Announcements/Discussion:

Chairman Jergeson announced that no bills would be heard today, but a presentation on genetically engineered microbes would be provided by Dr. Don Mathre of Montana State University.

Dr. Don Mathre, Acting Associate Dean for Research, Montana State University, and also a plant pathologist at the Agriculture Experiment Station for the past 23 years, stated he appreciated the invitation to appear before the Committee. He added it was a pleasure to inform them of things that are going on in the field of genetic engineering, and speak before a committee without requesting money. Dr. Mathre stated genetic engineering is here with us, Montana State University is involved with it, and he believes Montana farmers will see more dollars as a result of it in the not too distant future.

Assisting Dr. Mathre in the presentation was Dr. Bill Gray, a colleague from Monsanto Corporation, who was involved with the release of the genetically engineered organism in combating a disease in wheat.
