EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HOUSE BILL 693

Motion:

Senator Jacobson moved adoption of the amendments denoted in Exhibit #1.

Discussion:

Senator Eck explained that these amendments were provided by the sponsor of the bill, Representative Fred Thomas, as technical amendments.

Tom Gomez explained the amendments denoted Exhibit #1. He said amendment #2 in Exhibit #1 would add that a limited benefit disability insurance policy is exempt from the mandates for insurance coverage that would be required by any other provision of law enacted by this Legislature, unless that provision specifically mandated coverage for policies issued under this bill. The other amendments are providing consistent language with the tax credit for businesses that provide limited disability insurance policies.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes:

There being no objection the motion carried.

Chairman Eck said the next set of amendments pertain to persons ordered to pay child support. See Exhibit #2.

Senator Towe said it should only pertain to court orders signed after the applicability date or the effective date of the act.

Senator Towe said Exhibit #2 should include the following language: "This subsection (e) applies only to orders or modifications of orders issued after July 1, 1991 by a court of administrative authority."

Senator Pipinich moved adoption of Exhibit #2 with the added language suggested by Senator Towe. There being no objections the motion carried.

Senator Towe asked about the fiscal impact of this bill.

Senator Jacobson said the fiscal impact has not been considered in the deliberations of the budget. She said it was not in the Governor's budget.

Senator Pipinich said he asked Representative Thomas that question several times and was told that the money was included in the Governor's budget.

Senator Jacobson said the fiscal impact of this bill has never been in the Governor's budget. She said this bill is part of the Governor's health care package. But the \$500,000 cost has never been in the Governor's budget. She said they continually asked his office about the fiscal note on this bill. She continued by saying she thought a coordinating clause between this bill and Senate Bill 151 was a good idea because of the money that would be raised by SB 151. She said it took a month for the budget office to write the fiscal note on HB 693.

Senator Pipinich said he would like to see the bill passed but said he was concerned about the fiscal impact.

Senator Jacobson said SB 151 raises revenue and does not expend the amount of money it raises. If coordinating language were adopted into HB 693 that would allow the revenue generated from SB 151, a source of monies would be identified to pay for this bill. She said if HB 693 passes with no money identified to pay for it, the conference committee on HB 2 will have to increase costs by \$500,000. That is the effect of passing this bill without a coordinating clause.

Senator Towe said HB 693 dealt primarily with tax credits, not direct revenues and that is what needed to be kept in mind.

Recommendation and Vote:

Senator Pipinich moved concurrence as amended. There being 7 ayes and 1 nay by Senator Burnett the motion carried.
