the request of one of his constituents who will address the Committee regarding his experience. The bill changes the anniversary date for motor vehicle re-registration from the 25th of the month to the last day of the month. He explained that on the registration the expiration may be on April 30th, but a person is not in violation of the law until May 25. Since the plates say May, a person could be in violation. Testimony:

- MIKE THOMAS gave an example of his situation. He stated that he plates with a sticker that said May and he had assumed that he had a grace period. However, on the registration the date is April and a citation was issued. He stated that this bill would be very helpful.
- PETER FUNK, Assistant Attorney General stated their support for House bill 331. The Justice Department has discussed this with the Motor Vehicle Division and the Registrar of Motor Vehicles and it does not appear that this change would cause any problems with the existing operation of the Division.
- <u>Questions From Committee Members:</u> SENATOR WILLIAMS asked Mike Thomas how much the citation cost.
- MIKE THOMAS stated that the fine was \$30 but was reduced to \$20.
- <u>Closing by Sponsor:</u> REPRESENTATIVE HARPER closed the hearing on House Bill 331 stating that the date at the end of the bill is December 31, 1989. He did not feel that it would be propitious to make the change in the middle of the period.
