HEARING ON UNIVERSITY SYSTEM EXECUTIVE BUDGET

CHAIRMAN ROYAL C. JOHNSON called the meeting to order and made opening remarks about the need for approximately 32 million in budget cuts from the legislature.

Commissioner of Higher Education Dick Croft offered his response to the potential cut of 5 million dollars from the University System budget.
