- Paul Verdon, Legislative Staff, responded to the question of fiscal notes. If any amendments are needed, they are to be requested by a committee member. Amendments will not be drawn up per request of a lobbyist.
- Chairman Weeding stated that he would request a fiscal note for Senate Bill 44.
