Please Note: These are summary minutes. Testimony and discussion are paraphrased and condensed.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SJR 20

Motion: REP. STANG moved SJR BE CONCURRED IN.

Discussion: REP. WALLIN said he opposed changing the name from the Custer Battlefield to the Little Big Horn. CHAIRMAN SCHYE explained the name change is a directive from the US Congress and Rep. Marlenee is carrying the bill.

Vote: Motion CARRIED upon voice vote 15 to 5 with REPS. BENEDICT, CLARK, FELAND, HANSON, and WALLIN voting no.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SJR 17

Motion/Vote: REP. COCCHIARELLA moved SJR 17 BE CONCURRED IN. Motion CARRIED upon voice vote 16 to 4 with REPS. FORRESTER, STANG, BERGSAGEL and SIMPKINS voting no.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 456

Motion: REP. HARRINGTON moved SB 456 BE CONCURRED IN.

Motion: REP. DAILY moved to adopt amendments to SB 456. EDDYE MCCLURE explained the amendments. EXHIBIT 1

Discussion: Chip Erdmann addressed the amendment saying the only controversial section was the last portion dealing with the redemption of registered warrants. The language dealing with the redemption of registered warrants was deleted along with the approval of the State Board.

Vote: Motion CARRIED upon unanimous voice vote.

Motion/Vote: REP. STANG made a substitute motion SB 456 BE CONCURRED IN AS AMENDED. Motion CARRIED upon unanimous voice vote.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 395

Motion: REP. DAVIS moved SB 395 BE CONCURRED IN.

Discussion: REP. BENEDICT asked how this legislation relates to REP. SPRING'S bill. REP. ELLIS said it doesn't, explaining in that bill the property was already in the district. There were people in the small elementary district that didn't have the right to vote for the trustees representing them on the high school board.

Vote: Motion CARRIED upon voice vote 19 to 1 with REP. STANG voting no.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 389

Motion: REP. FORRESTER moved SB 389 BE CONCURRED IN.

Motion: REP. FORRESTER moved to adopt the amendments to SB 389. EXHIBIT 2

Discussion: REP. FORRESTER said organizations such as the Montana High School Association, School Administrators of Montana, (SAM), Montana School Boards Association, and Montana Rural Education Association should be exempt from state audits. These organizations presently have audits that are available for review.

CHAIRMAN SCHYE asked if current audits are open to the public. BRUCE MOERER, Montana School Boards Association, (MSBA), answered

the MSBA would allow the public to see their audit. MSBA follows the open meeting law. It would be counter productive not to have that information available.

REP. DAILY said the MSBA and SAM should not be excluded from state audits since they are funded with tax dollars.

REP. FORRESTER said school boards traditionally make their budgets available which includes the contribution of the MSBA. Once the state intrudes with an audit what is next? Can the state limit funds expended to these organizations?

Vote: Motion CARRIED 15 to 5. EXHIBIT 3

Motion/Vote: REP. FORRESTER made a substitute motion SB 389 BE CONCURRED IN AS AMENDED. Motion CARRIED upon voice vote 16 to 4 with REPS. DAILY, HARRINGTON, KILPATRICK and MCCARTHY voting no.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SJR 21

Motion: REP. HARRINGTON moved SJR 21 BE CONCURRED IN.

Discussion: CHAIRMAN SCHYE allowed REP. ANGELA RUSSELL, House District 99, Lodge Grass to present written testimony since she was unable to attend the hearing. EXHIBIT 4 She also presented amendments to SJR 21. EXHIBIT 5

REP. FORRESTER asked on what part of the journey Sacajawea and Charbonneau accompanied Lewis and Clark. REP. RUSSELL said they journeyed from the Mandan village, across Montana, and to the Columbia drainage.

REP. MCCARTHY said the signs on the trail presently say "Lewis and Clark" and asked if it would be necessary to change them. REP. RUSSELL said she would like to see all the signs changed eventually. All people in Montana need to be educated and made aware of the journey and its integral players. SJR 21 is a beginning.

REP. BENEDICT asked about conflict with the spelling of Sacajawea. REP. RUSSELL said Sacajawea is the anglicized name and to be technically correct it would be necessary to contact the Mandans.

REP. WALLIN said on the capitol grounds in Bismarck, North Dakota the statue for Sacajawea is spelled "Sakakawea". REP. RUSSELL said she has not seen the statue but the proper spelling of her name needs to be carefully researched.

REP. SIMPKINS said this change will confuse the years of hard work by the folks in Great Falls in order to bring about the 9.5 million dollar investment to build the Lewis and Clark Interpretive Center and the identifications along the trail. The statues raised in Fort Benton and Great Falls have paid

tribute to Sacajawea and the Interpretive Center has an extensive exhibit to her. This was a Lewis and Clark Expedition. To change everything that has been done so far could delay the project rather than encouraging the rapid release of funding.

Motion/Vote: REP. HARRINGTON moved to adopt amendments to SJR 21. Motion CARRIED 13 to 7. EXHIBIT 6

Motion/Vote: REP. HARRINGTON made a substitute motion SJR 21 BE CONCURRED IN AS AMENDED. Motion CARRIED upon voice vote 14 to 6 with REPS. BENEDICT, BERGSAGEL, CLARK, FELAND, HANSON and SIMPKINS voting no.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 143

Motion: REP. HARRINGTON moved SB 143 BE CONCURRED IN.

Discussion: REP. HARRINGTON said this legislation gives school districts the opportunity for a four day school week and is not mandatory.

REP. DAILY stated opposition saying the attention span of students is short enough and an additional two hours a day might prove detrimental to learning. It would also make a big difference if a student is absent for an eight hour day instead of the regular six. This legislation looks good on the surface but has hidden problems and the students will be the losers.

REP. MCCARTHY agreed with REP. DAILY and said teaching kids and keeping their attention is hard enough, especially in the primary grades, for five or six hours. If you add more time you will completely lose the attention of these children and that is not productive education.

Motion/Vote: REP. BERGSAGEL made a substitute motion TO TABLE SB 143. Motion CARRIED 17 to 3. EXHIBIT 7

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 127

Motion: REP. FELAND moved SB 127 BE CONCURRED IN.

Discussion: REP. ELLIS spoke in favor of the bill saying many areas are currently using part-time superintendents and this is one way of allowing local districts to control their way of doing business.

REP. DAILY spoke against the bill saying this is the third or fourth bill in committee to eliminate the county superintendents of schools. Perhaps next session the county school superintendents should bring legislation to eliminate the county commissioners.

Motion/Vote: REP. DAILY made a substitute motion TO TABLE SB 127. Motion CARRIED 12 to 8. EXHIBIT 8

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 117

Motion: REP. COCCHIARELLA moved SB 117 BE CONCURRED IN.

Discussion: REP. COCCHIARELLA said she disliked the idea of campus security guards carrying firearms but said they are police officers and are expected to perform as such. The only way any campus security officers will carry arms as the bill is written is if the student population approves.

REP. SIMPKINS asked if the students say no, does that take precedence over the university arming the security guards or does this legislation say university officials merely have to consult with the student body. EDDYE MCCLURE said the amendment simply says consult. The Board of Regents does listen to the students quite a bit and would defer a lot to them but nothing in the amendment says the students could say no guns and the board must comply with their wishes. It is just a consultation mandate.

Vote: Motion CARRIED 17 to 3. EXHIBIT 9

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 32

Motion/Vote: REP. DAILY moved SB 32 BE TABLED. Motion CARRIED upon voice vote 13 to 7 with REPS. BENEDICT, CLARK, ELLIS, FELAND, HANSON, SIMPKINS, and WALLIN voting no.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 287

Motion: REP. STANG moved SB 287 BE CONCURRED IN.

Discussion: REP. FORRESTER said he opposed SB 287 on the grounds to say home schooled students receive a superior education is an insult. They may receive a good education but it is not superior to that of their public school counterparts. REP. FORRESTER said he cannot support legislation based on these kinds of statements.

REP. BENEDICT said there is nothing in this bill stating they receive a superior education. This bill reaffirms their rights to home school and the responsibilities and rights of those parents who take on that opportunity. These folks continue to pay taxes to support the public education system.

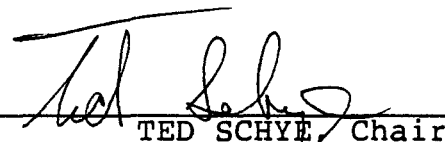
REP. WALLIN said the spelling champion of Gallatin County is a home schooled student which points to the validity of this alternative method of education.

REP. STANG said many of the same programs taught in public schools are taught in home schools in his district. The accreditation standards are specific in citing the fewer students in a class, the better the education. Over the years home school education has continued proving itself as a valid alternative.

Motion/Vote: REP. HARRINGTON made a substitute motion TO TABLE SB 287. Motion FAILED 7 to 13. EXHIBIT 10 CHAIRMAN SCHYE moved to reverse the vote. SB 287 BE CONCURRED IN 13 to 7. Motion CARRIED unanimously.

THE ROLE OF SACAJAWEA IN THE LEWIS AND CLARK ADVENTURE:

The Journals of the Expedition clearly show that Captains Lewis and Clark hired Baptiste Charbonneau and SACAJAWEA at the Mandan villages in the winter of 1804-1805 as interpreters, rather than as guides. The two leaders suspected that they would require Shoshoni horses to travel from the headwaters of the Missouri River to the headwaters of the Columbia drainage. And SACAJAWEA--as a contact agent--could facilitate that exchange. The Captains understood the crucial importance of this segment of the journey. For this reason, they permitted the young woman--carrying an 8-week-old son on a cradleboard--to join an expedition otherwise restricted to "good hunters; stout, healthy, unmarried men, accustomed to the woods and capable of bearing bodily fatigue in a pretty considerable degree."

What the Captains gained from the addition of SACAJAWEA to the Corps of Discovery far exceeded their expectations. She soon won the admiration and respect of the men for her efficiency, even temperament, loyalty, and hardiness. Her tangible contributions to the voyage were her language ability, her recognition of certain landmarks that helped to orient the Captains, and the incredible coincidence that a principal warrior of the Shoshonis turned out to be her brother. That reunion expedited the purchase of the vital horses from the Shoshonis--and it directly alleviated what could have been a much more disastrous crossing of the Bitterroot Mountains.
