4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION
 5 75-6902, R.C.M. 1947, TO PROVIDE SECONDARY SCHOOLS A METHOD
 6 OF CALCULATING AVERAGE NUMBER BELONGING WHILE OFFERING
 7 PART-TIME ATTENDANCE TO ELEVENTH AND TWELFTH GRADE
 8 STUDENTS."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Section 75-6902, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to
 12 read as follows:

13 "75-6902. Definition and calculation of average number
 14 belonging (ANB). The term "average number belonging" or
 15 "ANB" shall mean the average number of regularly enrolled,
 16 full-time pupils attending the public schools of a district.
 17 Average number belonging shall be computed by determining
 18 the total of the aggregate days of attendance by regularly
 19 enrolled, full-time pupils during the current school fiscal
 20 year plus the aggregate days of absence by regularly
 21 enrolled, full-time pupils during the current school fiscal
 22 year, and by dividing such total by one hundred eighty
 23 (180). Attendance for a part of a morning session or a part
 24 of an afternoon session by a pupil shall be counted as
 25 attendance for one-half (1/2) day. Attendance for more than

1 one half (1/2) of a school day shall be counted as
 2 attendance for one (1) day. In calculating the ANB for
 3 pupils enrolled in a program established under section
 4 75-7507 prior to January 1, 1974, or pursuant to section
 5 75-7507 (1), attendance at, or absence from, a regular
 6 session of the program for at least two hours of either a
 7 morning or an afternoon session will be counted as one-half
 8 (1/2) of a day attended or absent as the case may be. If a
 9 variance has been granted as provided in section 75-7403,
 10 ANB will be computed in a manner prescribed by the
 11 superintendent of public instruction but in no case shall
 12 the ANB exceed one-half (1/2) for each kindergarten pupil.
 13 When any pupil has been absent, with or without excuse, for
 14 more than ten (10) consecutive school days, including pupil
 15 instruction related days, his absence after the tenth (10th)
 16 day of absence shall not be included in the aggregate days
 17 of absence and his enrollment in the school shall not be
 18 considered in the calculation of the average number
 19 belonging until he resumes attendance at school. The ANB
 20 calculation shall not be lowered where twelfth grade
 21 students complete their school requirements and graduate at
 22 mid-year.

23 If a student spends less than half his time in the
 24 regular program and the balance of his time in school in the
 25 special education program, he shall be considered a

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1 full-time special pupil but shall not be considered
 2 regularly enrolled for ANB purposes. If a student spends
 3 half or more of his time in school in the regular program
 4 and the balance of his time in the special education program
 5 he shall be considered regularly enrolled for ANB purposes.

6 The average number belonging of the regularly enrolled,
 7 full-time pupils for the public schools of a district shall
 8 be calculated, individually, for each school except that
 9 when:

10 (1) more than one school of a district, other than a
 11 junior high school in an elementary district which has been
 12 approved and accredited as a junior high school, is located
 13 within the incorporated limits of a city or town, the
 14 average number belonging of such schools shall be based on
 15 the aggregate of all the regularly enrolled, full-time
 16 pupils attending such schools located within the
 17 incorporated limits of a city or town;

18 (2) a junior high school which has been approved and
 19 accredited as a junior high school is located within the
 20 incorporated limits of a city or town in which a high school
 21 is located, all of the regularly enrolled, full-time pupils
 22 of the junior high school shall be considered as high school
 23 district pupils for the purposes of calculating the average
 24 number belonging of the high schools located within the
 25 incorporated limits of such city or town;

1 (3) a middle school has been approved and accredited,
 2 in which case pupils below the seventh grade shall be
 3 considered elementary school pupils for ANB purposes, and
 4 the seventh and eighth grade pupils shall be considered high
 5 school pupils for ANB purposes; or

6 (4) a school has not been accredited by the board of
 7 public education, the regularly enrolled, full-time pupils
 8 attending the nonaccredited school shall not be eligible for
 9 average number belonging calculation purposes, nor will an
 10 average number belonging for the nonaccredited school be
 11 used in determining the foundation program for such
 12 district.

13 Where eleventh and twelfth grade students attend school
 14 on a part-time and less than half-time basis, secondary
 15 schools may calculate the ANB to include an "equivalent ANB"
 16 for those students, if the students are not included in the
 17 ANB. The equivalent ANB shall be determined in a manner
 18 prescribed by the superintendent of public instruction of
 19 this state."

FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request received January 17, 19 75, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 71 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 71 provides secondary schools a method of calculating average number belonging (ANB) where:

(1) twelfth grade students graduate at mid year and (2) eleventh and twelfth grade students attend school on a part-time basis.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- (1) Students eligible for mid-term graduation are presently enrolled until the end of the year in order to earn ANB.
- (2) No estimates of the number of eleventh and twelfth grade students who would select part-time enrollment can be made.

CONCLUSIONS:

Since computation of ANB for mid-term graduates will not be altered by the proposed legislation, state expenditures will be unaffected by enactment of this portion of the bill. The proposed computation for part-time students will affect ANB and therefore, state expenditures, but such changes cannot be predicted. Since the computation "shall be determined in a manner prescribed by the superintendent of public instruction of the state" it is also impossible to predict the impact upon state expenditure until more precise guidelines are outlined.

INTRODUCED BY BRADLEY, LYNCH, LUND

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 75-6902, R.C.M. 1947, TO PROVIDE SECONDARY SCHOOLS A METHOD OF CALCULATING AVERAGE NUMBER BELONGING WHILE OFFERING PART-TIME ATTENDANCE TO ELEVENTH AND TWELFTH GRADE STUDENTS."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 75-6902, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

"75-6902. Definition and calculation of average number belonging (ANB). The term "average number belonging" or "ANB" shall mean the average number of regularly enrolled, full-time pupils attending the public schools of a district. Average number belonging shall be computed by determining the total of the aggregate days of attendance by regularly enrolled, full-time pupils during the current school fiscal year plus the aggregate days of absence by regularly enrolled, full-time pupils during the current school fiscal year, and by dividing such total by one hundred eighty (180). Attendance for a part of a morning session or a part of an afternoon session by a pupil shall be counted as attendance for one-half (1/2) day. Attendance-for-more-than

one-half--(1/2)--of--a--school--day--shall--be--counted--as

attendance-for-one-(1)--day. In calculating the ANB for

pupils enrolled in a program established under section

75-7507 prior to January 1, 1974, or pursuant to section

75-7507 (1), attendance at, or absence from, a regular

session of the program for at least two hours of either a

morning or an afternoon session will be counted as one-half

(1/2) of a day attended or absent as the case may be. If a

variance has been granted as provided in section 75-7403,

ANB will be computed in a manner prescribed by the

superintendent of public instruction but in no case shall

the ANB exceed one-half (1/2) for each kindergarten pupil.

When any pupil has been absent, with or without excuse, for

more than ten (10) consecutive school days, including pupil

instruction related days, his absence after the tenth (10th)

day of absence shall not be included in the aggregate days

of absence and his enrollment in the school shall not be

considered in the calculation of the average number

belonging until he resumes attendance at school. The--ANB

calculation--shall--not--be--lowered--where--twelfth--grade

students--complete--their--school--requirements--and--graduate--at

mid-year.

If a student spends less than half his time in the

regular program and the balance of his time in school in the

 15 the aggregate of all the regularly enrolled, full-time
 16 pupils attending such schools located within the
 17 incorporated limits of a city or town;

18 (2) a junior high school which has been approved and
 19 accredited as a junior high school is located within the
 20 incorporated limits of a city or town in which a high school
 21 is located, all of the regularly enrolled, full-time pupils
 22 of the junior high school shall be considered as high school
 23 district pupils for the purposes of calculating the average
 24 number belonging of the high schools located within the
 25 incorporated limits of such city or town;

1 (3) a middle school has been approved and accredited,
 2 in which case pupils below the seventh grade shall be
 3 considered elementary school pupils for ANB purposes, and
 4 the seventh and eighth grade pupils shall be considered high
 5 school pupils for ANB purposes; or
