Officers of city of second and third classes. 12 The officers of a city of the second and third classes 13 14 consist of one mayor, two aldermen from each ward, one 15 police judge, one city treasurer, who may be ex officio tax 16 collector, who must be elected by the qualified electors of the city as hereinafter provided. There may also be 17 appointed by the mayor, with the advice and consent of the 18 council, one city clerk, who is ex officio city assessor, 19 20 one chief of police, one city attorney, and any other 21 officer necessary to carry out the provisions of this title. The city council may prescribe the duties of all city 22 23 officers, and fix their compensation, subject to the limitations contained in this title. A third class city may 24

retain the county attorney to provide legal services for the

- city in cases not involving a conflict between the interests
