HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 50

#### Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

"AN ACT PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO REIMBURSE MONEY LOST THROUGH PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX REDUCTION; INCREASING SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET SCHEDULES; AMENDING SECTIONS 17-7-502, 20-9-316 THROUGH 20-9-319, AND 20-9-343, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE".

Rep. Rehberg, House District 88, opened stating that this bill is being carried at the request of the Governor's office. He stated that this is the other half of the personal property tax relief. Rep. Rehberg stated what this bill essentially does is if the Legislature gives the personal property tax relief this bill is the mechanism that will reimburse the schools and the local governments will not be out any money. He stated that the capping of the Coal tax and Rep. Pavlovich's bill on the Progressive Focus Act would generate about \$40 million. Rep. Rehberg stated that Gordon Morris wanted to be on record in favor of this bill, he was in another meeting and could not be present to testify.
