HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 331

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

Representative Tom Kilpatrick, sponsor of the bill, stated that this his what he calls his "Jeanie" bill. One of his friends named Jean owns a 1968 mustang convertible. She started getting calls from men, they were asking her name, they wanted to buy the car. They knew her name, they knew her phone number, and they knew where she lived. They got this information from the motor vehicle. She was very upset. There were many opponents in the house because they wanted the guarantee that they could get at the records if they needed to. A statement of intent was added to the bill. This bill gives the motor vehicle the right to decide who should get the information. The whole meat of the bill is on page four, line six.

Proponents' Testimony:

Dean Roberts, administrator of the motor vehicle division,

stated that they are in support of this bill.

Opponents' Testimony:

Gene Phillips, representing the national association of independent insurers, and the alliance of American insurers, stated that both associations represent insurers who cover problem casualty insurance in the state of Montana. It is necessary in evaluating the risk of being assumed writing an automobile policy that you have access to motor vehicle records. Both associations oppose any limitations on the use of information of motor vehicle records by an insurer. If there was something that could be put into this bill to make it clear that it does not restrict any information sought by the insurers, they would not object to the bill.

Questions From Committee Members:

Senator Lynch stated that he thinks that the associations that Gene Phillips mentioned were already out of it. The bill states that the department of justice is granted authority to reasonably restrict the rule. They are going to restrict it to the insurance companies.

Gene Phillips stated that he is not sure what their interpretation of "reasonably restrictive" is.

Senator Franklin stated that she feels that this is a worthy piece of legislation.

Senator Noble asked if you can call the department and get a list of a certain type of automobile.

Dean Phillips replied yes. He stated that they do have to state their name. The department has become somewhat more secure with that information.

Senator Noble asked if somebody calls, or writes in for all of the 1956 thunderbirds, is there a charge for that information.

Dean Phillips stated that they do have a charge. If they have to set the program up, the department would charge them a three hundred dollar fee, and thirty dollars additional for every thousand names. If you were to write in for an individual record, it would cost you six dollars. They do not give those records over the telephone anymore. The request has to be in writing.

Closing by Sponsor:

Representative Kilpatrick closed by saying that Senator Franklin will carry the bill if it passes.

HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 774

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

Representative Royal Johnson, sponsor of the bill, stated that the current law provides that you can manufacture gambling devices in the state of Montana no matter what those gambling devices do. You can manufacture gambling devices no matter if they are legal in the state, or not legal in the state. Non-legal gambling devices are shipped out of the state. Say that a manufacturer in the state of Montana ships twenty five machines to Las Vegas, Nevada. A year from now, that manufacturer perfects a different kind of machine, and goes down to Las Vegas to swap his machines. The law now prohibits that gambling device, because it is illegal in Montana to be shipped back into the state to be reconditioned.

Proponents' Testimony:

Bob Robertson, administrator of the gambling control division, stated that they worked with the sponsor and the originator of this bill. The federal Johnson act does prohibit the shipment of gambling device into the location where it is not legal.

Randy R $\,$, stated that this should be a great economic bill for Billings. The chamber of commerce of Billings in support.

Questions From Committee Members:

Senator Kennedy asked how many of these companies do we have right now.

Representative Kilpatrick stated that there are approximately four in the state.

Closing by Sponsor:

Representative Johnson closed by saying that Senator Keating has agreed to carry the bill to the senate if it passes.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HOUSE BILL 774

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HOUSE BILL 76

Motion:

Senator Kennedy moved to amend HB 76. Senator Hager moved HB 76 be concurred in as amended.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes:

Senator Lynch went over the amendments that were discussed at an informal meeting to make it fair with members of both sides (See attached copy of amendments).

Senator Lynch asked if Mona Jamieson wished to add anything to the amendments.

Mona Jamieson replied that the amendments are satisfactory. The amendments proposed by Senator Lynch passed unanimously.

Recommendation and Vote:

The motion that HB 76 be concurred in as amended passed unanimously. Senator Lynch will carry the bill to the floor.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HOUSE BILL 252

Motion:

Senator Noble moved to amend HB 252. Senator Gage moved that HB 252 be concurred in as amended. Senator Noble moved that HB 252 be reconsidered.

Discussion:

Senator Thayer stated that he served on that committee that studied on all the liens. He wonders why we have lien laws at all. Maybe lien laws should be eliminated completely. situation where you are going to have a secret lien is idiotic. The committee dealt with that issue, and the contractors and the people representing the trade came up with the idea of the notice of lien. It has worked beautifully for four years. Nobody has had any problems, and nobody has had to pay twice. We shouldn't be tampering with something that is working so well. The other problem with the bill now, is you have a situation where you are treating people differently. If you are the homeowner, and you have the contract directly with the contractor, you get twenty days. If it is a bank financed deal, it is forty five days. you allow people to break covenants that were made over a two year period, and a committee that worked very hard on this particular subject. They tried to come up with something that would be fair to everybody. We are setting up a situation where we are handling somebody else's accounts receivable.

Senator Gage stated that he would like to see some language that the person has received the notice of lien, perhaps by a registered letter.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes:

The amendments for HB 252 passed 8 to 1 vote.

Senator Kennedy stated that he talked with both sides about changing the forty five days to thirty days. Both sides seemed to be in agreement with that. It is a hidden lien type thing towards the homeowner. The forty five days slows down the paperwork in the closing of a loan. The building industry was interested because they could have a billing cycle, before they would have to put a lien on the property. Thirty days should be a sufficient time.

Senator Noble asked Senator Hager if he had any comments, because he was on the subcommittee that studied the liens.

Senator Hager replied that it was the toughest interim committee that he has ever been on. There was a lot of give and take.

Senator Gage stated that if the committee amended it back to thirty days, they would be defeating the purpose of the intent of the bill.

Recommendation and Vote:

The motion that HB 252 be concurred in as amended passed 6 to 3 votes. Senator Williams will carry the bill to the floor.

The motion to reconsider HB 252 passed 7 to 1 vote.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HOUSE BILL 816

Motion:

Senator Kennedy moved to amend HB 816.
Senator Noble moved HB 816 be concurred in as amended.

Discussion:

Senator Lynch stated that under a lemon law, you are not even talking about the tires. It is just the motor and chassis. The appliances and fixtures should be covered under warranty.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes:

Senator Gage stated that they would be too broad to put all of the fixtures, furnisher, etc.

The amendments proposed by Senator Lynch (See attached copy) passed unanimously.

Recommendation and Vote:

The motion made that HB 816 be concurred in as amended passed unanimously. Senator Bruski will carry the bill to the floor.
