Senator Crippen asked what the threshold is. Several committee members responded \$18,000, and Senator Eck indicated that the highest would be between \$26,000 and \$27,000. She then asked if there is anything on HB62 and, upon the response that there is not, she reported that an amendment will be proposed on the floor on HB62, maybe.

Senator Halligan indicated there is nothing in there on Social Security, so that is included in income to get to the thres-

hold. Mr. Martin responded on that portion which is taxed, that both Social Security and railroad retirement are from the federal law, and it is automatically in how they get adjusted gross income. Chairman Brown noted that it is a troublemaking bill, boys and girl.
