Announcements/Discussion: Welcome and agenda was given by CHAIRMAN ELLIOTT. It was agreed to have a no smoking policy during hearings. Committee rules and procedures were reviewed and adopted. Committee procedure for witnesses was reviewed.

A presentation was given by the Director of Fish, Wildlife and Parks, K. L. Cool. He introduced Pat Graham, Dave Mott and Don Hyyppa, FWP representatives for the legislative session. CHAIRMAN ELLIOTT informed Mr. Cool that the committee members would attend FWP open house on Thursday, January 10 at 4:30 p.m.

Doug Sternberg, Legal Services Division, discussed amendment procedures and how it is crucial that all amendments go through him. He will not have time to provide a summary of bills.

HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 17

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

REP. BOB REAM, House District 54, Missoula, explained that HB 17 would give the Fish and Game Commission the explicit legal authority to regulate bow hunting in Montana. Due to modern technological advances in this sport, FWP should have the authority to regulate it, as they are involved in this type of regulation on a daily basis.

Proponents' Testimony:

Don Chance, Montana Bow Hunters Association, said that bow hunting equipment is custom made by several hundred manufacturers and the technology is rapidly changing. There are controversies regarding bow hunting regulations and the proper type of bow hunting equipment. FWP should have the authority to regulate bow hunting because they routinely deal with these issues.

Jerry Taylor, Montana Bow Hunters Association, stated that regulations of use and type of archery equipment can be more effectively dealt with by the Fish and Game Commission through the public hearing process.

Scott Snelson, Montana Wildlife Federation, said FWP should regulate.

Jan Hamer, Montana Bow Hunters Association, explained that many people do not understand the sport of bow hunting, so it should be put in the hands of FWP, who are aware of the equipment used and how it is used.

K.L. Cool, FWP, spoke in favor of the bill. EXHIBIT 1
