My plight started when my husband of ten (10) years abandoned me with no money, no car, no job, in bad health, with no insurance. This was in December, 1990. I filed for divorce and in January, 1991, the judge refused me maintenance. I applied for State Medical in January, 1991 and went to the doctor to find out what was happening to my body.

In March, 1991, I applied for Food Stamps. I applied for Social Security Disability and applied for Vocational Rehabilitation for training. Then on May 27, 1991, I had a serious heart attack and in June, I applied for General Assistance.

I was referred to the Project Work Program in July, 1991 and went through the program.

The program (staff at PWP) gave me the following:

- 1. Reason to live
- 2. Self asteem
- 3. Exposure to job sites and potential employers
- 4. Clothes to enhance my appearance

But more than that, the caring attitude of the PWP staff said, "I was important".

In August, 1991, I applied to the Older Worker Program, at age 55. In the meantime, Vocational Rehabilitation paid for me to take two (2) classes at Vo-Tech.

PWP applied to the Older Worker Program for a part-time OJT position for a Food Stamp/Job Search Coordinator. I applied for the position and was hired in October, 1991.

In February, 1992, I was determined disabled due to Spinal Stenosis and heart problems.

I have a purpose, I have a life and I have a dream, made possible by General Assistance, Food Stamps and State Medical and the very caring people at Froject Work which I am proud to be a part of. Therefore, please don't turn your back or tighten your legislative purse strings.

General Assistance is not away of life. it is a helping hand to those that need it for a short time.

I have not been able to find a permanent full-time job in my field for about a year and one half. The Project Work Program has been very good at keeping my spirits up and showing me new avenues for looking for employment. They have a very knowledgeable staff that really cares about the people on the program. They do a real good job of weeding out the people who are there just to pick up a check.

Stepping forward and talking to you is probably one of the toughest things I have done. It's not easy for me to ask for help, but I am glad that there is an organization out there to help single adults who are willing to work but are having a tough time finding it. I don't know what I would have done if there wasn't the Project Work Program.
