DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL 22

Discussion: (see discussion in sections below)

Amendments and Votes:

Senator Gage MOVED the amendments contained in Exhibit #1.

Senator Gage said there is not revenue to be able to lower the percentage to 4%, therefore the 6% figure is reflected in the proposed amendments. He felt if more revenue can be found the percentage can be lowered in the House to the 4% level.

The motion to AMEND CARRIED with Senator Crippen voting no.

Senator Mazurek expressed some concern as to why the Department of Revenue was not present at the meeting when the bill had provisions for change in a policy that the Department was willing to take to court.

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Senator Crippen MOVED to amend the bill as per the amendments contained in Exhibit #2.

- The motion to AMEND CARRIED on a roll call vote (Exhibit #3).
- Senator Harp offered amendments to the bill (Exhibit #4).

 The committee members agreed the amendments went beyond the scope of the bill and they did not wish to consider including them in this piece of legislation.
- Jim Mockler, Montana Coal Council, suggested the wording "sales tax" in the bill be changed to "production tax".
- Senator Mazurek expressed grave concern about the legality of changing the name of the severance tax in order to circumvent the capping of the coal trust.
- Senator Gage said in another bill he is sponsoring the tax is called a "privilege tax". He MOVED to change all references in the bill from "sales tax" to "privilege tax".
- Senator Eck made a substitute MOTION to delete the reduction in the severance tax and to leave it at the current level of 15%.
- The MOTION FAILED on a roll call vote (Exhibit #5).
- Senator Gage MOVED the previous motion to change "sales tax" to "privilege tax".

The MOTION CARRIED with Senators Crippen and Eck voting no.

Recommendation and Vote:

Senator Gage MOVED SB 22 DO PASS AS AMENDED.

- Senator Crippen said tax reform needs to be tax reform and not just a sham effort. He stoutly opposed tapping the coal trust fund and said this is just grasping at straws.
- Senator Norman voiced serious concerns about the constitutionality problem. He said the philosophy of

the bill is bad. The people voted on the coal tax trust fund and we cannot abrogate that decision. He also expressed concern that the money would be going to the big businesses, not for tax relief for the middle income taxpayer.

The MOTION FAILED on a roll call vote (Exhibit #6).

Senator Norman MOVED TO TABLE SB 22. The motion CARRIED with Senators Harp, Gage, and Brown voting no.
