As used in this act: (1) "Commission" means the Montana code commission Kasmus created in section 2 of this act. "Codes" means the Revised Codes of Montana, (2) 194 15 the pocket supplements thereto, and the replacement volumes. 16 (3) "Recodify" means to compile, arrange, rearrange, 17 and prepare for publication. It includes without changing the meaning, effect, or intent of any law: (a) adopting a uniform system of punctuation, -س 20 luson capitalization, and numbering; appropriate substituting the code section {b} reference for reference to a section of an "act"; substituting calendar date for "effective date"; 23 (c) 21 creating new titles, chapters, sections, or other (d) divisions of the code. 25

Section 2. Montana code commission. There is created
 within the legislative branch a Montana code commission
 consisting of seven (7) members as follows:

4 (1) a member of the Montana house of representatives 5 who is not licensed to practice law appointed by the speaker 6 of the house;

7 (2) a member of the Montana senate who is not licensed
8 to practice law appointed by the president of the senate:

9 (3) an attorney or judge licensed to practice law in10 Montana appointed by the supreme court;

11 (4) three (3) graduates of accredited law schools or 12 attorneys licensed to practice law in Montana, one each to 13 be appointed by:

14 (a) the governor, which appointee shall be temporary15 chairman of the commission;

16 (b) the Montana attorney general;

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(c) the president of the Montana state bar;

18 (5) a member of the faculty of the school of law at 19 the university of Montana appointed by the dean of the law 20 school.

21 Section 3. Commission members' terms. Each appointive 22 member shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing power 23 until a successor is appointed.

Section 4. Commission compensation. Each member is
 entitled to the same per diem and mileage for attendance at

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1 meetings of the commission as that allowed public employees 2 by law.

3 Section 5. Commission meetings. The commission shall 4 meet upon call of the code commissioner or of the commission chairman, or upon request of any three (3) members of the 5 6 commission.

7 Section 6. Appointment of code commissioner. The 8 commission shall meet within sixty (60) days following the 9 effective date of this act and elect a permanent chairman. 10 appoint a code commissioner to direct recodification of all 11 the laws of a general and permanent nature enacted by the 12 Montana legislature, and set his salary not to exceed the 13 salary of a district court judge.

14 Section 7. Code commissioner qualifications. To be 15 eligible to be code commissioner a person must be licensed 16 to practice law in Montana for at least five (5) years and 17 demonstrate a knowledge of code arranging and recodification 18 procedures.

19 Section 8. Allocation of code commissioner office. 20 (1) The legislative council shall furnish office space and 21 equipment for the use of the code commissioner and his 22 staff.

23 (2) The code commissioner is entitled, and is expected 24 to use the automated data processing information and 25 equipment and other services of the legislative council.

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1 (3) The code commissioner shall submit his budgetary 2 requests as approved by the commission, to the legislative 3 council for inclusion in the legislative council budget.

4 (4) Subject to the approval of the commission, the code commissioner may employ or engage, and fix the salaries 5 6 of, such personnel as may be necessary to accomplish the 7 purpose of this act.

8 Section 9. Name of recodification. The recodification 9 shall be known as the "Montana Code Annotated".

10 Section 10. Code commissioner duties. Subject to the 11 general supervision and policy of the commission the code 12 commissioner shall:

13 (1) prior to January 1, 1978, recodify all the laws of 14 a general and permanent nature appearing in the codes and session laws and prepare the same for publication; 15

16 (2) prior to January 1, 1978, prepare and submit to 17 the legislature a report which is certified by the 18 commission as the "Official Report of the Montana Code Commission" together with a bill enacting the Montana Code 19 Annotated. A copy of the report and bill shall be deposited 20 21 with the secretary of state. The report shall indicate in 22 tabular or other form, all changes made during 23 recodification, other than punctuation and capitalization, to clearly indicate the character of each change; 24 25

(3) prior to November 1, 1976, and prior to November 1

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of each year thereafter, prepare and submit to the
 legislative council a report, in tabular or other form,
 indicating the commissioner's recommendations for
 legislation which will:

5 (a) eliminate archaic or outdated laws;

6 (b) eliminate obsolete or redundant wording of laws;

7 (c) eliminate any duplications in law and any laws
8 repealed directly or by implication;

9 (d) clarify existing laws;

10 (e) correct errors and inconsistencies within the
11 laws;

12 (f) correct inaccurate references to titles of 13 officers or agencies or to other statutes as may be 14 necessary to obtain consistency with current law;

15 (4) after each legislative session convening after
16 1975, annotate, arrange, assign catchlines and code section
17 numbers to and prepare for publication all laws of a general
18 and permanent nature enacted at that session;

(5) cause to be prepared for inclusion, at the end ofeach section of the statutes, the following material:

23 relating to the subject matter of the section; and

24 (c) such editorial notes, cross references, and other

(e) Organic Act of the Territory of Montana;

12 (g) The 1889 and 1972 constitutions of the state of

13 Montana and any amendments thereto;

14 (h) Ordinances relating to federal relations and 15 elections;

16 (i) Rules of civil, criminal, appellate procedure and 17 such other rules of procedure as the Montana supreme court 18 may adopt; and

(j) A complete subject index, popular name index,
comparative disposition tables or cross reference indices
relating sections of the Montana Code Annotated to prior
compilations and session laws.

23 (7) After publication of the Montana Code Annotated:

(a) continue to codify, index, arrange, rearrange
 divisions and generally update the Montana Code Annotated to

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1 maintain an orderly and logical arrangement of the laws in 2 order to avoid future need for bulk revision;

3 (b) prepare and submit to each legislature a report 4 which is certified as the "official report of the Montana 5 Code Commission -- (year)" which indicates in tabular or 6 other forms all changes made during the continuous 7 recodification, other than punctuation and capitalization, 8 to clearly indicate the character of each change made since 9 the first publication of the Montana Code Annotated.

Section 11. Effect of Montana Code Annotated. (1)
The Montana Code Annotated shall be enacted as a repeal and
a reenactment of the Revised Codes of Montana, 1947, and the
supplements thereto.

14 (2) The enactment of the Montana Code Annotated shall:
15 (a) repeal all statutes and parts of statutes of a
16 general and permanent nature not contained in the Montana
17 Code Annotated;

18 (b) not revive a law repealed or superseded before the19 effective date of Montana Code Annotated;

20 (c) not affect an act done, right accrued, or
21 obligation incurred or imposed by law prior to the effective
22 date of Montana Code Annotated;

23 (d) not affect any action, suit, or proceeding pending24 on such effective date.

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25 (3) The Montana Code Annotated shall be given effect

as a continuation of the Revised Codes of Montana and not as
 a new enactment. A defect in title of any act set out in
 prior laws and reenacted by the Montana Code Annotated is
 cured by such enactment.

5 (4) No implication or presumption of legislative 6 construction is to be drawn from the classification and 7 arrangement of the Montana Code Annotated.

8 (5) Annotations, code commissioner notes, and other 9 editorial material to the Montana Code Annotated may not be 10 construed to form a part of the legislative text but to be 11 only for the purpose of convenience, orderly arrangement, 12 and information.

13 Section 12. Publications. (1) The code commission 14 with the advice of the code commissioner, the legislative 15 council, and the supreme court shall decide on the quantity, 16 quality, style, format, and grade of all publications prior 17 to having the department of administration contract for 18 their publication.

19 (2) The methods of sale to the public of the Montana 20 Code Annotated, and supplements or other subsequent and 21 ancillary publications thereto, may be included as an 22 alternative specification and bid, and as a part of a 23 contract to be let by bids by the department of 24 administration.

(3) The sales price to the public shall be fixed by

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the commission but shall not exceed the cost price plus twenty percent (20%). All revenues generated from the sale to the public of the Montana Code Annotated shall be remitted to the state treasurer for the purpose of reimbursing the general fund for appropriations made for the use of the office and facilities of the legislative council under this act.

8 (4) Sets of the Montana Code Annotated purchased by 9 the state and its political subdivisions shall be for the 10 cost price of the sets.

11 Section 13. The Montana Code Annotated, supplements, 12 or other publications ancillary thereto, as published, shall 13 be the sole property of the state of Montana and shall be 14 copyrighted for and in behalf of the state of Montana by the 15 secretary of state.

16 Section 14. (1) Upon completion of the printing and 17 binding of the Montana Code Annotated the code commissioner 18 shall deposit a complete set, along with a certification 19 that the set comprises the Montana Code Annotated as 20 authorized by this act, and enacted by the legislature.

21 (2) Within ten (10) days after that deposit, the 22 secretary of state shall publish a notice thereof once in a 23 newspaper of general circulation in each judicial district 24 within the state specifying in the notice the date on which 25 the Montana Code Annotated becomes effective. 1 (3) The secretary of state or the code commissioner 2 may further publicize the effective date of the Montana Code 3 Annotated to the extent considered necessary or desirable by 4 the commission.

5 Section 15. Format as approved by commission. (1)
6 The publication of updates to the Montana Code Annotated may
7 be as a cumulative supplement, replacement volume, or in any
8 other format approved by the commission.

9 (2) The supplements or replacements shall be certified 10 and reported to the legislature by the commission, approved, 11 and enacted by the legislature as the official laws of 12 Montana, published, copyrighted, and deposited with the 13 secretary of state and shall be referred to as the Montana 14 Code Annotated. The supplements and replacements shall become effective on the date deposited with and certified to 95 16 the secretary of state.

17 (3) The commission may issue such supplementary and 18 ancillary publications as it considers necessary or 19 desirable in aid of the general use and purposes of the 20 Montana Code Annotated and the supplements or replacements 21 thereto.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 183 creates a Montana Code Commission to supervise the recodification of the Revised Codes of Montana 1947, provides for continuing recodification, and outlines provisions for sale of the Montana Code Annotated to the public.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Recodification will require additional part-time employment of computer terminal operations, proofreaders and clerks.

2. Five staff attorneys budgeted in the Legislative Council will provide the required legal assistance. If they are unable to absorb the additional workload, additional legal services may cost as much as \$90,000 per fiscal year.

3. Since the recodification deadline is January 1, 1978, no sales to the public of the Montana Code Annotated are anticipated during the biennium.

Figures assume legal services can be provided by existing Legislative Council staff.

CONCLUSIONS:

Enactment of House Bill 183 would result in an estimated minimum expenditure of \$321,140 during the biennium. There will be no change in revenues until publication of the Montana Code Annotated. Estimated annual revenue from sales would be \$20,000 in 78-79 biennium.

TECHNICAL NOTE - Page 9, line 17, 18, states "The Montana Code Annotated shall deposit a complete set . . ." but fails to state the recipient of the deposit.
