Committee Business Summary:

Hearing: SB 292
Executive Action: HB 689, HB 690, HB 691, SB 71, SB 94, SB 292

HEARING ON SB 292

An Act including administrative costs in the statutory appropriation for the youth detention services grant program.

Opening Statement by Sponsor: SEN. HARRY FRITZ, S.D. 28,
Missoula said this is a Committee Bill from the General

Government and Transportation Subcommittee. It is a technical Bill and the current law holds that about 9.1% of lottery proceeds go to the Board of Crime Control and passed through for the youth detention services grant program. The Board of Crime Control has been paying the costs of administering grants out of those proceeds which was the intent of the legislature but is not specifically spelled out so the LFA flagged it. All this Bill does is say the administration costs can be paid out of the grant. The fund is capped at \$1 million. So far it's been about \$600,000 and the cost of administering the grants is about \$50,000 which is less than 10%. The Office of Budget and Program Planning provided some amendments.

Proponents' Testimony: Ed Hall, Administrator, Board of Crime Control, said the matter brought up by the LFA in the subcommittee was what had happened in prior sessions regarding administrative costs. The amendments the Budget office is proposing are to clarify that administrative costs are appropriated in the general appropriations act, consistent with legislative and executive policy for operating budgets. The state grants to counties continue to be statutorily appropriated.

Opponents' Testimony: None

Questions From Committee Members and Responses: REP. WISEMAN asked why it costs 8% in funds to administer? Mr. Hall said the moneys are used to implement SB 37 for regional juvenile detention. Those regions have to set up plans on how they are going to fund their juvenile detention services, part of which may be secured detention which is matched at 50-50 ratio from the state and the local funds. There may be non-secure alternatives to a jail-like environment at which time the state pays 75% and the local pays 25%. It is not just cutting a check and sending it to them, there are monitoring responsibilities to make sure the kids are placed in detention, meet the criteria to be placed in detention, generally making sure the children are appropriately cared for. REP. WISEMAN said there has been a "donnybrook" in Great Falls over the detention center. Why wasn't the state there to help? Mr. Hall said staff from his office was there. The grants do not pay for capital construction, only for the care of the youth. The capital construction and all related construction problems are up to the county in that region.

REP. ROYAL JOHNSON said some money has been spent on that project in the last two or three years to get it going in form of grants to the planners.

REP. DeBRUYCKER said he thought lottery, after paying the prizes and commission etc, went into the school fund. When did it start going to crime control? Mr. Hall said last session is when it started and the first year of the biennium the Department of Crime Control received 1.6% to start their planning. This year it went up to 9.1% and that's what it stays at. REP. DeBRUYCKER

asked if the legislature did this last session to put in 1.6% as a startup and after that it went to 9%? **Mr. Hall** said that is correct. Basically this was done in SB 37 last session, which was a result of the Interim Committee.

REP. WISEMAN said if anyone else in the state starts to do one of these homes, he would suggest good advice be given as Great Falls has been a fiasco.

REP. PECK asked **Mr. Hall** if consideration had been given in terms of FTE, budget etc. when this responsibility was assigned to him? **Mr. Hall** said it was his understanding that when SB 37 was proposed there was a fiscal note for one FTE and approximately \$49,000 in administrative costs. That just wasn't clear in the language when it set up statutory appropriation. So when it went through the budgeting session in subcommittee, Clayton Schenck, Fiscal Analyst, thought it would be best to clarify that. **REP. PECK** said this language says it is statutorily appropriated if this amendment is put in there. **Mr. Hall** said it is his understanding it is already statutorily appropriated. This allows them to use a portion of the statutory appropriation for administrative purposes. **REP. PECK** asked if they are currently spending that money and are saying you are not sure you have the authority to use it? **Mr. Hall** said that is correct.

REP. BARDANOUVE asked how much does it cost to administer this program? **Mr. Hall** said there are five regions in the state. One in Billings, Great Falls is planning their facility, Missoula is using the Kalispell facility and the rest of the state; Butte, Bozeman and Anaconda are using either the Bozeman jail or the Billings facility.

REP. ROYAL JOHNSON asked if they would need an increase in staff? **Mr. Hall** said no. The FTE authorized last Session is currently employed.

REP. PETERSON said in the Federal guidelines they require the reporting. It hasn't been Montana requiring all the reporting. There will be more emphasis put on the careful placement and the analysis of what treatment the youth need.

REP. KADAS asked for an explanation of the amendments. **Mr. Patrick, OBPP**, said the purpose of the amendment is to further clarify how the administrative expenses are to be appropriated. The grant portion would be subject to statutory appropriation. **REP. KADAS** said the affect of this amendment would be the program would continue to be funded from the statutory appropriation but would require legislative approval. **Mr. Patrick** said it would be funded from this source of revenue.

Closing by Sponsor: **SENATOR FRITZ** closed.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 292

Motion/Vote: REP. BARDANOUE moved to adopt the amendment.
EXHIBIT 1. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion: REP. KADAS pointed out that REP. DeBRUYCKER raised a question why did we have to set up a statutory appropriated program out of lottery funds that were supposed to go for K-12. If you ever wanted to change that this would be the opportunity.

Motion/Vote: REP. BARDANOUE moved SB 292 DO PASS AS AMENDED.
Motion passed 13 to 5 with Reps. Cobb, DeBruycker, Kasten, Menahan and Peck voting no.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 71

Motion: REP. MENAHAN moved to adopt the amendment, **EXHIBIT 2.**

Discussion: REP. BERGSAGEL asked if the legislature takes action whereby the staff is reduced and does that count toward our taking half of the moneys that will be saved? **Jim Haubein, LFA** said this is FTE that are reduced by a department director. It is strictly an executive decision. This would allow them to keep half of that funding. When a position is reduced by a director it's not automatically taken out of the budget so there needs to be some sort of language to allow that. That was **Ms. Cohea's** suggested amendment. Otherwise 100% of that funding of that position is still in the budget. **REP. MENAHAN** said SB 71 takes half of that money back. **Mr. Haubein** said the Bill states one-half, however, there is no mechanism to reduce the budget in the Bill. That's what this amendment would do. The 100% of position would remain there even though the position was gone and a director could use 100% of it. If the language is in there it will reduce that to 50.

REP. WISEMAN said he has not received an answer to **REP. BERGSAGEL's** question. That is if we the legislature cut a position do they still get to keep half. **REP. MENAHAN** said the amendment will do that.

REP. KADAS said they are dealing with the budget and have to start when the legislature leaves. The legislature passes the appropriation Bill and that provides the FTE authority and at that point is where they start. **Mr. Haubein** said the effective date doesn't start until July 1.

Vote: Motion passed unanimously.

Motion: REP. MENAHAN moved SB 71 DO PASS AS AMENDED.

Discussion: REP. PETERSON referred to her notes and on Page 4 "in either of the two fiscal years of the biennium" and has it been addressed in the amendments? **REP. MENAHAN** said it hasn't but is still needed. He said after the word "department" should insert "in either of the two fiscal years of the biennium". **REP. KASTEN** said another suggestion was the words "not critical" be

deleted. REP. NELSON said lines 22, 23, Page 3 "are not critical to delivery of direct services". If that portion is deleted it would read better.

Vote: Motion passed unanimously.

Motion/Vote: REP. PETERSON moved SB 71 DO PASS AS AMENDED.
Motion passed unanimously.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HB 689

Motion: REP. FISHER moved to adopt the amendment. (Line 11, Page 1, take out "eliminating the dangerous drug tax" and change whichever statutes that go along with that.)

Vote: Amendment is adopted with a unanimous vote.

Discussion: REP. FISHER said they need to make a change and might be easier to make it here instead of waiting to make it in HB 2. After this bill was put in another bill was proven it had a conflict. REP. PETERSON said REP. STRIZICH moved in HB 2 that a portion of this bill that was going to restrict the revenue collection on drugs, he and others have a plan to actively pursue that source of revenue which has not been done. She thinks it's in HB 2 now.

REP. KASTEN said if we assume that \$2,800 per item on the income tax will go toward administration costs and Section 3 only brings in \$1,600 does that mean we should either eliminate Section 3 or will that mean some administration costs will come out of the other Sections because Section 3 is not bringing in the amount or maybe eliminate anything that doesn't bring in a certain amount.

CHAIRMAN ZOOK said he would have to surmise the other Sections are supporting that one. REP. BARDANOUVE said he supposes there is no way they can eliminate, in this Bill, a public campaign check-off.

REP. KADAS said it would be a question of whether the title is broad enough.

REP. FISHER asked the LFA to refer to Line 11, Page 1 and take out the words "eliminating the dangerous drug tax" and then change all the statutes to go along with that.

REP. PECK asked if that is what REP. STRIZICH said was a court interpretation that has now been questioned and there is revenue available in this as a result of further court appeal. REP. FISHER said yes, when the subcommittee first addressed this the department said they didn't think there was enough money coming in and weren't collecting enough to make it worthwhile. In the meantime, after it finished the subcommittee it was taken out of HB 2. Yesterday the department asked her to take this out.

REP. QUILICI said when they testified before the committee they said they didn't think there was enough money in this tax to worry about. With the passage of REP. STRIZICH's Bill it looks like there may be enough money. Mr. Haubein said the other change is on Page 9, Section 9 which strikes "repealer" so that all the statutory language related to that drug tax is left in the bill.

REP. KASTEN asked if that still has a limitation that it has to bring in \$20,000 a year for each year of the biennium in order to stay in the statutes. Mr. Haubein said he is not sure of that.

Motion: REP. KASTEN moved to eliminate Section 3 and all other parts of the statute that would refer to it.

Vote: Motion passed unanimously.

Discussion: REP. KADAS asked if it was her intent to eliminate "public campaign" or eliminate "taking administrative costs from public campaign"? REP. KASTEN said to eliminate the campaign fund.

REP. WISEMAN asked for a review of how much money this brings in each year and what the program costs. CHAIRMAN ZOOK said it brings in \$1,600 to this program.

REP. KADAS asked if anyone knows how long this program has been in place. REP. QUILICI thought since 1987.

Motion/Vote: REP. FISHER moved HB 689 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Motion carried unanimously.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HB 690

Motion: REP. ROYAL JOHNSON moved DO PASS.

Motion/Vote: REP. WISEMAN said he has an amendment and said Item 1 would read a little better "the school upon request, shall" and strike may. Items 2 and 3 read all right. REP. WISEMAN moved to adopt the amendment. Motion adopted unanimously.

Motion/Vote: REP. WISEMAN moved HB 690 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Motion carried unanimously.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HB 691

Motion: REP. COBB moved to adopt an amendment to allow Line 15 to say "must be accompanied by at least a fee equaling 0.3%" and strike the special revenue account and eliminate the earmarking.

Discussion: REP. COBB referred the Committee to Line 15, "must be accompanied by a fee" and it should say "must be accompanied by at least a fee equaling 0.3%" and that allows them to charge a higher amount. He would also strike lines 24, 25 special revenue

fund out.

Vote: Motion carried unanimously to adopt the amendments.

Motion/Vote: REP. COBB moved HB 691 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Motion passed unanimously.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON SB 94

Motion/Vote: REP. COBB moved SB 94 DO PASS AS AMENDED. SB 94 DO PASS AS AMENDED 14 to 4 with REPS. DeBRUYCKER, MENAHAN, PETERSON AND WANZENRIED voting no.

Motion/Vote: REP. PETERSON moved an amendment to repeal or eliminate Sections 2, 3 and 4 if HB 427 passes. Motion to adopt amendment passed 16 to 2 with Reps. Menahan and Quilici voting no.

Discussion: CHAIRMAN ZOOK said Mr. Haubein will put contingency language in.

Motion: REP. KADAS moved to strike Section 1, SB 94.


Discussion: REP. QUILICI said the first part of Section 1, in order to be eligible for general relief, any county that is not a state assumed county, a person must have a serious medical condition and how do you determine that. REP. KADAS said one of the main things these counties are likely to want to do if they are going to do any medical programs for indigents are preventative medical programs. This clearly says they cannot do preventative programs. Mr. Haubein asked REP. KADAS for a point of clarification. If you strike Section 1 do you need Section 5?

Vote: Motion passed 16 to 2 to adopt the amendment with REPS. PETERSON and ZOOK voting no.

Motion/Vote REP. BERGSAGEL moved to take SB 147 off the Table. Motion failed.
