 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Section 66-1027, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to  
 12 read as follows:

13 "66-1027. Qualifications for licensure--limitations.

14 (1) No person may be granted a physician's certificate to  
 15 practice medicine in this state unless he:

- 16 (a) Is a citizen of the United States;
- 17 (b) Is of good moral character, as determined by the  
 18 board;
- 19 (c) Is a graduate of an approved medical school as  
 20 defined in section 66-1028;
- 21 (d) Has completed an approved internship of at least  
 22 one (1) year or, in the opinion of the board, has had  
 23 experience or training which is at least the equivalent of  
 24 one (1) year internship; and
- 25 (e) Has made a personal appearance before the board

1 unless such appearance has been specifically waived by the  
 2 board. The board may authorize the department to issue the  
 3 license subject to terms of probation or other conditions or  
 4 limitations set by the board, or may refuse a license if the  
 5 applicant has committed unprofessional conduct or is  
 6 otherwise unqualified.

7 (2) No person may be granted a temporary license to  
 8 practice medicine in this state unless he:

9 (a) Is a citizen of the United States, or has filed a  
 10 properly executed declaration of intention to become a  
 11 citizen of the United States;

12 (b) Is of good moral character, as determined by the  
 13 board;

2 board, or may refuse a temporary license to a person if he  
3 has committed unprofessional conduct. The issuance of a  
4 temporary certificate imposes no future obligation or duty  
5 on the part of the board to grant full licensure or to renew  
6 or extend the temporary license. The board may, in the case  
7 of an applicant for a temporary certificate, require a  
8 written, oral, or practical examination of the applicant."

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 66-1027, R.C.M. 1947, TO ALLOW THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS TO WAIVE PERSONAL APPEARANCES BEFORE THE BOARD PRIOR TO ISSUING A LICENSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE AND SURGERY."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 66-1027, R.C.M. 1947, is amended to read as follows:

"66-1027. Qualifications for licensure--limitations.

(1) No person may be granted a physician's certificate to practice medicine in this state unless he:

- (a) Is a citizen of the United States;
- (b) Is of good moral character, as determined by the board;
- (c) Is a graduate of an approved medical school as defined in section 66-1028;
- (d) Has completed an approved internship of at least one (1) year or, in the opinion of the board, has had experience or training which is at least the equivalent of one (1) year internship; and
- (e) Has made a personal appearance before the board

unless such appearance has been specifically waived by the board. The board may authorize the department to issue the license subject to terms of probation or other conditions or limitations set by the board, or may refuse a license if the applicant has committed unprofessional conduct or is otherwise unqualified.

(2) No person may be granted a temporary license to practice medicine in this state unless he:

- (a) Is a citizen of the United States, or has filed a properly executed declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States;
- (b) Is of good moral character, as determined by the board;
- (c) Is a graduate of an approved medical school as defined in section 66-1028;
- (d) Has completed an approved internship of at least one (1) year or, in the opinion of the board, has had experience or training which is at least the equivalent of one (1) year internship; and
- (e) Has made a personal appearance before at least one (1) member of the board.

(3) A temporary license may be issued to a physician employed by a public institution who is practicing under the direction of a licensed physician. The board may authorize the department to issue a temporary license subject to terms
