17    by the governor, with the consent of the senate.

18    Appointments made when the senate is not in session may be  
19    confirmed at the next senate session. The members are: six

20    (6) members having the degree of doctor of medicine, and one  
21    (1) member having the degree of doctor of osteopathy. The

22    members having the degree of doctor of medicine may not be  
23    from the same county. Each member shall be a citizen of the

24    United States. Each member shall have been licensed and  
25    shall have practiced medicine in this state for at least

1    five (5) years, and shall have been a resident of this state  
2    for at least five (5) years; however, the five (5) year  
3    requirement of practice and residency shall be waived for  
4    the initial term appointment of the member having the degree  
5    and license of doctor of osteopathy.

The members are: six (6) members having the degree of doctor of medicine, and one (1) member having the degree of doctor of osteopathy. The members having the degree of doctor of medicine may not be from the same county. Each member shall be a citizen of the United States. Each member shall have been licensed and shall have practiced medicine in this state for at least

five (5) years, and shall have been a resident of this state for at least five (5) years; however, the five (5) year requirement of practice and residency shall be waived for the initial term appointment of the member having the degree and license of doctor of osteopathy.

(3) Each member shall serve for a term of seven (7) years. A term commences on September 1 of each year of appointment. A member may, upon notice and hearing, be removed by the governor for neglect of duty, incompetence, or unprofessional or dishonorable conduct."
