HEARING ON HB 15

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

Representative Francis Bardanouye indicated this is the feed bill for the special session, and has been carefully worked out by the Chief Clerk of the House and the Senate officers, Legislative Council, and a small appropriation for the Fiscal Analyst. He added that the bill is based on the session called for but, if it runs longer, they will have to have more money.

Representative Bardanouye reported that the House is running on less officers and personnel than they usually have. He indicated the Legislative Council appropriation is based on very carefully estimated costs of what they need for the services they render, and that the Fiscal Analyst appropriation of \$12,000 is for printing of the Fiscal Analyst's report. He indicated that, ordinarily, the Fiscal Analyst's report would have been printed in May or June, after the

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regular session, but the Finance Committee decided they will not publish that report, and will wait until the results of the special session, to save some money and, therefore, this \$12,000 will print the combined report of the regular session and the special session. He noted that there is money in the Fiscal Analyst's budget for the report which would have been printed, and which will revert back to the general fund, so this is for the special session, and will be used after the end of the fiscal year. He added that the money in the present Fiscal Analyst's budget will revert at the end of June.

Representative Bardanouve reported that someone pointed out that the Senate costs, per member, will be slightly higher than the House, but indicated that, of course, that is always the case, because the costs of basic officers and personnel in the Senate would be divided by approximately 50, while those same basic officers and personnel in the House would be divided by 100, so the costs, per member, in the Senate will be slightly higher because there are only half as many Senators. He noted that someone pointed this out, as if the Senate was being a spent-thrift, but pointed out that, if you use the division of the membership it comes out the same.

Representative Bardanouve indicated that Bob Person of the Legislative Council compiled these figures, and may have something to say. He then indicated that, in the regular session, the money can carry on past the year, but that the money in this bill will revert, at the end of the fiscal year, that, if there is any left over, it will revert, and will not be carried on to be used for something else. He added that it is a basic, bare minimum budget for this session.

List of Testifying Proponents and What Group they Represent:

Bob Person, Executive Director, Legislative Council

Testimony:

Mr. Person indicated that spread sheets have been distributed to the committee members, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1, which detail the budgets for all of the agencies. He stated that he would certainly be willing to answer any questions about it.

Questions From Committee Members:

- Q. Senator Devlin indicated he is real curious about the Fiscal Analyst's reversion that Representative Bardanouve

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talked about, and asked how much money is going to be reverted.

- A. Representative Bardanouye responded that they estimate about \$26,000 will be reverted from the Fiscal Analyst's office. He noted that part of that will be for publishing of the bi-annual report, which would have been published, and there is money they have not used for consultants. He indicated they estimate the reversion of the Fiscal Analyst's office will be in the neighborhood of \$26,000-\$27,000. He indicated that one thing Ms. Rippingale pointed is that, if they are requested to do some very heavy computer runs for this special session, they have not put in any requests for heavy use of computers, and that might eat up some of that \$26,000. He reiterated that they roughly estimate, at this moment, about \$26,00 or \$27,000 will revert.
- Q. Senator Devlin asked Representative Bardanouye how much of that is appropriated to them for the duties of the regular session reports.
- A. Representative Bardanouye responded that \$12,000, which would have been used for the report, was not used, and will be re-appropriated, here.
- Q. Senator Devlin indicated he knows that, overall, \$26,000 will come back, but asked how much of that \$26,000 was appropriated for just the regular session report.
- A. Representative Bardanouye responded \$12,000, estimated, which is about the same as what they have in this bill, and would have covered the report, if it had been made in June or May, after the regular session.
- Q. Senator Devlin asked Representative Bardanouye if there is no way they can just use the \$12,000 out of the \$26,000, and if it has to go back the first of July.
- A. Representative Bardanouye responded that the Fiscal Analyst's budget ends at the end of the fiscal year. He indicated it will be the same money, except that they can publish the report after the end of the fiscal year, which will probably be in late July or early August, into the new fiscal year.
- Q. Senator Devlin asked if there would be about \$14,000 net savings.

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- A. Representative Bardanouve responded that about \$26,000 will be reverted and, of that \$26,000, they have \$12,000 in this bill.
- Q. Senator Himsel referred to page one of the spread sheet, and asked what does "adj for Boharski" mean.
- A. Representative Bardanouve responded that is an adjustment for Representative Boharski.
- Mr. Person indicated there are legislative salaries for the session, and there is per diem. He explained that, since one Representative takes what would have been the per diem amount as a different kind of salary, because of the bill passed at the beginning of the regular session, a minor adjustment was made in the amounts. He indicated that the \$50 was included in the formula for salaries, and removed from the per diem, so that 99 Representatives were calculated at the per diem rate, for eleven days. He noted the amount of money that individual receives is added in, under salary.
- Q. Senator Himsel asked Mr. Person if eleven session days and one extra day would be the difference between \$59,400 and \$58,207.
- A. Mr. Person responded no, that it is eleven session days plus one Sunday, at \$50 per day, for 99 members.
- Q. Senator Himsel asked if this has no relationship, then, to the figures attached to it. He indicated he reads it as \$59,400, eleven session days plus one extra day, for Boharski.
- A. Mr. Person responded that is eleven session days, plus one extra day, for all 99 members, noting they get \$50 for Sunday, plus eleven days in session. He added they work six days this week, get \$50 for Sunday, and work five days next week.
- Q. Senator Himsel asked if the "adj" means it was adjusted for him.
- A. Mr. Person responded that is right, that amount has been reduced, and the other amount increased.
- Q. Vice-Chairman Aklestad referred to the \$112,000 for the Legislative Council, noting most of the staff is on duty,

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and asked Mr. Person what is most of that cost, if printing, etc., is in that, and what the breakdown is.

- A. Mr. Person responded that the biggest amount of the cost is for bill printing, and reviewed the spread sheet breakdown.
- Q. Senator Devlin asked Mr. Person if there is a reversion from his department, too.
- A. Mr. Person responded yes, that there is a fairly significant one.

Closing by Sponsor:

Representative Bardanouve thanked Vice-Chairman Aklestad for the hearing, noting he is sure the committee is taking good care of the bill.

Vice-Chairman Aklestad announced the hearing on HB15 as closed.

DISPOSITION OF HB 15

Discussion:

Senator Jacobson reported there is an amendment, and distributed copies to the committee members, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 2. She noted it is a technical amendment on page 1, line 20, which reads "the following amount is appropriated to the Office of the LFA", and it should read "the following amount is appropriated from the general fund". She offered a motion that HB15 be amended.

Amendments and Votes:

Motion passed by the committee that HB15 be amended on page 1, line 20, following "appropriated", to insert "from the general fund".

Recommendation and Vote:

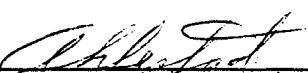

RE: Special Session Feed Bill

Introduction

Here is a draft of the Special Session feed bill. Along with it are spreadsheets that detail the budgets. I developed these with leadership, leadership staff, and legislative agency staffs. We have attempted to identify all costs reasonably associated with the special session in these budgets. Comments to the side of the items disclose the assumptions that were used to calculate the budget amount. In the balance of this memo, I will explain the structure of the budget and summarize overall assumptions.

Budget structure

Budgets for the House and the Senate are each developed using three responsibility centers: 51st Legislature (house) Special Session 1 (# 8911), Attaché Salaries (# 8912), and Presession (# 8913).

The 8911 centers include budgets for legislator salaries during and immediately following the session, operating expenses for the operation of each of the houses, and capital expenditure budgets.

The 8912 centers include budgets for paying the employees of the House and the Senate for special session work during and after the end of the session.

The 8913 centers include budgets for costs incurred prior to the beginning of the special session for committee meetings and leadership travel.

The Legislative Council budget includes centers for legislative information, legislative services, bill printing and distribution, legislative publications, and legislative telephone service. These centers provide budgets to pay additional staff and operating costs anticipated to cover special session costs.

An appropriation is included as well for the Legislative Fiscal Analyst. It covers printing costs that had to be deferred to the next fiscal year.

Overall assumptions

In preparing the budget 11 session days were assumed. All salaries, overtime, and expenses were related to this duration assumption. Should the session extend beyond June 30, additional funds may be needed.

One round trip for legislators during session has been assumed. The statute authorizes additional trips if the legislature approves it, but only one is budgeted.

Finally, we assumed that in so far as possible, all costs to be incurred for the special session should be identified and budgeted in this bill.

Conclusion

If you have any questions, I will be happy to go over this with you in detail. In the meantime, we will continue to prepare the bill for introduction.
