Ms. Kim Enkerud, Natural Resources Coordinator for the Montana Stockgrowers Association stated many people live in and visit Montana each year. Video from Montana Stockgrowers Association was shown regarding efforts made by cattlemen to improve the environment in Montana.

#### HEARING ON HB 251

## Opening Statement by Sponsor:

REP. ROBERT PAVLOVICH, House District 70, Butte, stated he was unaware legislation was passed in 1991 that made it illegal to keep shed antlers. He stated the main substance of the bill is found on page 3, line 6, which states, "the possession, transportation, sale, or purchase of naturally shed antlers or antlers with a skull or portion of a skull attached from a game animal that has not been unlawfully killed." REP. PAVLOVICH supports two amendments proposed by the Fish, Wildlife, and Parks Department.

## Proponents Testimony:

Mr. Pat Graham, Director of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, stated Subsection (c) in HB 251 was added as part of a comprehensive agreement with wildlife statutes from last session. He distributed written testimony (EXHIBIT 1).

Mr. Wayne Lumberg, Montana Taxidermy Association, stated all of his clients support HB 251, even those who are not hunters. It will not result in large monetary gains for taxidermists. Antlers and skulls are used in jewelry and for decoration. Artwork done by Indians has been displayed on the skulls. In discussion with other states' Fish and Game Departments, Mr. Lumberg found that other states allow people to collect winter killed or predator killed animals' antlers and skulls. In Colorado, people are allowed to collect road killed animals' antlers and skulls. Other states' laws are vague. Mr. Lumberg felt a law that made it illegal to collect and possess antlers and skulls will not aid in stopping poaching. He urged passing HB 251.

Mr. Richard Gensch, Vice-President of the Montana Taxidermy Association, said that HB 251 will aid the Department in stopping poaching. Game wardens are thinly dispersed throughout the state and the Department occasionally relies on private citizens to turn in poachers. He stated a person may poach a deer and later come to collect the antlers. Under current law, if the person is caught, he could be convicted of a lesser crime of possessing antlers. Mr. Gensch stated poachers must be caught in the act of poaching. Proving innocence of poaching should not rest on a citizen of Montana that has found a winter kill with skull and antlers attached.

Mr. Steve Rhodes, President of the Montana Taxidermy Association, displayed examples of winter killed animal's skull and antlers. He distributed written testimony (EXHIBIT 2).

Mr. Tony Schoonen, Butte Skyline Sportsmen Club, declared the organization's support of HB 251.

Mr. Jim Richard, Montana Wildlife Federation, declared the Federation's support of HB 251 and the Department's amendments.

Mr. Dale Burk, The Hunter's Alliance, stated he found the majority of people did not agree with the old law. The Alliance joins the Department in habitat enhancement and in the establishment, protection, and enforcement of wildlife laws. Mr. Burk felt the passage of the old bill was by oversight rather than careful study. He supports the revision of the law and the Department's proposed amendments.

Mr. L. F. Thomas, Anaconda Sportsmen Club, declared the Club's support of HB 251.

Mr. Tom Hardesty, Atchesoc Taxidermy, declared his support of HB 251 because of his concern that even a child could be criminally convicted for something as simple as finding and keeping skulls and antlers.

Mr. Mike Kelly, Sportsman presented a list of over 900 signatures from around the state in support of HB 251 (EXHIBIT 3).

Mr. Chris Basham, Montana Taxidermy Association, declared support of HB 251. He inquired why the Department does not want accidentally killed animals listed in the bill.

Opponents Testimony: None.

Informational Testimony: None.

## Questions From Committee Members and Responses:

CHAIRMAN MIKE FOSTER said that Mr. Doug Sternberg has explained the language "that has not been unlawfully killed" is a legal definition. CHAIRMAN FOSTER asked Mr. Graham if he was correct in his understanding that if an animal is run over, the rack Mr. Graham said yes. CHAIRMAN FOSTER stated cannot be removed. recently a herd of antelope was hit by a train. He asked Mr. Graham if he was correct that the same rules would apply to this situation. Mr. Graham said yes. CHAIRMAN FOSTER asked for the rationale of this. Mr. Graham referred the question to Mr. Irv Kent, Law Enforcement Division. Mr. Kent replied natural cause would include predatory kill or natural winter kill and the assumption can be made that a human did not kill the animal. concern of people picking animals up off the highway is that the people are not properly equipped with safety devices. Animals collected by the department are donated to schools, museums, or institutions of learning. They are used for research and educational purposes.

## Closing by Sponsor:

REP. PAVLOVICH thanked the people who testified in support of HB 251 and closed.

## EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HB 251

Motion: REP. MARION HANSON MOVED HB 251 DO PASS.

Motion: REP. ROBERT CLARK MOVED THE FIRST PROPOSED AMENDMENT DO PASS.

<u>Discussion</u>: REP. JIM ELLIOTT stated if the animal has not died accidentally, then the animal must have died of natural causes. It was REP. ELLIOTT's opinion that the second amendment did not make the bill more effective.

Motion: REP. CLARK WITHDREW MOTION OF PASSING PROPOSED FIRST AMENDMENT.

Motion: REP. EMILY SWANSON MOVED BOTH AMENDMENTS DO PASS.

#### Discussion:

REP. CLARK asked Mr. Kent what reference 87-3-110 on page 3, line 5 allows. Mr. Sternberg said it was an exception for registration of certain grizzly bears.

REP. SWANSON asked Mr. Kent if the reason collecting antlers from accidentally killed game is not allowed is because it is a question of legal possession. Mr. Kent said yes. The animal has not been killed unlawfully; however, the person does not have a legal right to possess it. REP. SWANSON commented if the amendments are not accepted and people are allowed to pick up accidentally killed animal's skulls and antlers, there could be a risk of litigation.

<u>Vote</u>: AMENDMENTS TO HB 251 DO PASS. Motion carried 15 to 2 with Reps. Clark and Wagner voting no.

<u>Vote</u>: HB 251 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Motion carried unanimously.

#### EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HB 123

Motion: REP. CLARK MOVED HB 123 DO PASS.

## Discussion:

CHAIRMAN FOSTER stated there were amendments provided by the REP. JOHNSON, the sponsor of HB 123, and by Ms. Janet Ellis, Montana Audubon.

Mr. Sternberg explained the first three amendments proposed by REP. JOHNSON expand the section of Yellowstone River which can be used for paddlefish roe donations. Amendments four through six specify the Intake fishing access site to be the only place paddlefish can be cleaned and roe donated to the program. Amendments seven through eleven revise the percentage split from 50/50 to 60/40 with the Department receiving 40% of the proceeds. Amendment twelve clarifies that the nonprofit organization's administrative costs will be paid from its share of the proceeds. Amendment thirteen strikes Subsection (e) entirely. The termination date was eliminated from Section 2.

REP. BRAD MOLNAR asked if the Department wanted to maintain the 50/50 split rather than change it to 60/40. CHAIRMAN FOSTER said that the proposed 60/40 split is an agreement between the nonprofit corporation and the Department. Mr. Graham confirmed the chairman's statement.

MOTION: REP. HANSON MOVED THE AMENDMENTS DO PASS.

MOTION: REP. ELLIOTT MOVED TO SEGREGATE AMENDMENTS 7 AND 10.

REP. SWANSON said that the net effect of the 60/40 split will be decreased revenue for the Department. However, the nonprofit corporation is obligated to reimburse the Department for administrative costs. Mr. Graham stated if the Department's share is less than approximately \$110,000, the nonprofit corporation will have to subsidize the Department's share of the proceeds in order to fully cover administrative costs. A reserve account has been created to cover the occasions where the Department would receive less money from the nonprofit organization. REP. SWANSON asked Mr. Graham if the 50/50 or 60/40 split is a more dependable arrangement. Mr. Graham said it's difficult to analyze. The 60/40 split "will keep the Department whole." However, in years where the profits are low, the 50/50 split would be better.

REP. BOB REAM asked Mr. Graham if the profits and the number of paddlefish caught will be greater since the fishing area will be expanded. Mr. Graham referred the question to Mr. Peterman. Mr. Peterman responded saying that the area will be expanded to Glendive. There is a railroad bridge which crosses there, and the constriction in the river causes the fish to stay. When there is high water, fish are able to get past the Intake diversion.

REP. REAM asked Mr. Peterman if the state funds were used for Dingell-Johnson grants. Mr. Peterman said no. They are used for the research program, enforcement program, and other improvement projects at the Intake fishing access site.

REP. ELLIOTT expressed his concern that three years was not enough time to collect data regarding changing the split. He felt that it may not be easy in the future to reverse the change in the percentage split. He said that he would like to see the 50/50 split continue for a few years in order to collect more data.

REP. CHASE HIBBARD asked Mr. Graham how the Department has spent its share of the proceeds. Mr. Graham replied the money has been spent on contracted research, law enforcement, and cooperative projects improving the Intake fishing access area. Also, \$5,000 will be spent on the visitor center at Makoshika for educational purposes. REP. HIBBARD inquired if the Department can account for the money on a yearly basis. Mr. Graham gave the following list of expenditures: domestic water well Intake fishing access

site - \$8,980; boat ramp extension Intake fishing access site \$1,595; research contract - \$12,802; septic tank installation Intake fishing access site - \$3,231; research contract - \$13,872; research contract - \$8,466; research contract - \$25,759; and Makoshika State Park Paddlefish display - \$5,000. REP. HIBBARD asked if the expenditures were over a three year period. Mr. Graham said during the first couple of years the department did not receive income from the program. It used money from the general license account to fund law enforcement and other activities. Two other expenses the Department funds are the biologist that works at the Intake site and the ongoing census work. REP. HIBBARD asked if the research programs were for the paddlefish. Mr. Graham said yes.

REP. CLARK asked Mr. Graham that if there are wardens already working in the area, why is there additional cost in law enforcement. Mr. Graham replied that additional enforcement has been hired to help stop the illegal harvesting that is taking place and provide adequate coverage for the program. REP. CLARK asked Mr. Graham if the additional law enforcement was beneficial. Mr. Graham said it has helped. People can see that extra officers are on duty. REP. CLARK asked how many wardens were in the Intake area. Mr. Graham said two. REP. CLARK inquired if the wardens worked additional time. Mr. Graham said yes. The Department is considering contracting with the local law enforcement. REP. CLARK felt that since the wardens were already there, the money should be directed towards paddlefish research. Mr. Graham said more intensive enforcement is supplied.

REP. MOLNAR asked Mr. Graham about an \$8,000 contract. Mr. Graham replied that the contract is with the University of Idaho and is a joint 5-year research project with North Dakota. REP. MOLNAR asked if the research could have been completed in-house. Mr. Graham said that the basic monitoring program could have. However, it is more cost effective to have students completing the survey and research work. Biologists have been hired to monitor the census.

REP. DOUG WAGNER asked Mr. Graham if all of the money received from the paddlefish program has been spent. Mr. Graham said that not all funds have been spent. Some funds have been set aside in a reserve account.

REP. CLARK asked Mr. Peterman how much money from the Dingell-Johnson (DJ) fund are being used in the paddlefish program. Mr. Peterman replied he did not have the figures with him. DJ funds have been used in completing a paddlefish census since 1972. Nine months of study on the paddlefish spawning habits and on young paddlefish are done on the Missouri River and three months of study are done at the Intake fishing access site. REP. CLARK inquired if there is research being completed at Slippery Ann. Mr. Peterman said a census has been completed every four or five years at Slippery Ann. The Department is getting ready to

complete a census and gather harvest information at Slippery Ann every year. The Department is working on a program that studies the concentration of paddlefish at Fort Peck.

- REP. REAM supports the motion to segregate amendments seven and ten. He stated the emphasis should remain on the research of paddlefish. Because of illegal intrastate trade, there may be need for undercover work. CHAIRMAN FOSTER commented the 60/40 split would be a better choice because the Department will be made whole for its expenses.
- REP. HANSON agreed with the Chairman. The Department has worked out the agreement with the nonprofit organization.
- REP. MOLNAR inquired if the agreement has been written out so that the nonprofit corporation cannot renege or modify the agreement. Mr. Graham replied no force of law is behind the agreement. REP. JOHNSON, sponsor of the bill, replied that in the three years the program has existed, memorandums of understanding have been drawn between the Department and the nonprofit organization. The agreements have been upheld by both sides.
- REP. BEVERLY BARNHART asked REP. JOHNSON if greater profit margin was the motivation for the nonprofit corporation to request the 60/40 split. REP. JOHNSON replied the 60/40 split in a good year will benefit both parties. The nonprofit corporation is obligated to make the Department whole for its expenses.

<u>VOTE</u>: ROLL CALL VOTE TO SEGREGATE THE 7TH AND 10TH AMENDMENTS. Motion was defeated 8 to 8.

<u>VOTE</u>: **ROLL CALL VOTE ON AMENDMENTS IN THEIR ENTIRETY.** Motion passed 11 to 5.

MOTION: REP. SWANSON MOVED to add an amendment on page 6, line 11, "and terminates June 30, 1997."

#### **DISCUSSION:**

REP. DUANE GRIMES asked Mr. Graham how much authority does the Department have in regard to limiting licenses or closing the project due to paddlefish endangerment. Mr. Graham replied more restrictive measures have been implemented. At the beginning, two paddlefish per day was the limit. It is now two per season per person, and each must be tagged. The joint project with North Dakota will ascertain the impact harvesting the paddlefish has had on its population. REP. GRIMES asked when it changed from a two per day to two per season limit. Mr. Graham said between 1982 and 1983.

REP. DICK KNOX inquired if the research indicates the population is in danger, does the Department have the authority to further limit the catch or terminate paddlefishing. Mr. Graham said that

the Fish, Wildlife, and Parks Commission has that authority to limit the catch and to terminate the program.

CHAIRMAN FOSTER commented that one item the nonprofit corporation found important was the ability to sign a ten-year contract to be able to obtain a good price for the roe. He felt the sunset, if any at all, should be a ten-year sunset. It will give the legislature another look at the project, and the corporation will accomplish the revenue enhancement it seeks.

REP. GRIMES said that he would support that idea. In his discussion with the corporation's accountant, he said with a ten year sunset a better contract could be negotiated. A ten year sunset, however, would not allow the corporation time to market the caviar itself. He felt a ten year sunset would provide a better contract for the corporation but would not provide unlimited opportunities for marketing the caviar themselves.

CHAIRMAN FOSTER asked REP. JOHNSON to respond to the ten year sunset issue. REP. JOHNSON said an unlimited time would be ideal. However, with a 10 to 12 year sunset period, a long-term contract could be negotiated.

REP. SWANSON withdrew her motion of sunset date June 30, 1997.

MOTION: REP. SWANSON MOVED TO EXTEND THE SUNSET DATE TO JUNE 30, 2003.

#### DISCUSSION:

REP. CLARK stated that as long as the Department has the authority to close the paddlefish program and the contract has provisions for this, he felt no sunset date is needed.

REP. SWANSON remarked the main argument for having a sunset is that there is momentum that builds as the program grows. The corporation would invest a great deal of capital in starting the marketing of the caviar themselves. If the program is terminated at this point, a lot of money would be lost. More observation of the program could be completed with the 10 year sunset.

REP. WILLIAM RYAN stated the paddlefish are stable, and the corporation and the community are doing well with the current program. He, therefore, supports the four year sunset.

REP. KNOX asserted his concern for the paddlefish and supports the ten year sunset.

REP. MOLNAR stated that he was largely concerned about the depletion of the paddlefish and supported the four year sunset.

**REP. HIBBARD** felt that the 10 year sunset is reasonable. It would give the legislature a chance in the future to review the program and make adjustments, if any are necessary.

MOTION: REP. REAM MADE A SUBSTITUTE MOTION TO EXTEND THE SUNSET DATE TO JUNE 30, 1997.

REP. CLARK asked Mr. Graham if the program lasts a longer period of time, will more research be accomplished by the Department. Mr. Graham replied money is provided for law enforcement and research.

REP. WAGNER asked Mr. Peterman if any roe is collected for the continuation of the paddlefish species. Mr. Peterman said that none is collected at this particular area. Reproduction of the paddlefish is good as long as there is a healthy river system.

REP. BARNHART asked Mr. Graham if the fishing can be shut down the year the paddlefish is endangered or would it be the year after. Mr. Graham said the Commission could take emergency action whenever the need arises. Mr. Sternberg said that under the Fish, Wildlife, and Parks Commission's statutory authority. The discontinuation of selling tags could occur anytime. It would effectively close the program because only lawfully tagged paddlefish can be used to donate roe.

<u>VOTE</u>: **ROLL CALL VOTE ON SUBSTITUTE MOTION.** Motion was defeated 7 to 9.

<u>VOTE</u>: ROLL CALL VOTE ON MOTION FOR SUNSET DATE JUNE 30, 2003. Motion was passed 15 to 1.

MOTION: REP. HANSON MOVED HB 123 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Motion passed with Reps. Barnhart, Ream, Elliott, and McCarthy voting no.

## HB 251 January 26, 1993

Testimony presented by Pat Graham, Dept. of Fish, Wildlife & Parks before the House Fish & Game Committee

HB 251 would amend Section 87-3-111 to allow the possession, transportation, sale, or purchase of antlers and attached skulls from game animals that have not been unlawfully killed.

The Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks has the responsibility to protect and manage the wildlife resource of Montana. In part, that responsibility is to enforce game laws to protect our wildlife resource. During the course of covert investigations conducted in 1991, the department confirmed that individuals were illegally killing trophy game animals, leaving them in the field, and picking up the heads later, claiming they were winterkills.

The department requested legislation during the 1991 session to address this illegal practice. This resulted in an amendment to 87-3-111 limiting lawful possession of pick up antlers to only naturally shed antlers. The purpose of this legislation was directed to illegal violators, and was not intended to restrict the opportunities of honest, well-intentioned persons from picking up naturally shed antlers. The department needs the support of all sportsmen, landowners, and other outdoor enthusiasts toward legislation that helps to reduce the illegal killing of big game animals.

The department is proposing language that offers a compromise to allow lawful possession of attached skulls and antlers from animals that have died from natural causes, yet still prohibits possession where the game animal was illegally killed, or where the game animal was killed by a motor vehicle.

We propose amending sub section (2)(c) to read "or the antlers with a skull or portion of a skull attached from a game animal that has died from natural causes, that has not been unlawfully or accidently killed."

With this amendment, the department supports HB 251.

When the snow melts this spring, Montanans will return to the outdoors to hike, fish, and hunt. In their wanderings they will find some antlered souvenirs of their hikes. The dellar amount of these restorations varies from \$50 to \$700 per mount. The money goes directly at paying bills and purchases in small towns all over the State. The actual dobbar amounts vary from business to business, but over time it amounts to a large sum. Saving, restoring and mounting these naturally found deer and elk antlers is the best possible use of that resource. Lets not let them rot.

House Bill 251 is a good common sense correction by the people of an unacceptable and bad law. A majority of Montanans support this correction. Our customers and communities fill up petition sheets in support at a rapid pace. Every person you talk to would like to be able to pick up and keep these natural finds. HB251 is the right thing to do.

The Montana Taxidermists Association respectfully asks this committee to help pass HB251 and restore the ring of common sense, support our Montana Taxidermists bebusinesses, and fulfill the wishes of the people.

Every person should think of what you would do if you found a winter-killed deer or elk rack this spring. Lets not lettit rot.
