EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HJR 1

Motion/Vote: REP. CAROLYN SQUIRES MOVED THAT HJR 1 DO PASS. The motion carried unanimously.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HJR 4

Motion: REP. SQUIRES MOVED THAT HJR 4 DO PASS.

Discussion: REP. JOHN BOHLINGER offered an amendment. EXHIBIT 1

REP. LOREN SOFT asked to see a needs study in the state of Montana for beds.

- REP. BOHLINGER stated that they are trying to restate Montana's interest, and if and when the funding is available for a nursing home facility.
- REP. SQUIRES said that veterans have different requirements to meet for benefits. Most likely World War I and World War II veterans are getting the federal benefits and the more recent veterans get state benefits. "What you are doing is shutting benefits off to the veterans who have federal capabilities." Therefore, there is a long waiting list at the nursing home for people who are already qualified for federal benefits.
- **REP. SOFT** stated that the federal government should be consulted about making money available, whether or not the veteran is in a state, private or federal facility.
- REP. SQUIRES stated that veterans have their benefits provided by a plan during their service. "You cannot mix and match the money."
- REP. ELLEN BERGMAN said that there is room available for more nursing home beds in Miles City.
- REP. SQUIRES stated that it depends on whether they are hospital beds or nursing home beds. There is a waiting list in Miles City also; hospital beds cannot always accommodate nursing home patients.
- REP. SOFT asked if it would be possible to convert those hospital beds into nursing home beds.
- REP. BRUCE SIMON said this amendment is for location discussion. It is not dealing with the question of need.
- REP. CHRIS AHNER asked what process is needed to change hospital beds to nursing home beds. REP. SQUIRES stated the congressional delegation would have to go through the Veterans Administration in Washington D. C.

Motion: REP. BRUCE SIMON MOVED TO APPROVE THE AMENDMENTS. The motion carried 15-1.

Motion/Vote: REP. SIMON MOVED THAT HJR 4 DO PASS. The motion carried unanimously.
