### HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 792

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

REPRESENTATIVE DAVIS, District 53 stated that House
Bill 792 is an act to bring the amateur radio statutes
in line with all the other current special license
plates issuance. This bill will correct an oversight
that changes only the provision which currently
requires the amateur radio license plates to be
purchased in addition to the regular issued plates.
The only change in the bill is "in lieu of the numbered
license plates".

# Testimony:

JOHN GEACH, a licensed ham radio operator, also representing approximately 15 members of the capitol city amateur radio club of Helena testified in support of House Bill 792. He gave a brief history of the law and stated that the statute Representative Davis is dealing with dates back to 1957. At that time the legislature passed a law allowing amateur radio operators to have a special plate put on their vehicles so they can be identified during a time of an emergency. The plates have 1 number and 3 to 5 letters. There are 2 plates issued, the regular plates and the amateur radio plates. is confusion in the law regarding what to do with the second set of plates. Some put the regular plates behind the amateur radio plates. This bill will help to eliminate that confusion. The amateurs have a unique ability to provide radio communications during emergencies. Mr. Geach sited situations where it was a ham radio operator who got the information out first, i.e. Grenada, Mexican earthquake, Dillon plane crash, Mount St. Helena, train derailment in Helena, etc. There have also been times when the police or sheriff could not get through on telephone lines, and the ham radio operators did the communicating for them.

JOHN GEACH concluded that this bill would make it easier for amateurs to get a plate, help law enforcement personnel to interpret this law, and will reduce administrative cost to the State and the County.

Questions From Committee Members: SENATOR NOBLE asked if they pay for the two plates.

REPRESENTATIVE DAVIS said that is correct. First they buy the number plate, then they pay a small fee for the amateur plate.

SENATOR WEEDING asked how often they have to renew their operator's license.

REPRESENTATIVE DAVIS answered every ten years. He also added that Bud Shane in Deer Lodge would love to see this bill pass.

Closing by Sponsor: REPRESENTATIVE DAVIS closed the hearing on House Bill 792.
