Committee Business Summary:

Hearing: HB 56, HB 59, & HB 64

Executive Action: HB 56, HB 59, & HB 64

HEARING ON HB 59

Opening by Sponsor:

REP. STEVE BENEDICT, District 64, Hamilton, said this bill requires the electors of each elementary school district within the boundaries of a high school district to vote in the 1994

trustee elections and at 10 year intervals thereafter on whether to annex the elementary district with the elementary district where the county high school building is located. It also requires the electors of a county high school district to vote in the 1994 trustee elections and at 10 year intervals thereafter on whether to unify the county high school district with the elementary school district where the high school building is located.

PROPONENTS:

Bob Anderson, Montana School Boards Association, said this bill was a serious attempt to allow Montanans an opportunity to determine the future of their elementary and county high school districts. The people will be required to decide whether their elementary school district should consolidate through annexation with another elementary school district and whether their county high school should unify with their elementary school district. This legislation retains local decision. It also shares the opportunity and responsibility with the people to streamline their own government through the ballot box. Mr. Anderson also presented a school reorganization booklet and a list of the elementary schools in Montana. EXHIBITS 1, 2 and 3

Rick Bartos, Attorney for Montana School Boards Association, distributed information on annexation, consolidation, unification and a whole host of problems schools face. He discussed various forms of districts, including elementary, joint elementary districts, high school districts, and non-operating districts and abandoned districts. EXHIBITS 4, 5, 6 and 7

Ernie Jean, Superintendent of Schools, Florence, and President, Montana Association of School Administration, supported this bill. It forces local boards to face issues where in many circumstances that has not been the case.

Linda Brannon, Montana Association of School Business Officials, said she fully supports this bill because it opens communication between the schools and administrators.

Don Waldron, Montana Rural Education Association, urged support for HB 59.

Craig Brewington, Superintendent of Schools, Hellgate Elementary School, said this bill lets local taxpayers make their own rules. He presented a summary and comparison chart for schools in Montana. EXHIBIT 8

Don Spritzer, Trustee, Missoula School District 9, stated that this bill will include some consolidation. It forces the issue This issue is significantly more important to taxpayers because they deserve the opportunity to have a say in this through an election.

Loren Frazier, School Administrators of Montana, said the association have studied this issue for several years. He said the association supports HB 59.

Glen Anderson, Choteau School District, supports HB 59.

OPPONENT:

Eric Feaver, Montana Education Association, said that all high schools might have independent elementary schools within their boundaries. He offered several amendments to the bill.

QUESTIONS:

REP. DAVIS questioned the ten-year period and asked about the amendments.

Mr. Bartos said that things change in a district within a tenyear period.

REP. ELLIS referred to various schools and noted the discrepancies between the various charts. He said it makes a big difference whether this information is presented to the people before they vote.

Mr. Bartos said that under unification and consolidation laws now in effect, there is not a specific requirement other than it is part of the public record.

CHAIRMAN HANSON questioned Andrea Merrill about the amendments.

Andrea Merrill said the amendments were technical and explained each of them.

Closing by Sponsor:

REP. BENEDICT closed by saying that HB 59 will eliminate duplication. This bill lets districts decide when and where to consolidate, and let the schools decide when and where to consolidate.

HEARING ON HB 56

Opening by Sponsor:

REP VICKI COCCHIARELLA, District 59, Missoula, said this bill clarifies the mandatory approval for attendance outside a child's school district of residence will not required if certain geographic conditions are met, and if the district of residence provides transportation and is within the same county as the child's school district of choice.

PROPONENTS:

Rachael Viellux, County Superintendents Association, said that some problems developed because of the measure from the 1993 session; it is necessary to clarify and simplify who was removed from the law and who should have stayed in. The attempt was not to change anything, but to clarify past legislation.

Daryl Bertelsen, Superintendent of Schools, Belt School District, noted that large schools districts have been built right on the edge of Great Falls so now there are students who attend the Great Falls school system.

Don Waldron, Montana Rural Education Association, supports HB 56.

Loren Frazier, School Administrators of Montana, stated his support to HB 56.

Bob Anderson, Montana School Board Association, supports HB 56.

Penny Bertelsen, Superintendent, Sun River Valley Schools, supports this bill.

OPPONENTS:

None.

QUESTIONS:

REP. WYATT asked for an explanation of what the advantages are for the larger school districts.

Ms. Brannon said it was the parents responsibility to pay the transportation of their children to school.

Closing by Sponsor:

REP. COCCHIARELLA closed by distributing a copy of the fiscal note and explained what it does. EXHIBIT 10

Loren Frazier, School Administrators of Montana, stated his support for HB 64.

Eric Feaver, Montana School Board Association, said the association supports HB 64.

OPPONENTS:

None.

REP. KADAS closed on HB 64.

Testimony by Bob Anderson, MSBA House Education Committee - HB 59 (12/8/93)

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

For the record, I am Bob Anderson for the Montana School Boards Association speaking in support of HB 59.

Almost exactly one year ago I talked with former Governor Ted Schwinden about doing a study on the topic of school consolidation. This conversation took place because the members of the association, during their Delegate Assembly and later at their annual business meeting in 1992, adopted a resolution that stated:

RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF THE DEBATE ON CONSOLIDATION AND UNIFICATION, MSBA WILL DEVELOP A PROPOSAL TO SUBMIT WITHIN 12 MONTHS TO THE LEGISLATURE AFTER CONSIDERATION AND FEEDBACK FROM INDIVIDUAL DISTRICTS AND OTHER INTERESTED PARTIES.

Schwinden spent the next four months pouring over any data he could get his hands on to review this delicate matter.

At the end of April this year he published his report ... and we sent a copy to every member of this committee.

In May, Governor Schwinden and I traveled across the state to discuss his findings and recommendations.

In August, Bruce Moerer of our staff and I traveled to eleven more communities to meet again with our members concerning the Schwinden report and recommendations. All together MSBA met with constituents in twenty-one communities to explain the report and take input.

In late August of this year members of the MSBA Delegate assembly supported the concept presented in this bill and later reaffirmed their support as recent as October during their annual business meeting in Bozeman.

We believe we have kept our word with our members and with you as legislators to bring a school district reorganization bill before you within the 12 months that we promised.

The Montana School Boards Association speaks as a proponent of House Bill 59. This is a serious attempt to allow Montanans an opportunity to determine the future of their elementary and county high school districts. The people will be required to decide whether their elementary school district should consolidate through annexation with another elementary school district and whether their county high school should unify with their elementary school district. This legislation retains local decision. It also shares the opportunity and responsibility with the people of Montana to streamline their own government through the ballot box.

This proposal is not state mandated consolidation. It mandates that the people of this state participate in the decision-making process. It mandates the electors of each elementary school district that does not have a high school building determine whether it is time to enlarge their district and annex with an adjoining elementary district. It mandates an

election.





If annexation vote <u>fails</u>, district remains same.

What Happens To Buildings and Equipment?

- 3. All school buildings, materials, equipment becomes a part of the annexing district.
- Annexing district operates all new buildings and equipment.

What Happens To The Board of Trustees?

- 4. Annexed board dissolves as well as the administration.

- 4. Consolidation occurs with or without bonded indebtedness depending on the wishes of the old board of trustees.

Consolidation of districts is more difficult, more expensive and has less opportunity for continuity of education.
