There should be a second sentence reading: "An inspection authorized by this section may not extend to communications between a pharmacist and his patient involving drug utilization counselling except as may be disclosed under 50-16-535 and 50-16-536." This would tie in to the protections available under the Uniform Health Care Information Act, that unless a judge had issued an investigative subpoena in a criminal investigation, the patient would have advance notice of the proposed inspection of this pharmacist's counselling notes and would have an opportunity to object to that inspection.
