EXECUTIVE SESSION

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 35

<u>Discussion:</u> Senator Brown asked Marvin Barber to respond to the questions the committee had previously raised concerning the amended sections of the bill.

Marvin Barber, representing the County Assessors of Montana, explained Section 15-6-136, which was inadvertently left in the codes last session, pertains to domestic and perishable agriculture products. Sections 15-6-138 and 15-6-140 clarify the definition of coal and ore haulers and Section 15-6-207 clarifies the unprocessed perishable agricultural products. Section 15-8-408 provides for assessing property as of the January 1 assessment date where the property is located rather than were the owner might reside. Sections 15-24-902 through 943 deal with deleting the average inventory assessment of livestock.

The livestock affected are the 24 month old and younger. The cow herds fall into other situs assessment dates. Mr. Barber felt that all the problem areas of last session have been addressed in this bill.

Amendments and Votes: None

Recommendation and Vote: Senator Harp moved House Bill 35
Be Concurred In. The motion CARRIED on a roll call
vote (Exhibit #1).

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 166

<u>Discussion:</u> There was a general discussion regarding eligibility for SSI. Concern was expressed regarding clarification of Section 1 (2) (a) (b) (ii) and (iii).

Representative Good, sponsor, said her intent is to have the bill apply to people who are over 70 or have Alzheimers, regardless of the age of onset.

- Amendments and Votes: Senator Walker moved to amend the bill as shown in amendments 1, 2 and 3 on the attached standing committee report (Exhibit #2). The motion CARRIED with Senator Hager voting no.
- Recommendation and Vote: Senator Walker moved HB 166 Be Concurred In As Amended. The motion CARRIED unanimously.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL 458

Discussion: Senator Eck reviewed the proposed amendments with the committee. She noted there was a question about the effective date which Jerry Foster and the cities and counties representatives worked out. The statutory appropriations sections have been taken out (amendment #4, attached standing committee report, Exhibit #3). The applicability amendments are #11 and #12. Refunds are addressed in a substantive amendment (amendment #7) and it appears that all the parties are in agreement with the preceding amendments.

Senator Brown asked how the amendments would affect the fiscal note.

Senator Eck said it would be less as the fiscal note is actually incorrect to begin with. She pointed out the estimated income is at least \$2 million more in each of these years which would more than make up for being taxed in the general fund. She noted the banks have had a difficult time with local governments because the situation is somewhat volatile and the refund situation is a real problem. Refunds are handled well at the state level but it is very difficult for counties when they have to go back and refund a half million dollars which has already been spent. She felt that the bill with these amendments will benefit local governments and give them some stability in these transactions.

Amendments and Votes: Senator Halligan moved to adopt amendments #2 through #12 as per the attached standing committee report (Exhibit #3). The motion CARRIED unanimously.

Senator Eck moved to amend the title as per amendment #1 (standing committee report Exhibit #3). The motion CARRIED with Senator Crippen voting no.

Recommendation and Vote: Senator Eck moved SB 458 Do Pass As Amended. The motion CARRIED with Senators Crippen and Harp voting no.
