HEARING ON SJR 30

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

SEN. ETHEL HARDING, Senate District 25, Polson, said the pause for the Pledge of Allegiance was started in 1980. Fifteen high school students from across the State of Montana drafted the Resolution.

Proponents' Testimony:

Nancy Coopersmith, Administrator, Curriculum Services Department, Office of Public Instruction (OPI), said Superintendent Keenan supports SJR 30. The Office has been involved with the Flag Day program for several years. It is important because the program teaches students the importance of our state and federal Constitutions and teaches the meaning of liberty, justice and equality for all people. It also helps them to recognize the importance of the privilege to vote when one is old enough and to exercise that privilege. It teaches respect for the minority rights under majority rule.

Opponents' Testimony: None

Questions From Committee Members:

REP. ROGER DEBRUYCKER asked SEN. HARDING why are just the years 1991 and 1992 included. SEN. HARDING said she carried this same Resolution two years ago, which was the idea of a constituent. It is a national program that began in 1980 that brings unity for everyone and involves kids in a patriotic gesture. They have been participating in this program for five years in Montana. It involves high-school seniors. OPI sends out information, and students who want to participate write essays. Fifty essays were written this year, and fifteen students came to Helena. They drafted their own resolution under the direction of Greg Petesch, Code Commissioner, Legislative Council.

REP. SOUTHWORTH said he didn't see the need of the Resolution. Isn't there a Flag Day now? SEN. HARDING said yes. That is the purpose. There will be a pause on Flag Day at 7:00 p.m. to salute the Flag. It is the kids' Resolution.

REP. KASTEN said perhaps another "Whereas" could be inserted to include the students from throughout the state who participated to give the resolution more meaning. SEN. HARDING presented the list of the students that drafted the Resolution. EXHIBIT 1. The Senate was in favor of the Resolution because they had students from their areas that had participated in the program. They took part not only in a Flag Day ceremony but in the legislative process.

REP. SPRING said when he first saw the Resolution, he questioned the need for it. He has changed his position since it was indicated that the students were involved. "We certainly need more patriotism."

Closing by Sponsor:

SEN. HARDING said she understood the line of questioning since the members of this Committee weren't "pulled" into the process by these young people. REP. ERVIN DAVIS will carry the bill.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SJR 30

Motion: REP. ROGER DEBRUYCKER MOVED SJR 30 BE CONCURRED IN.

Discussion:

REP. PHILLIPS said the school kids are involved, but school won't be in session on June 14. The students should be polled to determine if they would like to say the Pledge of Allegiance every morning — let the students vote and not the teachers. CHAIR BROWN said he could propose that next session. REP. PHILLIPS said if they could support it one day, then they should support it every day.

REP. KASTEN asked if it would be a great deal of trouble to pass the bill with an amendment. How much more time would it take? CHAIR BROWN said the rules have been suspended to accept this. If the Committee amended the Resolution, then it would have to go back to the Senate. Time is running short.

REP. BARNHART said if a bill isn't necessary, it shouldn't pass. It doesn't teach children a good lesson to vote for the bill for the reasons given. REP. SOUTHWORTH said he agreed; it is unnecessary.

REP. DAVIS said other bills that these kids have initiated have been supported. I would hate to send out a bad message saying that what is extremely important to these kids is completely unnecessary to us. He urged support of the bill even if some people think it is unnecessary. CHAIR BROWN said last session it was introduced earlier. The student who initiated the drafting of the bill attended the hearing.

SEN. HARDING said Terry Teichrow from OPI advised that one of the students who participated in writing the essays was now attending Eastern Montana College. Prior to being involved in this process, this student had never planned to go to college. Being part of the process gave the students a feeling of importance. He felt it was very good and that most of the kids do go on to higher education.

<u>Vote</u>: HJR 30 BE CONCURRED IN. Motion carried 17 to 2 with Reps. Barnhart and Southworth voting no.
